

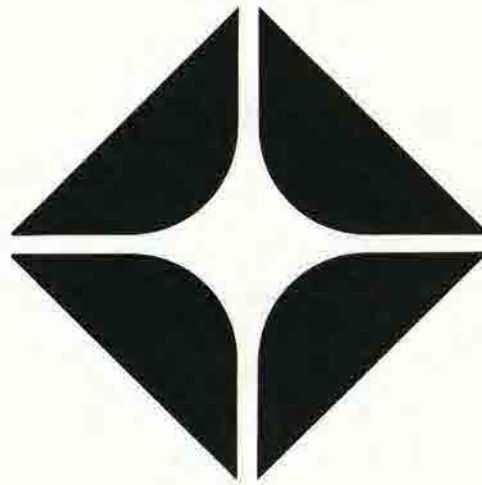

The Story

The saga of Gypsy begins in Seattle in the early 1920's. Baby June and Baby Louise are rehearsing for a kiddie show in a vaudeville theatre, carefully supervised by their domineering mother, Rose. Her children's success in show business is Rose's whole life.

Moving from Seattle, Rose collects some boys for an act, and under her driving direction, June and Louise go into vaudeville as "Baby June and her Newsboys." In one of the theatres on the tour, Rose meets Herbie, a likeable candy salesman, and charms him into becoming the manager of the act.

As the years pass, June and Louise grow older, and, although Rose keeps their ages secret, they are still playing "Baby June and Her Newsboys." Despite their success, Herbie, who has fallen in love with Rose and wants her to retire and marry him, threatens to leave. Once more, she charms him out of his intentions and works out a new act which, in truth, is the old act — recostumed. It is called "Dainty June and Her Farmboys." At age 13, June falls in love and elopes with one of the Farmboys. Rose is briefly crushed, but summons her indomitable strength and determines to make a star out of the reluctant Louise.

Vaudeville is dying, and so is the act. Unwittingly Herbie books the act into a second-rate burlesque house, where Rose is shocked by the strip-tease performers. However, when the headlining star is detained, Rose, still determined to make Louise a star, shoves her into the act. Herbie's final disgust forces him to depart forever, leaving Rose puzzled and saddened.

Louise goes on to achieve enormous success and months later becomes Miss Gypsy Rose Lee. Mama Rose is still impossibly loud and interfering and she and Gypsy quarrel violently. In the empty theatre, Rose tries to think out her problems, when Gypsy quietly joins her, and, at last, there is mutual understanding.

Jami has appeared in local television Christmas specials, performed for civic clubs and as a soloist at the First United Methodist Church. Jami has had four years of dance instruction and seven years of vocal coaching. She enjoys playing softball, basketball and volleyball. Jami also swims for the Independence Swim Club and is the 1990 SEK gold-medalist in the breaststroke. She is a seventh grade student at Independence Middle School.
