

Resource Spotlight



Kansas Talking Books provides personalized library support and materials in a specialized format to eligible Kansas residents to ensure that all may read. This no-cost library service features:

- Audio books, audio magazines, braille books, and braille magazines mailed directly to your house and returned postage free.
- Special equipment lent to you at no charge.
- A collection that includes adult fiction, bestsellers, science fiction, westerns, biographies, children's books, young adult books and more.

Who is eligible?

Any Kansas resident with a visual impairment, physical impairment or reading disability is eligible for Kansas Talking Books. Schools and medical facilities who serve qualifying individuals may also be eligible. (See IPL staff for more information)
