
Greetings from the Generalissimo

MEET THE CAST

DANA AITKEN (Maria) From a Salvation Army lass in "Guys and Dolls" to the light-hearted governess in "Sound of Music" isn't much of a leap for Dana with her captivating manner and melodious voice. As a result, she turns seven children from automatons to gay, singing youngsters.

DUMONT REED (Captain von Trapp) After two previous Neewollah appearances, DuMont has been promoted to Captain and what's more, father of seven regimented children. DuMont's professionally trained voice will absolutely delight all playgoers.

VAL SMITH (Elsa Schraeder) Only our Val could make the transition from Miss Adelaide in "Guys and Dolls" to the wealthy, aristocratic Elsa. Aren't we glad she came back to Independence.

JAMES MULLEN (Max Detweiler) Jim's loyal Neewollah fans may have difficulty recognizing him as the serious Max. His portrayal may appear to be serious, but you will probably get just as many laughs as you have in the past.

MARTHA PAYNE (Mother Abbess) This year, playgoers will have the opportunity to hear Martha's voice again instead of merely seeing her beaming countenance flitting through the background as the housekeeper or maid.

LENA RILEY (Sister Bertha) Lena has done a switch this year. Remember her as Dolly Tate in "Annie Get Your Gun"?

PEGGY CODER (Sister Margaretta) Peggy has changed from one of the elegant Ascot ladies to the sympathetic nun with a delightful sense of humor.

MARY LOU PALMER (Sister Sophia) From pounding a drum in "Guys and Dolls" to waltzing at the Embassy Ball in "My Fair Lady" to keeping the keys at the Abby presented the challenge that Mary Lou overcame.

TERRI PLUMMER (Liesl) Wouldn't it be nice if we could all play the part of "sixteen going on seventeen" and look it too!

JEFF DANCER (Friedrich) There aren't many boys who would put aside their golf clubs, French horn, guitar, and football to make every rehearsal.

MARY MEYER (Louisa) This year we have a chance to see Mary herself instead of seeing only the results of her work as a member of the properties committee as in past years.

MIKE KEELEY (Kurt) Mike didn't have to develop a lisp as he did as Winthrop Paroo in "The Music Man," but he's back in short pants.

AMY GASCOIGNE (Marta) We're so lucky that this member of a third generation Neewollah family has stopped here long enough to portray one of the von Trapp children before leaving with her family to rejoin her father who has been overseas.



BELINDA BOYS (Brigitta) A fresh, winsome face, new on the Neewollah stage, Belinda proves delightful and preceptive as our Brigitta.

JULIE EDDS (Gretl) Julie has a much bigger role than her Mama and Pappa in this one and is our scene stealer of the show.

WARREN WOOD (Rolf) Here's an even more avid golfer who has put away his "sticks" for the Neewollah season. It's more fun to play in the snow anyway.

PHIL WATTS (Franz) Would you expect to find your banker working as a butler? You're in for a very pleasant surprise.

LORETTA WATTS (Frau Schmidt) Loretta has played every other kind of role. Now she's housekeeper for seven children, ably assisted however, by her own man-about-the-house, Phil.

NEIL AND NORMA EDDS (Herr and Frau Zeller) It's a pleasure to have our Junior College dean and his attractive wife on our stage, even though they portray the villainous Nazi couple.

GEORGE AND DOROTHY BUTLER (Baron and Baroness Elberfeld) Obviously having enjoyed playing in "The Pleasure of His Company" together, George and Dorothy again play opposite each other as the Baron and Baroness.

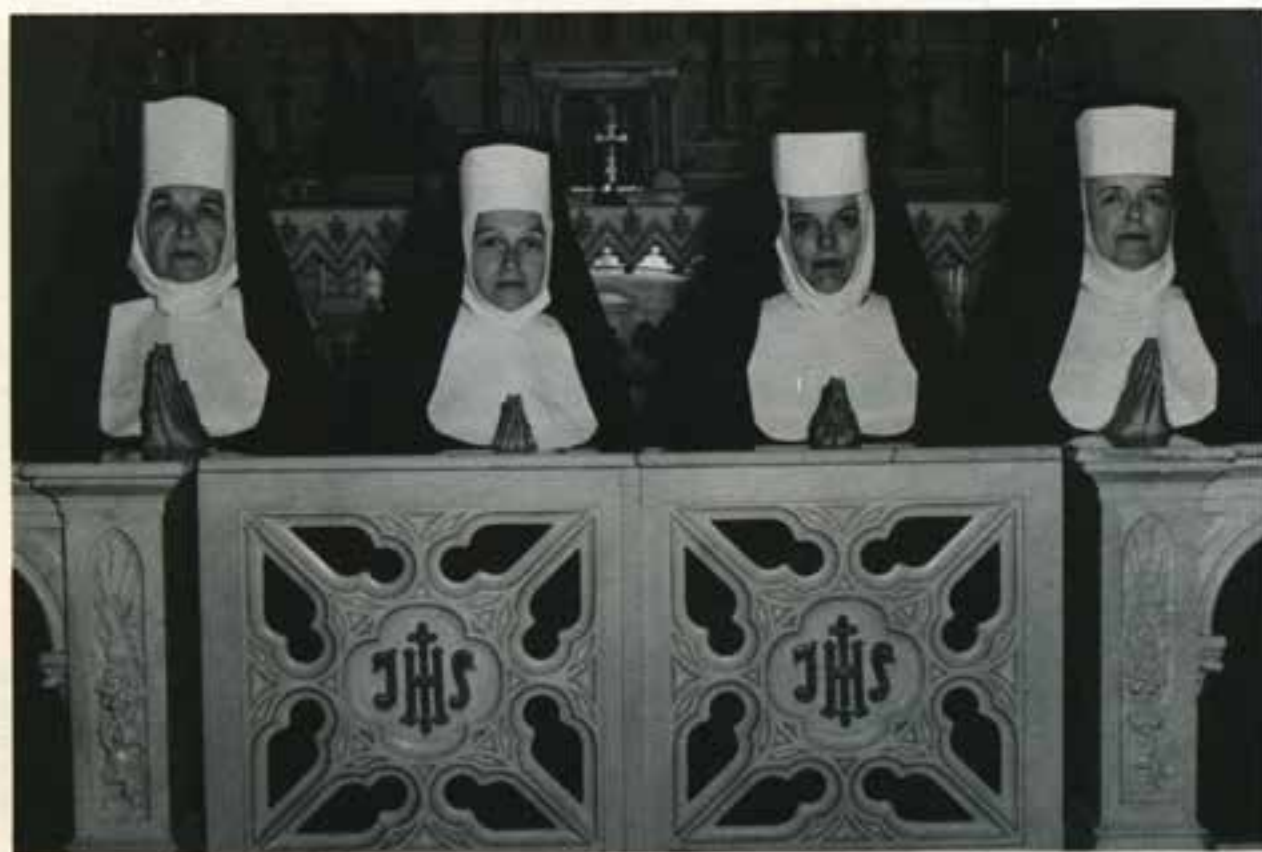

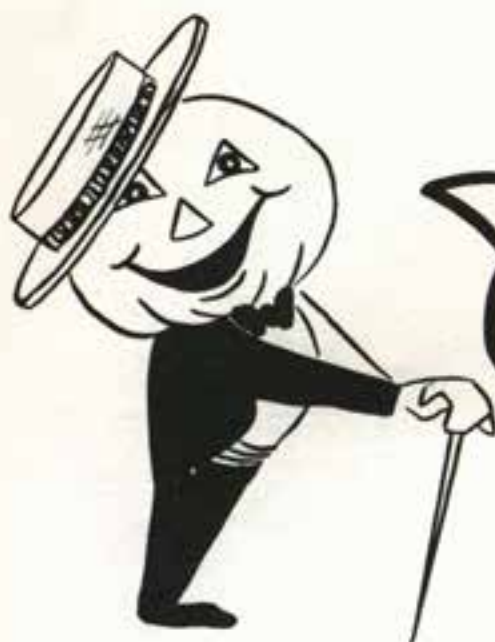

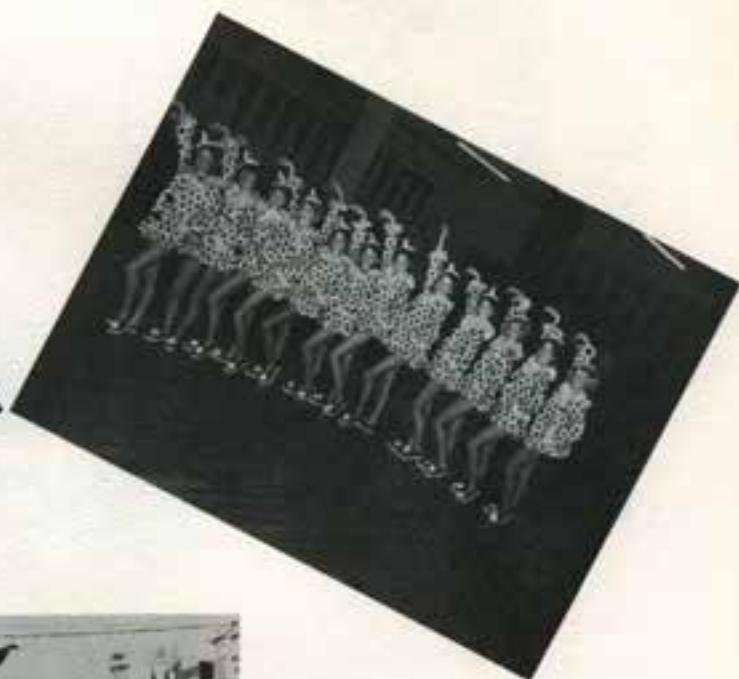
