



Molly's Story

Molly Tobin promises herself that someday she will be rich and famous. She leaves her family and home in Hannibal, Missouri, and walks to the mining town of Leadville, Colorado, where, as a singer and pianist, she meets Leadville Johnny Brown. Although Johnny teases Molly, they soon become good friends and Johnny proposes. Johnny tells Molly that he will give her anything she wants and when she sees the brass bed she has always wished for, she begins to weaken in her desire to marry a millionaire.

Molly and Johnny marry and a week after marriage, he sells a claim and gives her \$300,000.00. Even though the money is accidentally burned, Johnny knows he can find another claim. He soon becomes a rich miner and builds Molly her mansion in Denver.


Denver society is led by Mrs. McGlone whose party is crashed by Molly and Johnny. Undaunted, Molly introduces herself to all the guests but the "beautiful people of Denver" are aloof. A month later when these same dinner guests do not come to Molly's party, Molly feels shunned so she and Johnny go to Europe to learn "refinement."

Molly is the toast of Europe. She is the favorite of royalty who return home with her to Denver. Again she throws a party and all of Denver attends, impressed by Molly's royal guests. However, some of Leadville's miners also attend, resulting in a brawl. Molly, frustrated by her failure in society, returns to Europe but Johnny, having had enough, returns to Leadville. Molly is again a favorite of European royalty. When tempted to stay in Europe, she realizes she can't live without Johnny. She sets sail on the Titanic and is among its few survivors. Her return to Leadville finds Johnny waiting for her.



Burks is President of the A.G. Sherwood Construction Company and active in community organizations. He is the Past President of Rotary, Chamber of Commerce, and Independ-




LOIS LESSMAN JACKSON Mrs. McGlone

Originally from Temple, Texas, Travis has been an ARCO employee for thirteen years, eleven of them in Independence.



"Carousel" and "Lil' Abner."


John is also active in community affairs. He is a member of Rotary, the Oratorio Society and First Christian Church


GARELD G. PAYNE Roberts
