

Brigadoon Synopsis

Brigadoon was first produced at the Ziegfeld Theatre on March 13, 1947. Described by its authors as "a whimsical musical fantasy," Brigadoon is set in a magic Scottish village which comes out of the Highland mists once every hundred years, only to disappear after one day. Brigadoon is a typical "boy meets girl" story with the twist of time. Tommy, the American, feels drawn to Fiona from the first time he meets her. Fiona, though past the age that most lasses marry, has always known that if she waited long enough, the right man would come her way. The fact that hundreds of years separate their upbringing does not change the feelings they have for one another. Mr. Lundie, the schoolmaster, tells Tommy that an outsider can stay if he loves one of Brigadoon. It is only when Tommy experiences a huge dose of reality that his friend, Jeff, is able to convince him he must leave the dreamworld of Brigadoon and return to the real world. The Americans leave as Brigadoon and Fiona disappear into the mist. Tommy returns to the site of Brigadoon months later, just to be close to her. As Tommy cries out for his lost love, he hears voices in the distance, and sees Mr. Lundie approaching. He takes Tommy by the hand and leads him back to Brigadoon.

Brigadoon was the first major Broadway success by Lerner and Loewe. The Drama Critics Circle singled it out as the best play of the season, the first time a musical had been given such an honor. Brigadoon is one of the most delightful fantasies that the American musical stage has known. The rich and soulful melodies, combined with the beautiful ballet sequences and the emotional and haunting sound of bagpipes is balanced by its witty dialogue, engaging lyrics and enchanting characters. With well over 100 cast, orchestra and crew members it may seem as though it would take a miracle to complete it. We are all very appreciative of the time people sacrificed with their family and loved ones to bring together this production. It has become a true labor of love, and as Mr. Lundie says, "when ye love somethin' deeply enough, anythin' is possible — even miracles."




Larry Annable as Tommy Albright





Judging Queen Neelah LXI

Queen Neelah candidates are evaluated by a panel of judges over a period of three days.
