Neewollah History

The Neewollah festival began in 1919 in an effort to provide positive activities for kids of all ages in place of typical Halloween pranks. Initially the event centered around parades, morning, afternoon and night on October 31. The parades were made up primarily of decorated cars and carriages. Oueens and princesses from area festivals rode in the parades, along with our own Oueen Neelah who was selected based on votes bought at a penny each. The Great Depression and World War II interrupted the Neewoollah celebration from 1931 to 1947. Local businessmen Jim Halsey, Jerry Webb and Don Dancer revived and elaborated on the Neewollah theme bringing it back as a three day festival in 1948. In the ensuing years, a queen's pagaent, several presentations of a Broadway play, a carnival and street acts were added to the Kiddie Parade and Grand Parade. Today Neewollah is the oldest and largest annual festival in Kansas. Independence blossoms from 9,000-10,000 inhabitants to up to 80,000 in the final days of the now 10 day festival.

Little Shop of Horrors Synopsis


Little Shop of Horrors is based upon a Grade B horror movie released in 1963 produced and directed by legendary B movie director Roger Corman for American International pictures. The original 1960s movie told the story of a plant from outer space that eventually took over the world. Of note to movie trivia buffs is the fact that the patient in the dentist's chair was played by a very young actor named Jack Nicholson. In 1982 the movie was adapted for the Broadway stage by the team of Howard Ashman and Alan Menken. Ashman and Menken would later be known for their collaborative efforts on Disney's Beauty and the Beast, Aladdin, and The Little Mermaid.


The Broadway musical adaptation changed the original movie in several respects. The origin of the plant is unknown and the plant is given a real personality. The story relates the trials and tribulations of Seymour Krelbourn, a mild and meek florist who makes a Faustian pact with a tiny plant in order to win the girl he loves. The mysterious plant needs blood to survive; and by the end of the show, practically all the characters have been comically devoured. "Little Shop" opened at the Orpheum Theatre on July 27, 1982, with Lee Wilk playing Seymour and Ellen Greene as Audrey. The offbeat musical won over critics and enjoyed a run of 2,209 performances.

Most Independence audiences will best relate the musical to the 1987 adaptation of the musical with Rick Moranis, Ellen Greene, John Candy and Steve Martin. The 1987 movie is different from the musical in a couple of ways. In the musical, there is no Bill Murray character sitting in the dentist's chair. The ending of the movie is drastically different than the ending of the play.

"Little Shop" is funny, crazy and marks a departure from the traditional Neewollah offerings. It is still tastefully done and continues the traditions that have made the Neewollah hometown musical a fixture of affection among Neewollah audiences.

Mark Frank is in his 9th year as theater/technical director for Coffeyville Community College and has one of the largest community college theater programs in the state. He has directed and acted in over 60 professional and community productions. Among his favorites are Grease, Into the Woods, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Little Shop of Horrors, Agamemnon, Marvin's Room, Sylvia, Pippin and Charley's Aunt. During the summer, Frank is the artistic director of Kid's Academy and Children's Summer Theater, He shares the artistic direction of the Rubber Chicken Factory Improvisational Comedy Troupe with his wife Bethanie. He was named CCC Professor of the Year in 2000 and was also honored as the Coffeyville Chamber of Commerce Post-Secondary Educator in 2000. In 2001, he won the National Academic Advising Association Outsanding Advisor Award. He is a published playwright having published A Collection of Plays by Mark Frank. Mark has a master in fine arts degree from Western Illinois University. He lives in Coffeyville with his wife Bethanie.

Producer Steve Wilkin

Steve Wilkin has Neewollah roots that run deep. He worked behind the stage at many of the early musical offerings in the 1960s and was a stage escort for the 1965 Neewollah Queen's Pageant, the first year that escorts were included in the program. Since returning to Independence in 1975, he has served on a variety of Neewollah committees. He has been publicity chairman several times, including this past year. He produced Mame in 1986 and The King and I in 1996. He co-produced Oliver! in 1990. In addition he has been Special Events Chairman, Carnival Chairman and a Neewollah Board Member from 1987 to 1998. He served two terms as the Chairman of the Neewollah Board in 1997 and 1998 and was Generalissimo of the celebration in 1993. Wilkin appeared on the Neewollah stage in Annie, My Fair Lady, Mame, Gypsy, and Guys and Dolls. He is Past President of the Kansas Land Title Association, a member of the Kansas Bar Association and Washburn Law School Alumni Association. He is a sustaining member and past president of the Independence Rotary Club. He is a member of the First United Methodist Church. Wilkin is married to JoAnne and they are the parents of three children and have one grandchild.

Vanessa Dennis is currently serving on the Neewollah Board of Directors and has served as Chairman of the Board and Secretary, she was Generalissimo for the year 2000. DA, PEO and a member of Mercy Hospital Foundation Board. She and her husband Bo are parents of two children.





Neewollah / Jump Start Medallion Hunt

The 2003 Medallion Hunt "jump starts" the Neewollah celebration on Wednesday, October 15. A medallion is hidden somewhere within the city limits of Independence on public property and clues are issued each day regarding the location of the medallion. Ty Herndon, a country singer of the mid-'90s who fuses neo-traditionalist county with a slick, rock-oriented sense of style and production, will be performing Saturday, October 25 at 8:00 p.m. on the Memorial Hall Stage. Like many of his contemporaries, his blend of genres proved commercially successful as his first album became one of the biggest hits of 1995. Herndon was a little wilder, at least off the stage, than many of his peers, but his records had a down-to-earth sense of sentimentality that initially gave him a broad fan base.



Born and raised in Butler, Alabama, Ty Herndon become involved in music as he was growing up. He sang gospel music and learned how to play piano. After he graduated from high school, he moved to Nashville. Initially, he had a difficult time gaining a foothold in the music industry, spending 10 years without making any real headway. Ty left the Music City and headed to Texas where he began slogging it out in local honky tonks, developing a dedicated following of fans. In 1993 he won the Texas Entertainer of the Year. Later that year, he signed to Epic Records.

Ty Herndon's first single "What Mattered Most" hit number one in the spring of 1995. An album of the same name was released that April and it became a Top 10 country hit. The second single, "I Want My Goodbye Back," became a number seven hit. The third single, "Heart Half Empty" was a hit and Herndon's second album, Living In A Moment, debuted at number six upon its summer 1996 release. In 1999 Herndon resurfaced with Steam and in 2002 the album This Is Ty Herndon was released.





Jerry Webb has been a driving force behind Neewollah since its revival in 1948. He put all his energies into making it a festival we can all be proud of. His interest has always been on what is best for Independence as he has worked in virtually every facet of the celebration.

Gerald Webb was born in Independence, Kansas, in 1930. He graduated from

Independence High School and Independence Community College. He attended Kansas University, leaving to serve three years in the Air Force during the Korean War. He then graduated from St. Louis College of Mortuary Services.

In 1958, at Jim Halsey's suggestion, Webb helped revive the Neewollah celebration. He served as Generalissimo in 1960, 1972 and 1980. HBO filmed a special during the 1980 celebration. He served on the Neewollah Board for over thirty years.

He's been active in Kiwanis, the Mercy Hospital Lay Board, Chamber of Commerce, served ten years as president of the Verdigris Valley Association for Retarded Children, now CLASS, LTD., and served as Memorial Hall chairman.

He is a member of the Kansas Funeral Directors Association, serving as president in 1969, and of the National Funeral Directors Association. Governor Docking appointed him in 1974 to the Kansas ABC Board. He was appointed to the Kansas Board of Mortuary Art in 1985 and 1988, serving terms as President of both boards. He is an active member of the First United Methodist Church.

Webb was a partner in Webb & Rodrick Funeral Home with Larry Rodrick & Clarence Webb, semi-retiring in 1997.

Jerry and his wife Gwen are the parents of two sons, Stan and Zach, and three grandchildren. Their son Frank died in 1965. Jerry's hobby is golf.






