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Neewollah History

The Neewollah festival began in 1919 in an effort to provide positive activities for kids of all ages in place of typical Halloween pranks. Initially, the event centered around parades held morning, afternoon and night on October 31. The parades were made up primarily of decorated cars and carriages. Queens and princesses from area festivals rode in the parades, along with our own Queen Neelah, who was selected based on votes bought at a penny a piece. The Great Depression and World War II interrupted the Neewollah celebration from 1931 to 1947. Local businessmen Jim Halsey, Jerry Webb and Don Dancer revived and elaborated on the Neewollah theme, bringing it back as a three day festival in 1948. In the ensuing years, a queen's pageant, several presentations of a Broadway play, a carnival and street acts were added to the Kiddie Parade and Grand Parade. Today Neewollah is the oldest and largest annual festival in Kansas. Independence blossoms from 10,000- 12,000 residents to up to 75,000 people in the final days of the now ten day festival.

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Director's Notes/Synopsis

Willy Wonka

We are delighted to present **Roald Dahl's Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory** as the 2011 Neewollah musical. It is based on Dahl's book *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* which tells the story of Charlie Bucket as he receives a golden ticket and visits Willy Wonka's chocolate factory with four other children from around the world. The lyrics and music are by Leslie Bricusse and Anthony Newley. It was adapted for the stage by Leslie Bricusse and Timothy A. McDonald.

This show has many fans, as evidenced locally when **Roald Dahl's Willy Wonka Kids** was presented in 2009 by the Independence Summer Children's Theatre. This year we get to expand the production to its full glory in the telling of Dahl's timeless tale of the world-famous candy man and his quest to find an heir to his famous chocolate factory.

I last directed this musical in 2003 for Coffeyville Children's Summer Theatre using my own adaptation from Dahl's book, the full version, and pieces of the 1971 movie, *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*. This was way before Music Theatre International had come up with a staged musical version of this fantastic story.

The full-length MTI musical includes a memorable score that features "The Candy Man," "Pure Imagination," "Oompa Loompa," and "I Want it Now" by Academy and Grammy award winners Leslie Bricusse and Anthony Newley, neatly fitted into a new script adapted under the auspices of the Dahl Estate.

It is such a great honor to return to Neewollah and direct such great community performers. My last visit here as director was in 2006 with the production of **Little Shop of Horrors** where I met some incredibly talented people on and off the stage. Not much has changed since then. This production would not be possible without the many volunteers who give of their time both on the stage and behind the scenes. I am deeply grateful to our producers and assistants, our stage manager, music staff and crew. We all thank you for attending and hope you enjoy the show!

Judging Queen Neelah LXX

Queen Neelah candidates are evaluated by a panel of judges over a period of three days. As a means of introduction, each candidate presents an individual biography which gives personal background, interests, and her reason for entering the pageant. Miss Originality is chosen in part from the most original and imaginative biography. Candidates are also required to submit a portrait from which Miss Photogenic is selected.

The first opportunity for the judges to meet the candidates is the Queen's Tea held Sunday, October 23. The judges hold a private interview with each candidate on Monday, October 24. That same evening, each candidate presents a three-minute talent presentation. Miss Talent is chosen from the most polished and entertaining of the talent numbers. On Tuesday, October 25, a brunch is held where the candidates have a final opportunity to meet with the judges in an informal setting prior

to the coronation. Over the course of time spent with the candidates, the judges also evaluate each young woman's poise, personality, personal fashion sense, and beauty. The candidates themselves select Miss Congeniality.

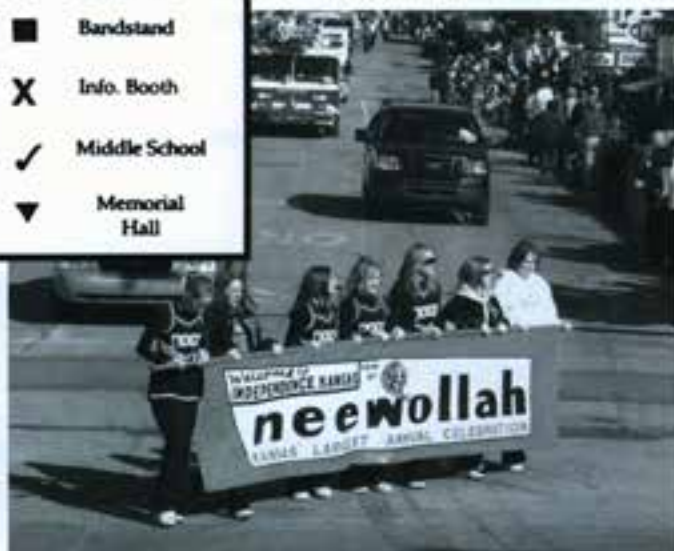

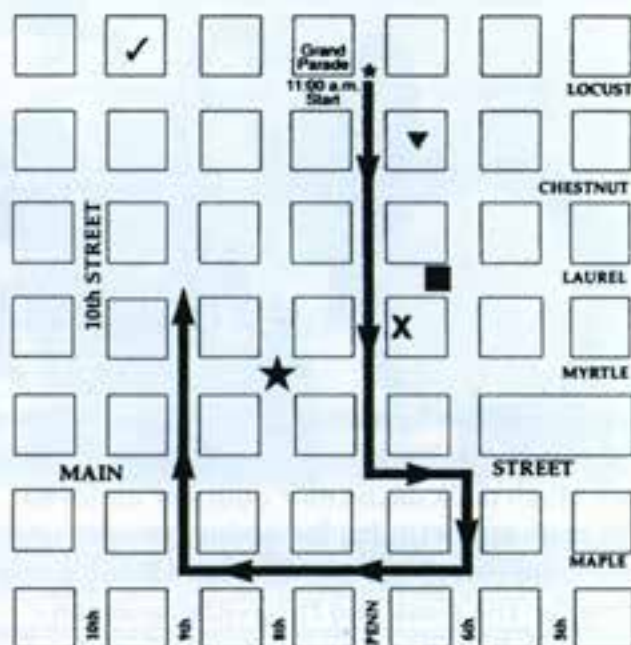

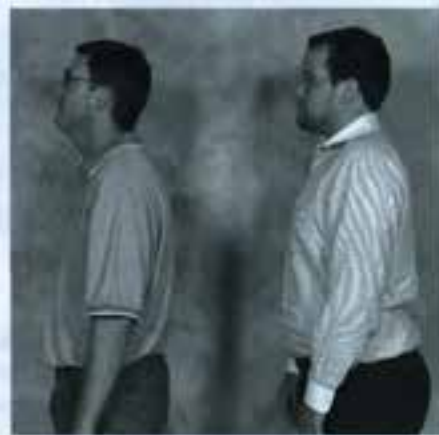
