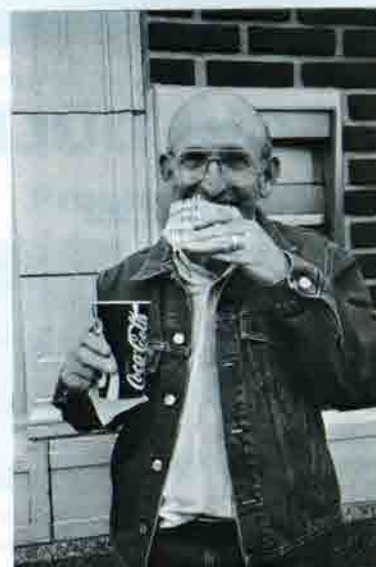

"GUYS & DOLLS," currently showing to packed houses across the country, centers around the lives of men and women trying to find themselves in one of New York City's rougher areas. Romance, humor, and irony are scattered throughout the musical in both the lyrics and the spoken lines. The musical is enjoying a current revival after its first Broadway performance in New York in November 1950. Neewollah is enjoying its own revival of "Guys & Dolls." In 1963 "Guys & Dolls" made its first appearance on the Neewollah stage.

Nathan Detroit is a man who is comfortable with his free wheeling, gambling lifestyle and he is unsure as to whether or not he needs the intrusion of Miss Adelaide into his life. Miss Adelaide is a showgirl who has her eyes set on becoming Nathan's wife. Sky Masterson is a big-time gambler who cannot pass up the chance to make a bet, even if it means falling in love. Sara Brown, the operator of the Save-A-Soul Mission, becomes involved with Sky, a man who stands for everything that she opposes.

Arvide Abernathy, the minister of the Salvation Army Mission, and General Matilda Cartwright of the Salvation Army are trying to increase "sinner" attendance at the mission. The Tin Horns, a ring of local gamblers, become caught up in this crusade against sinners. Meanwhile, Lt. Brannigan, a local NYC detective is trying to put an end to the Oldest Established Crap Game in New York City.

Thirty years ago...

Thirty years ago—times were simpler—Neewollah was a four day event.

"Guys & Dolls" took the stage of Memorial Hall and took the hearts of the people of Independence. With Paul Bish producing and Bobbie Gibson directing, the memories created have not faded in the three decades.

When Generalissimo Steve Wilkin announced "Guys & Dolls" would return to Memorial Hall, he also started the ball rolling for a reunion of the previous cast and crew.

Thirty years has taken its natural toll on the originators of the show in Independence. Some have moved from the area, some are no longer living, but many also enthusiastically responded to the invitation to attend a reception and then the musical. BANK IV was kind enough to allow the use of its downstairs meeting room and the reception will be held prior to Saturday night's show.

The most difficult aspect of putting together this event was locating the people—after thirty years. However with people like Rachelle Wyckoff, Lucy Thompson, Hazel Gillis and Jo Jones, the cast and crew couldn't hide. In only four days the vast majority was located and accounted for by these ladies. Bob Hille located most of the orchestra members and the reception was set.

Neewollah extends a warm welcome and a sincere THANK YOU to the members of the cast and crew of "Guys & Dolls" from 1963!

Cast members recall...

Dana Aitken—"One of the funniest parts of "Guys & Dolls" was having my husband Don play my grandfather. However, the fondest memory is the comradery; new friends of the cast members. This might be the only time of the year you see these people but they are really friends. However, another funny part was the crazy dance where I got to hit that fellow over the head with the break-away bottle."

Mary Lou Palmer—"Since 'Guys & Dolls' was my first Neewollah production, it has always been my favorite. It was really special for me — but I refuse to admit it was 30 years ago."

George Jones—"Jo Ann Halsey didn't like her music for her dance in the Cuban night club scene. Bobbie Gibson asked if we could do something, so we wrote 'The Bobbie Cha Cha!' Jo Ann liked it, and the next thing we knew the Red Coats were on stage. In straw sombreros, white torn britches, and red shirts. Our 'gig' was mercifully short but we had a BALL! [It] felt so good we played for the cast party the last night. The Red Coats consisted of Bob Wohltman, Gib Layton, Bud Sands, Paul Sell, Don Woolpert and me."
