BOARD OF EDUCATION

The group responsible for determining the policies to provide educational programs for students from kindergarten through high school is the Board of Education for the Unified School District Number 446. The Board has also served as the Board of Trustees for the Independence Community Junior College. It is composed of citizens who meet on the first Monday of each month for regular sessions, or at special sessions which may be called by either the president or superintendent. The Board prepares budgets, hires teachers, deals with problems like the fire at the high school, and conducts other school affairs.

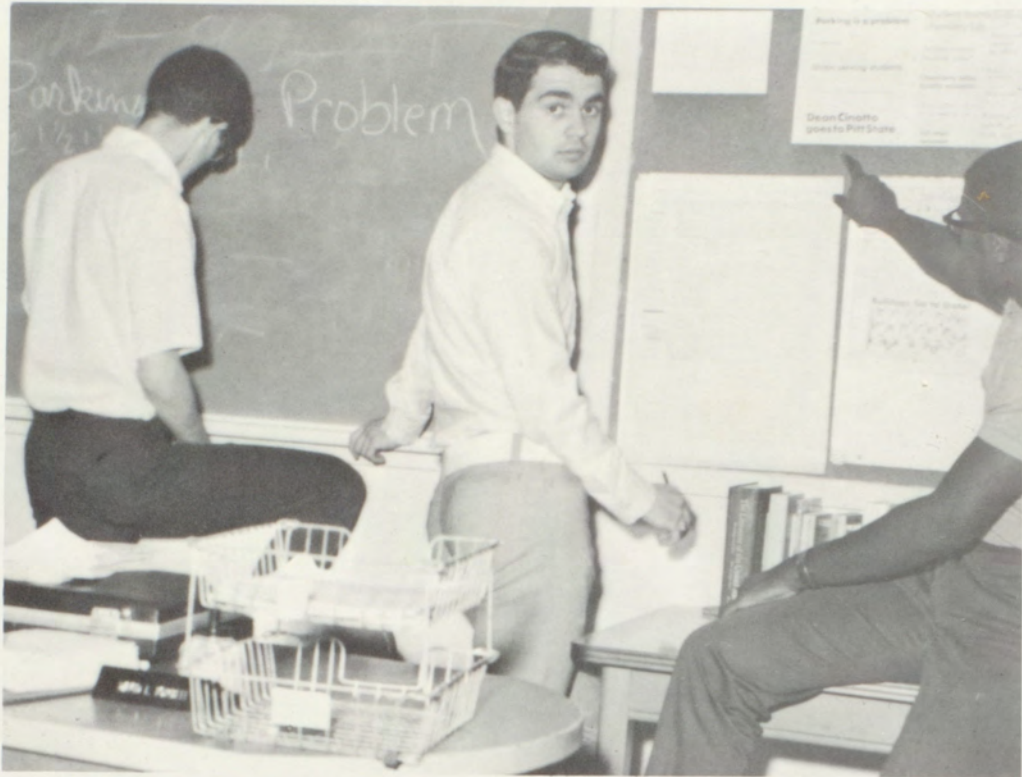

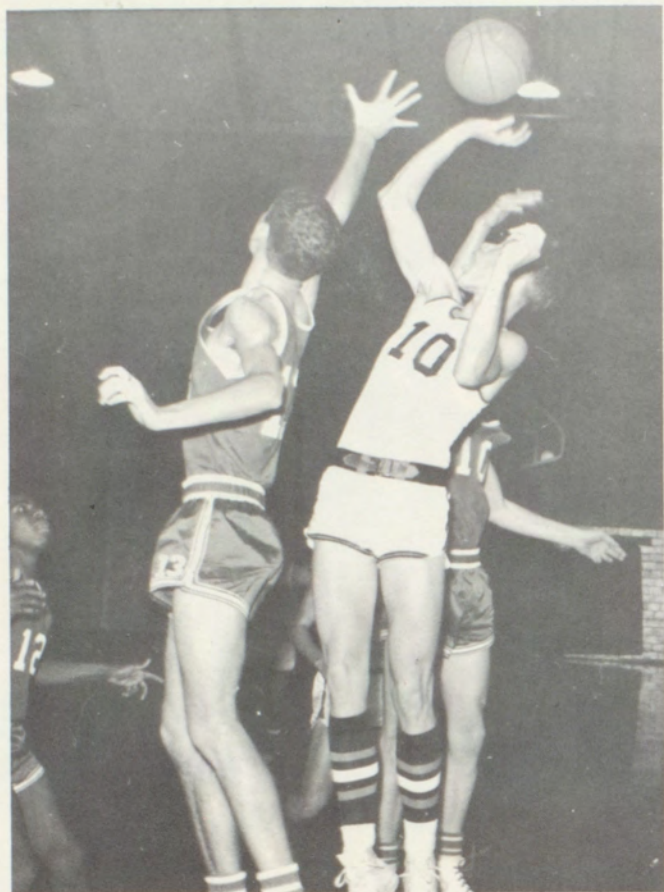

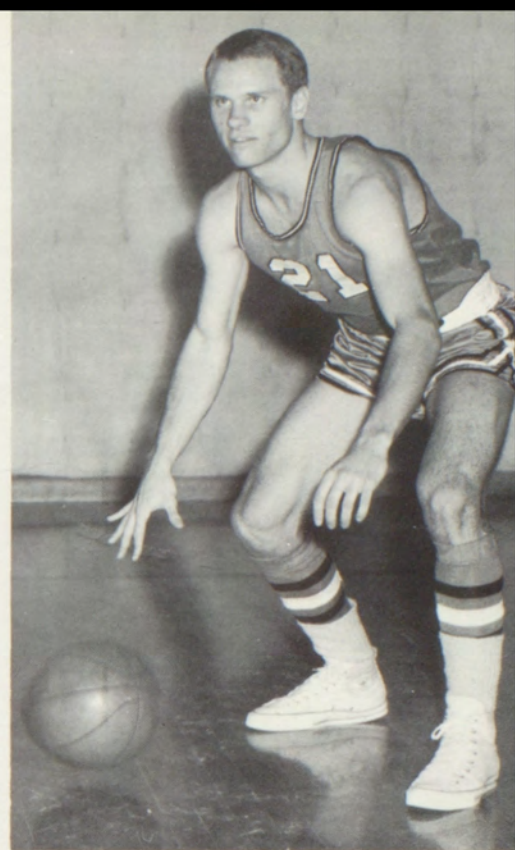

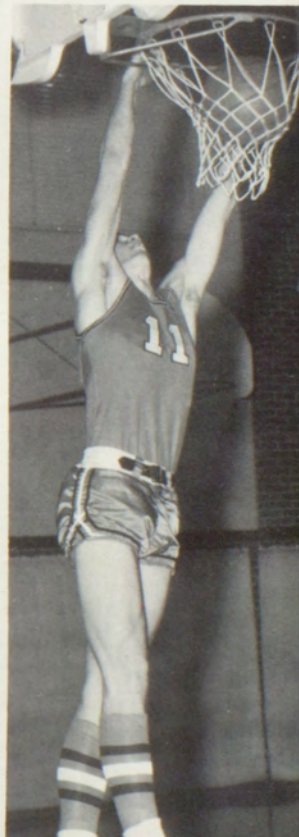
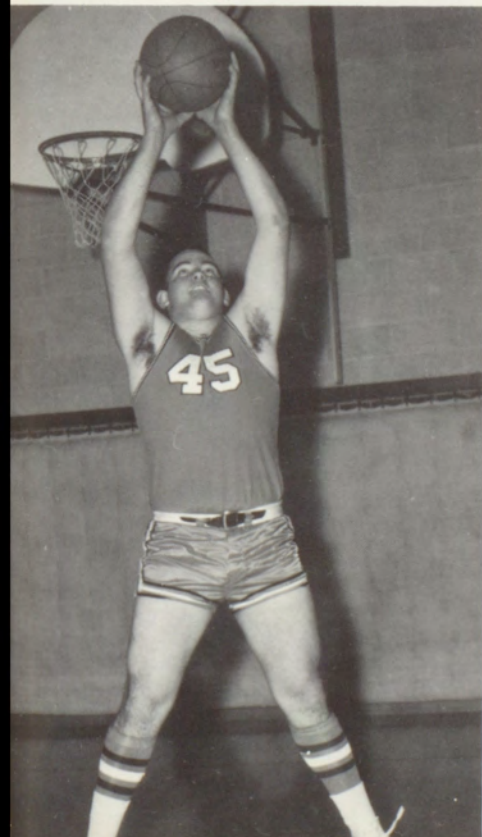

Besides Ark City, our team had games scheduled with Parsons, Chanute, Coffeyville, and three invitationals.

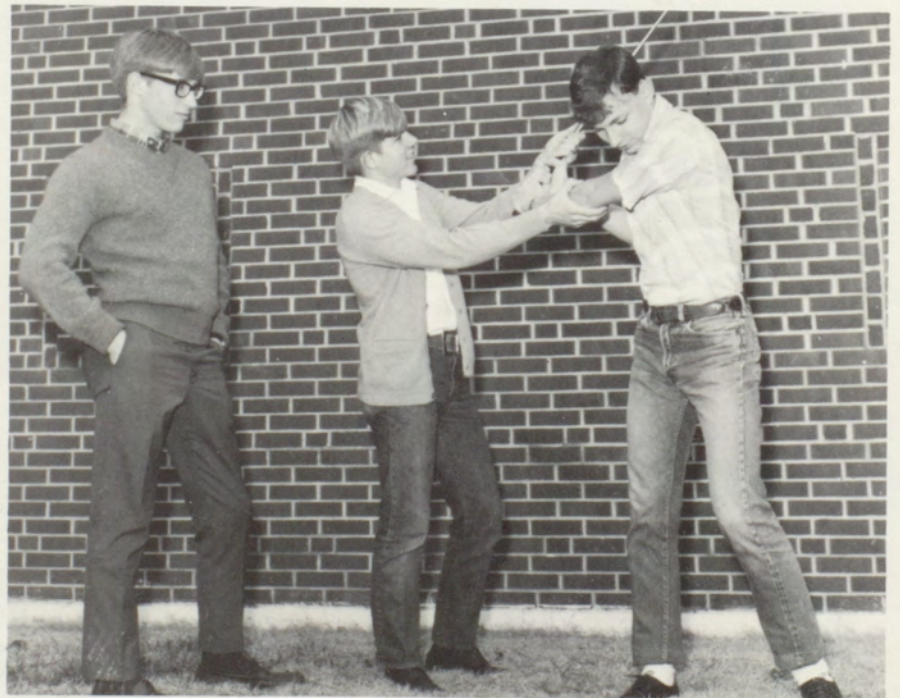

ACADEMICS



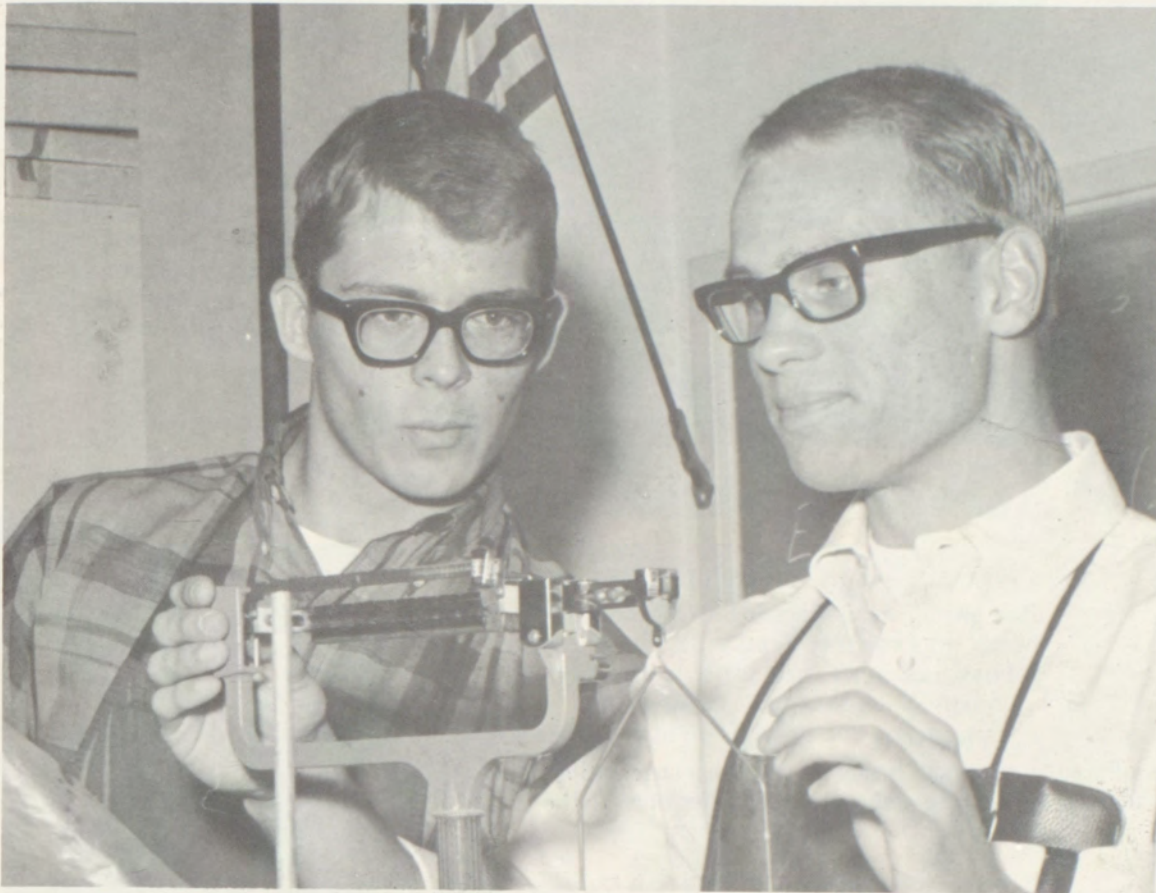
HEALTH AND SAFETY

This course was designed to help improve the physical, mental and emotional health of students.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The main purpose of this course was to assist students to realize the importance of good health and to create within them the desire to attain the highest degree of physical well being.



CHEMISTRY

A study of the fundamentals of elementary chemistry. This course was basically college preparatory; however, some emphasis was given to the application to everyday living.



PHYSICS

A study of the fundamentals of elementary physics. While this course was basically college preparatory, usefull applications can be found in all phases of every day living.



AMERICAN GOVERNMENT

A full year course for seniors involving the study of the various units of government from the family to the international level was what American Government offered.

FRENCH

This course offered a thorough study of French conversation, grammar and composition with the laboratory facilities open to the students.



ENGLISH

Still life, landscape, and life problems in composition were studied in this course.

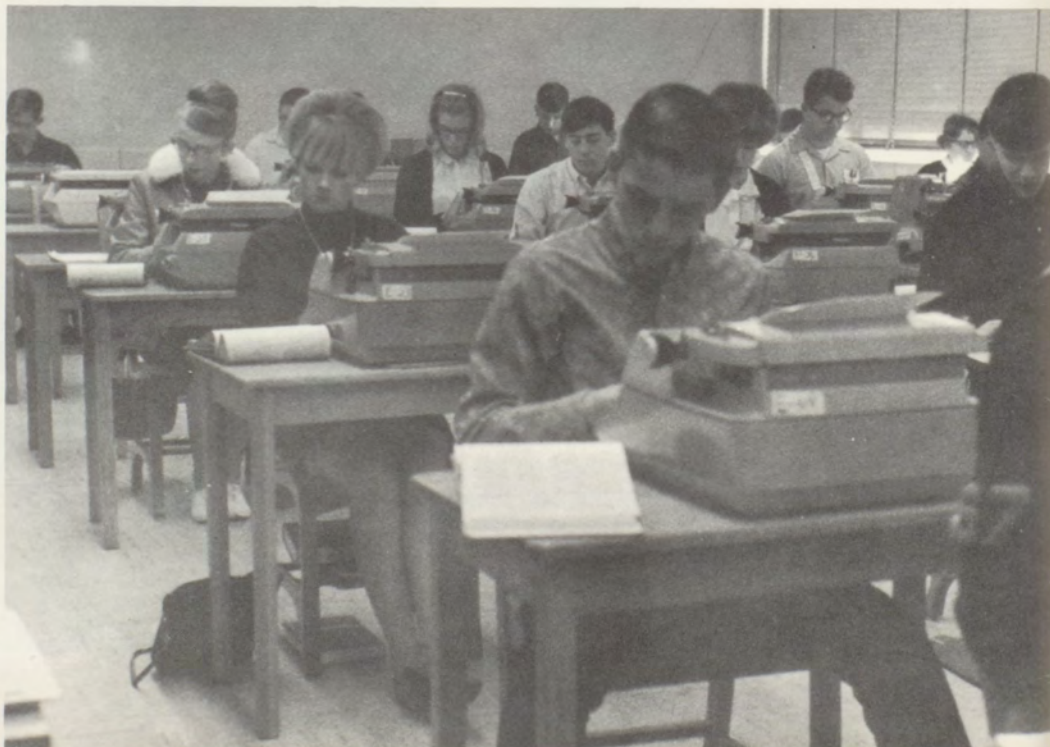

The typing course provides general instruction in the principles of machine operation, technique and accuracy, letter forms, and business forms.



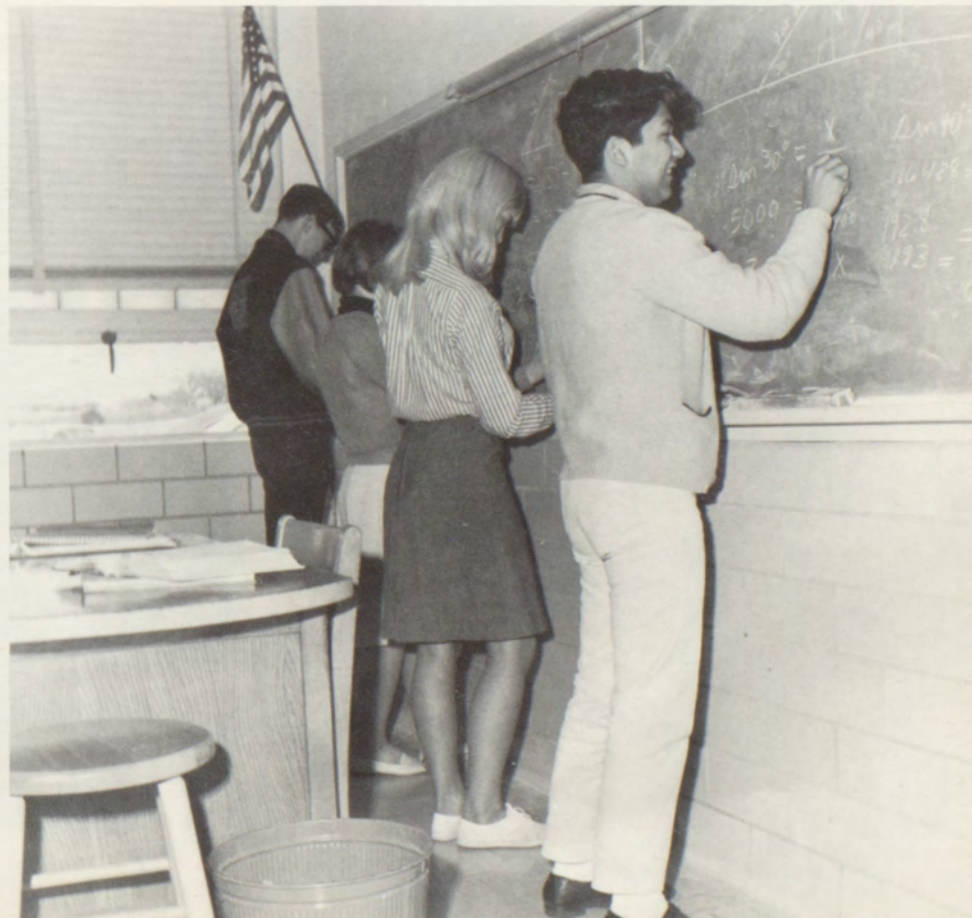


METALWORK
