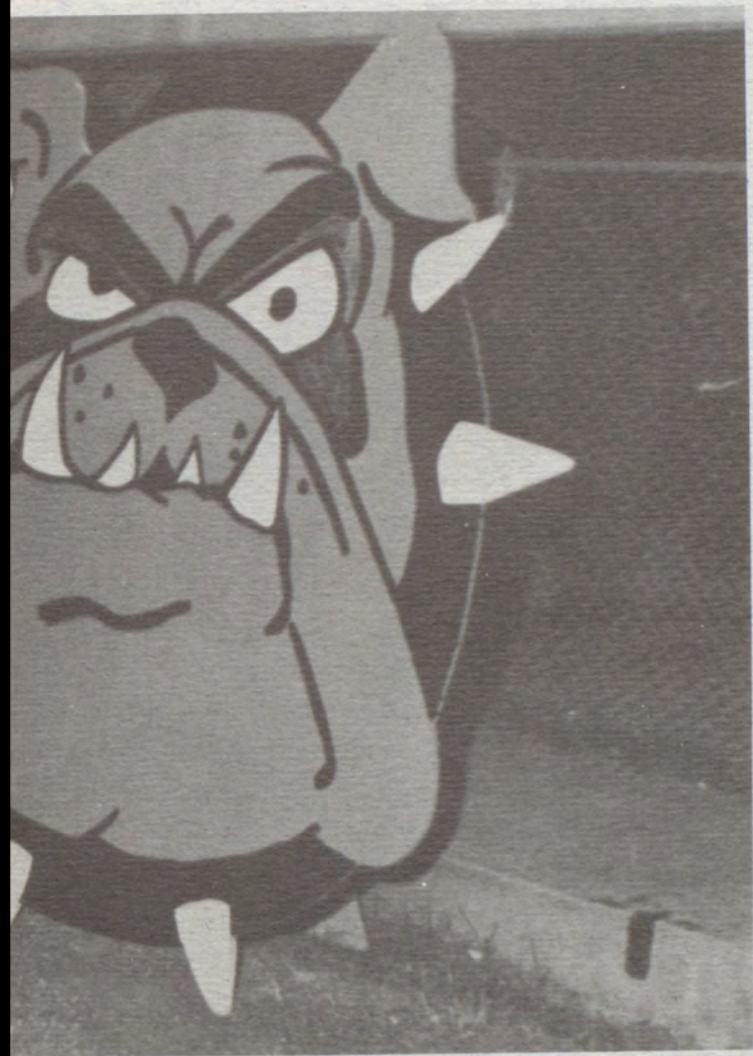
## FOREWORD FOCUSING ON FACES. . .

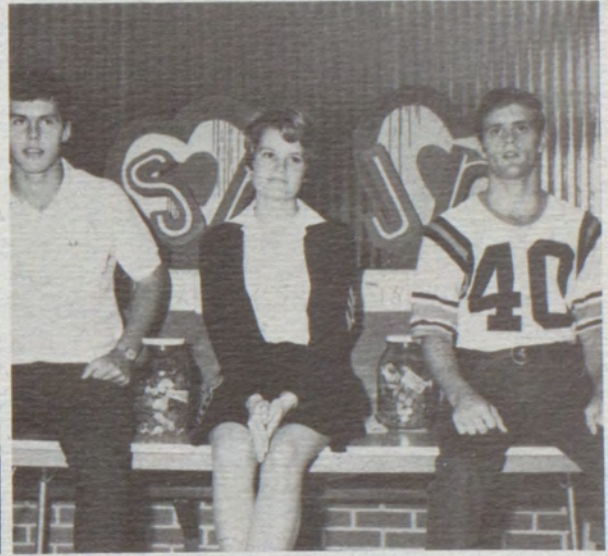
# *The Many Faces Of Student Life*

Some faces flash wide grins; others smile self-consciously. Some are a little wistful, some a little unsure, and some a little cold!







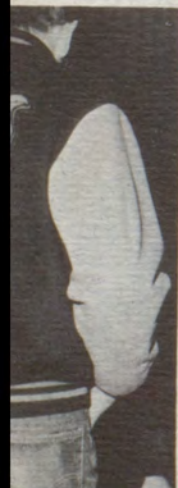
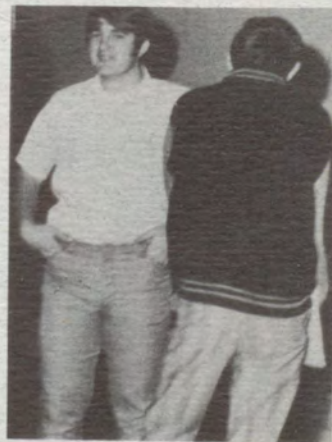
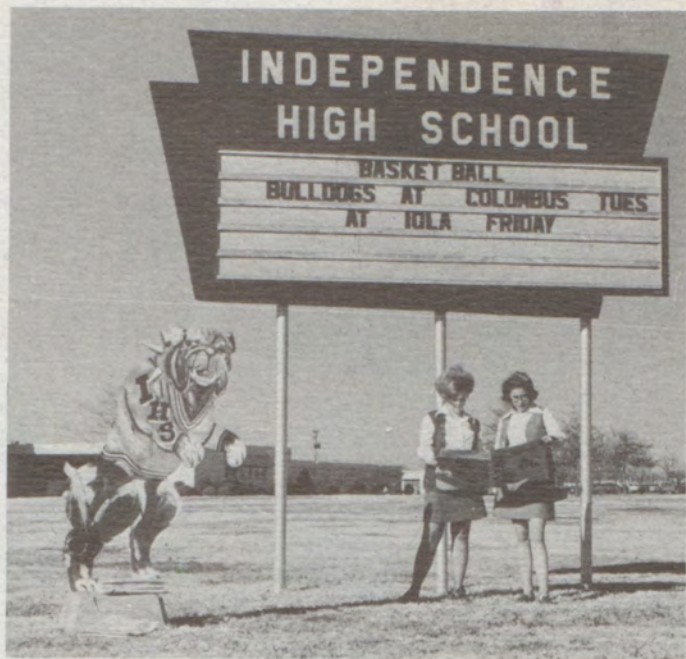

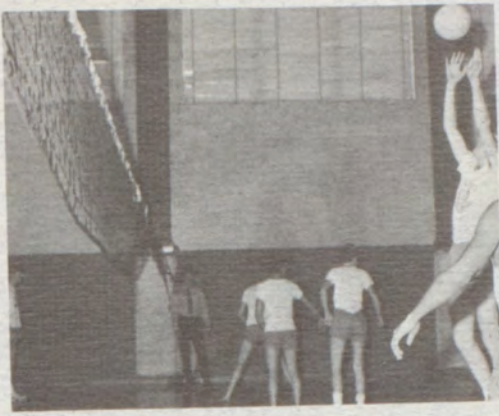


## BUSINESS EDUCATION

Business education has a large enrollment at IHS. Many students today realize the need for knowledge of fundamental typing, shorthand, office practice, and bookkeeping in a modern world.

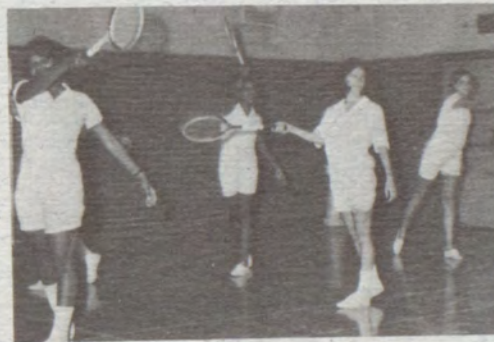






### PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The Choral department of Independence High presents several programs each year for the student body. In addition to their school presentations, the choral department gives performances for local civic groups.



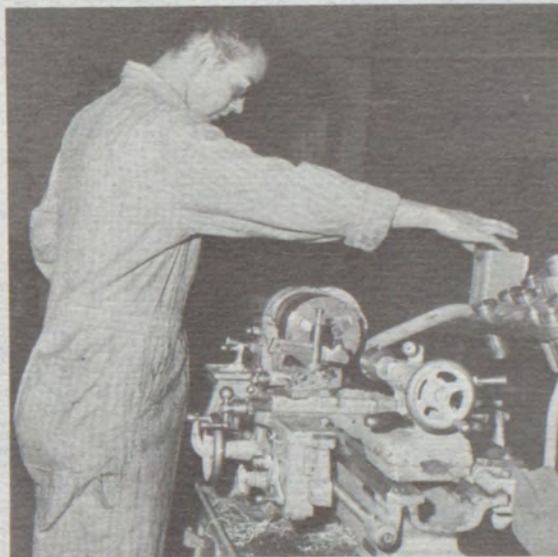

With the new year, IHS acquired an entirely new science staff but, to their great dismay, little new lab equipment.



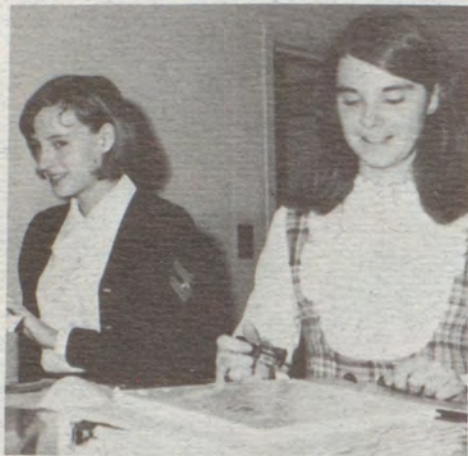

## *SPORTS*





Starting afresh with new coaches, the Dogs bounced back from a 28-0 loss to SEK Co-Champ Pittsburg to record impressive victories over Ft. Scott 25-6 and Chanute 32-6. The victory over Ft. Scott was Indy's first since the Tigers had broken the Bulldog's 49-game winning streak in 1963. After picking up momentum and hopes for a first division finish in league play, the Dogs suffered a heart-breaking loss to Parsons, who shared the league title with Pittsburg. Even though trailing late in the game a determined Indy eleven pushed deep







into Viking territory only to lose the ball on downs at the five yard line. The well-played, hard fought loss to Parsons marked the first of three narrow setbacks. A 7-12 loss to Iola and 12-13 loss to Columbus on Homecoming night followed. Picking up the pieces and regrouping with much determination and self-sacrifice enabled the team to rally for perhaps their best game of the year in a 20-6 win over Joplin Memorial in the mud. The Canines gave the visitors from Missouri a sound lesson in "Kansas Style" football. On the upswing, the Bulldogs roared to a 53-12 victory over Altamont who had humbled the Dogs the previous year. Points came in clusters and when the final gun sounded, the biggest score of the season in the SEK had been recorded. A gallant effort to finish with a winning season fell short in a 0-6 loss to C-ville. Scoring in their first series of plays on a 60-yard pass play, Coffeyville gained the lead and was able to thwart Indy drives. The last few seconds of the game saw an Independence fourth down pass fall incomplete from the 10-yard line. The Tornado once again held the "Traveling Trophy." Bulldogs receiving recognition for their performances were: Barry Turner, All-SEK; George Hybarger, All-SEK; Walter O'Brien, Steve Carpenter, Jim DeWeese, and Gary Sanborn, honorable mention. George Hybarger was selected by the team as the Most Outstanding Back while Gary Sanborn was selected as the Most Outstanding Lineman.

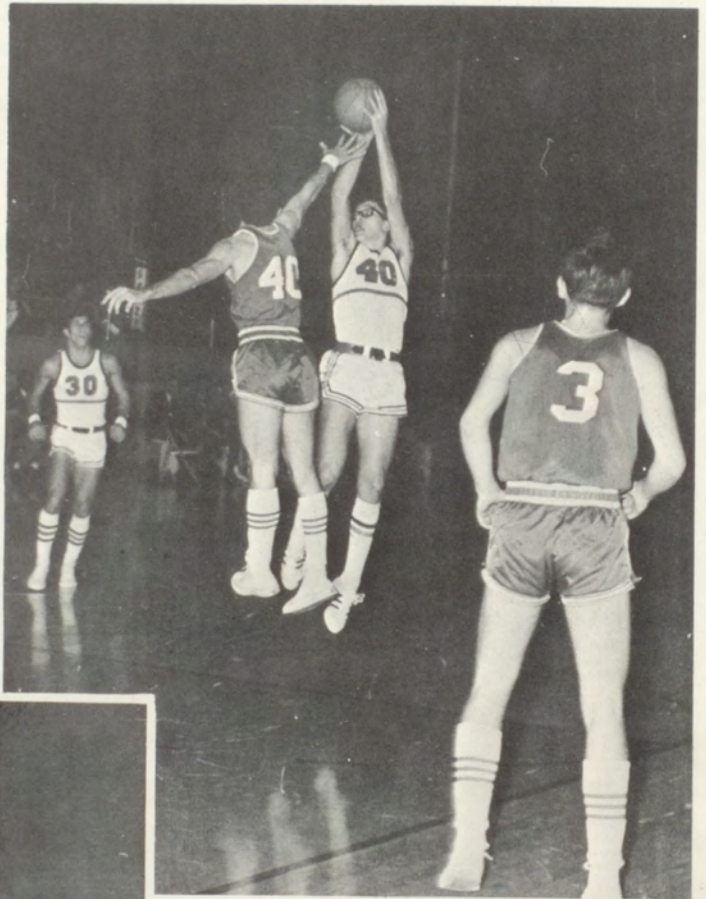

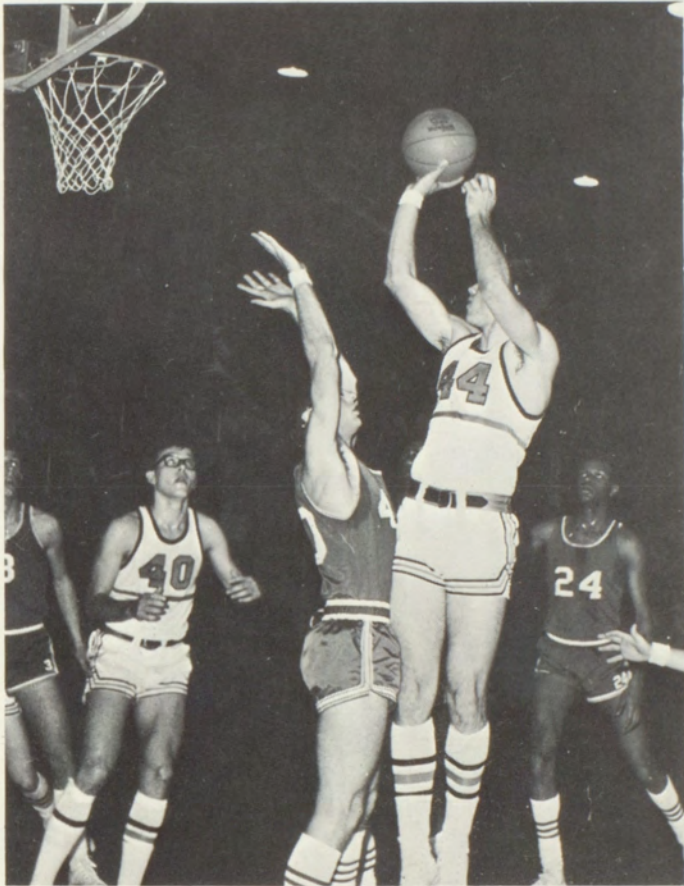


ABOVE: Underwood 40, shoots over opponents stretching arm. Pat was chosen honorary captain of the Bulldogs by the team.

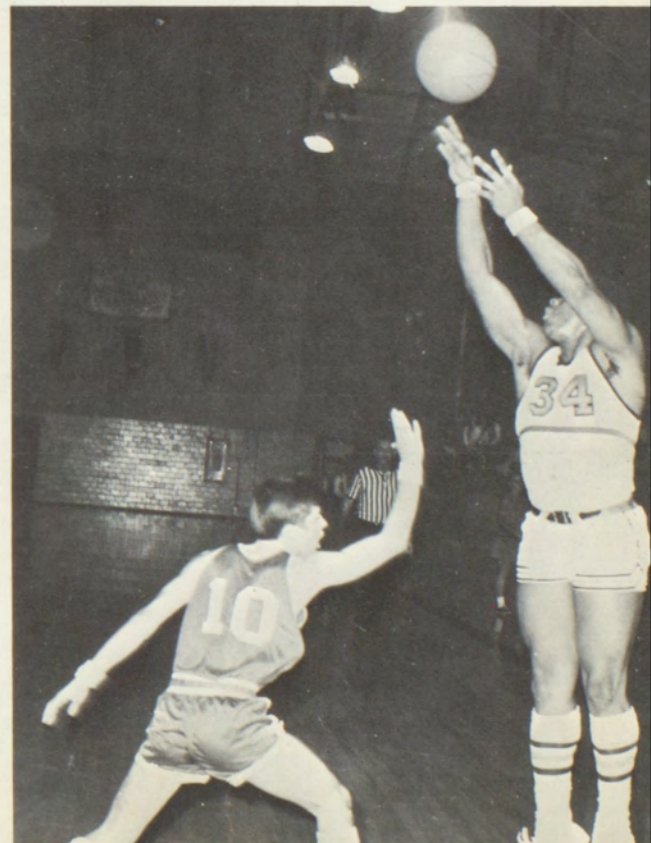




ABOVE: George Hybarger takes a long jump shot from the top of the circle.

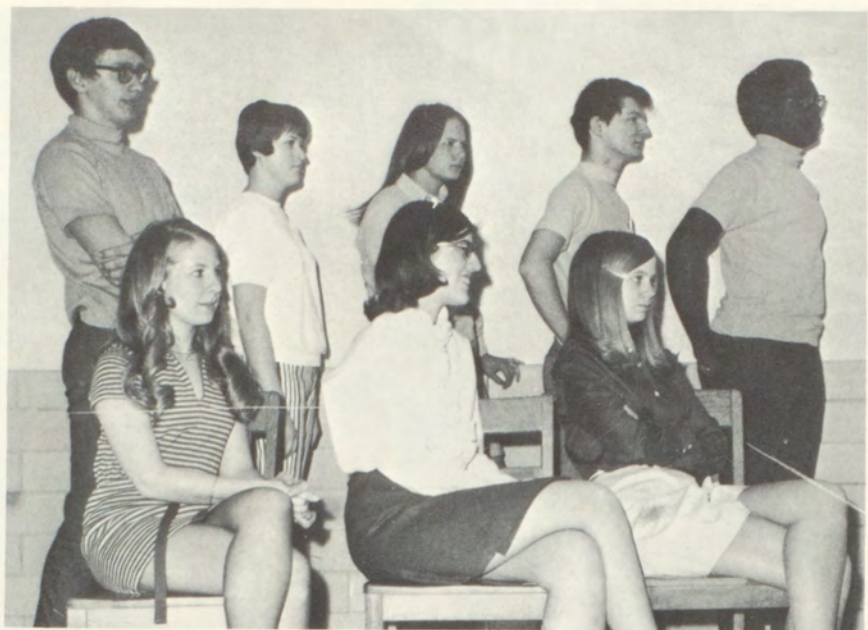

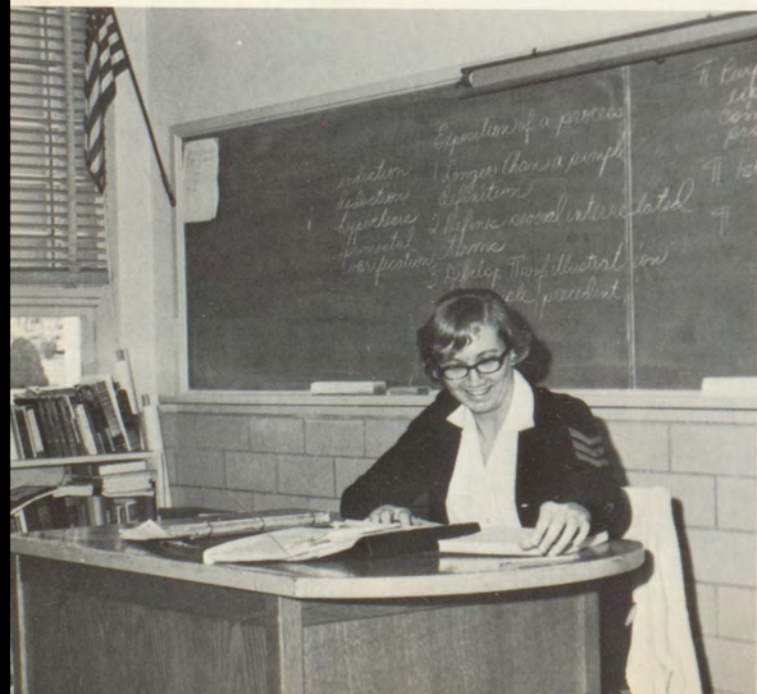
