MINI COURSES: SOMETHING NEW AT IHS

Mini courses are something new at IHS. This year was the first and an experimental one for mini courses and seems to have weathered it very well. So far, they have been limited to the English department but may be extended to other departments in the future. 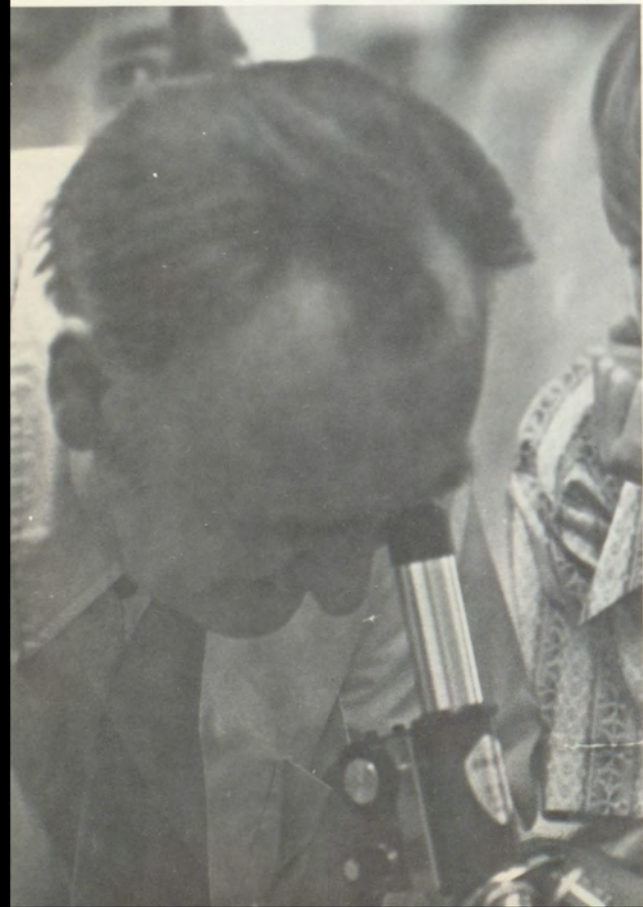

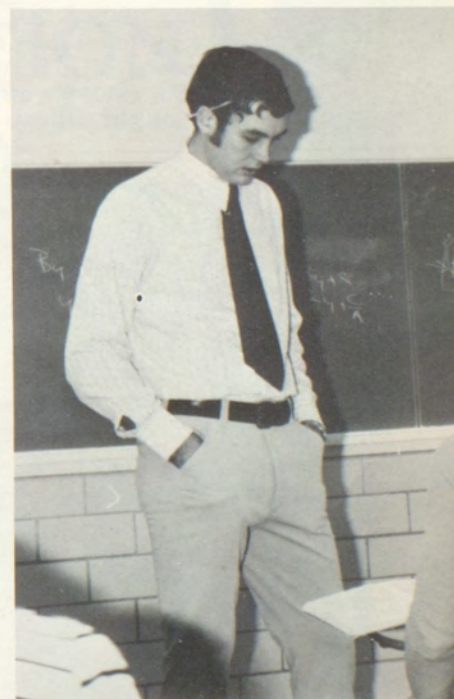

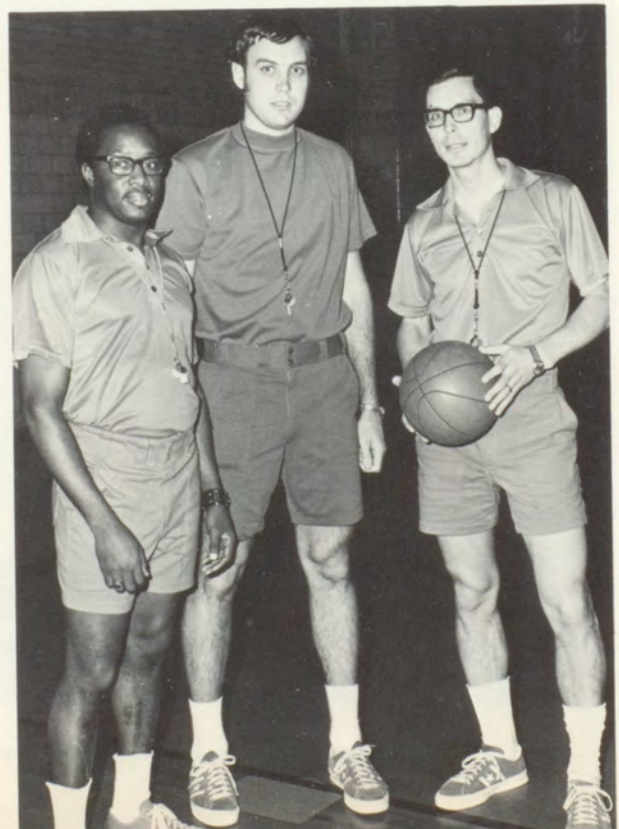

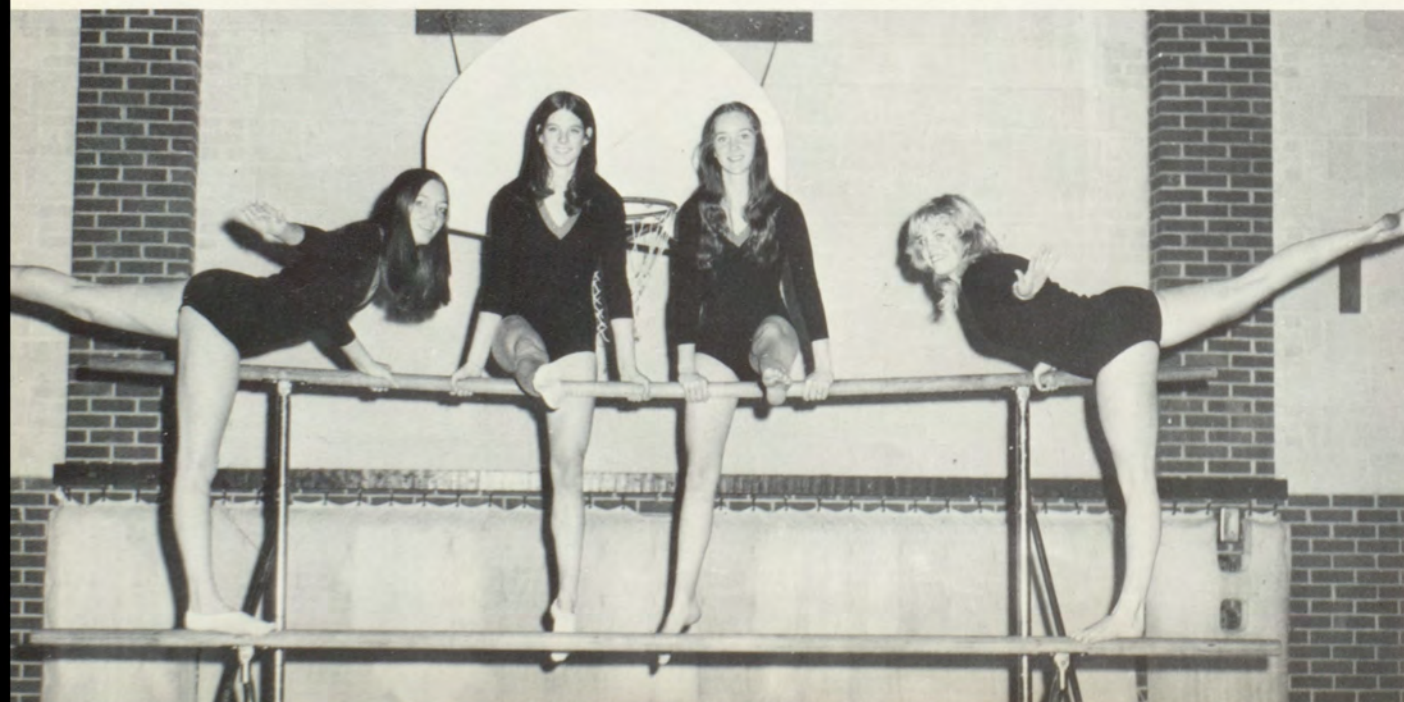
The field of judging is a low point in Gymnastics. According to Henisey, the lack of knowledge in the sport and lack of communication between coaches is the cause of this infraction.

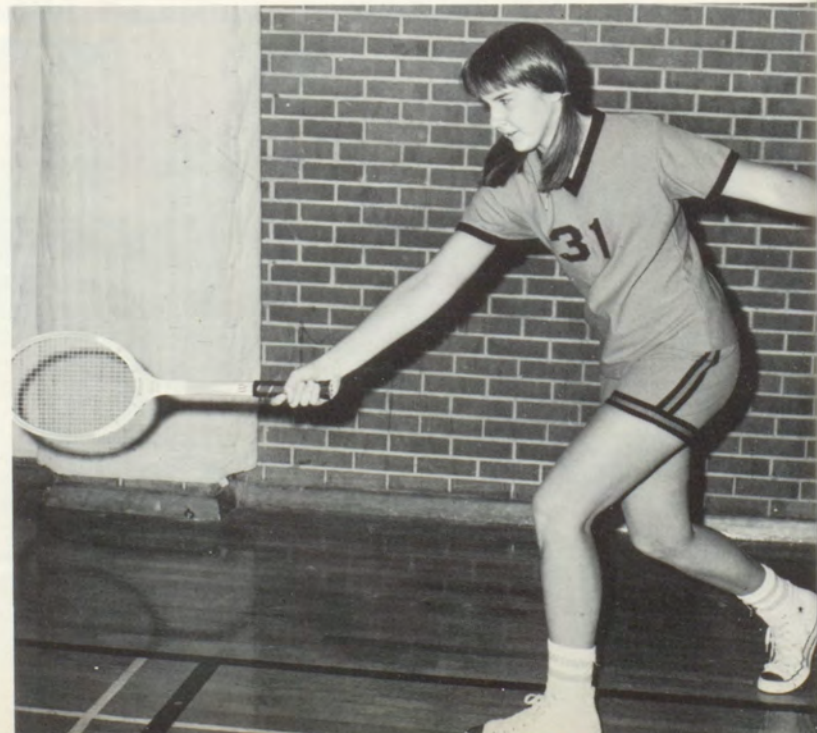

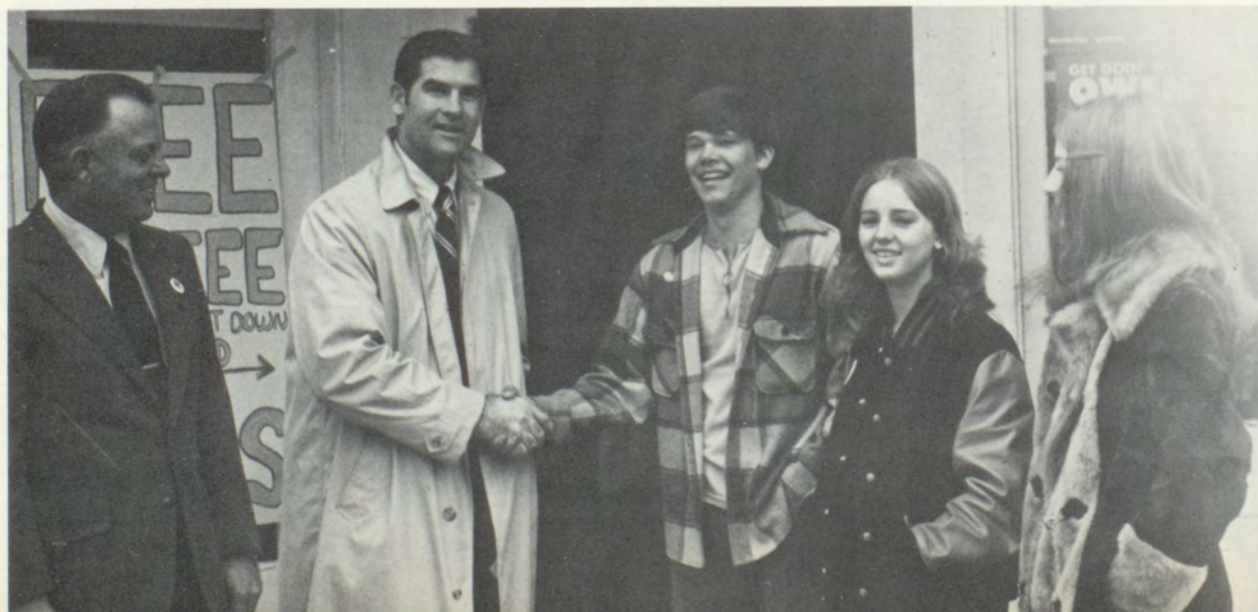
