3. WE DIRECT THAT BILLIE SMITH BEQUEATH HER FLIRTING ABILITY TO BETTY JO BOOMERSHINE.

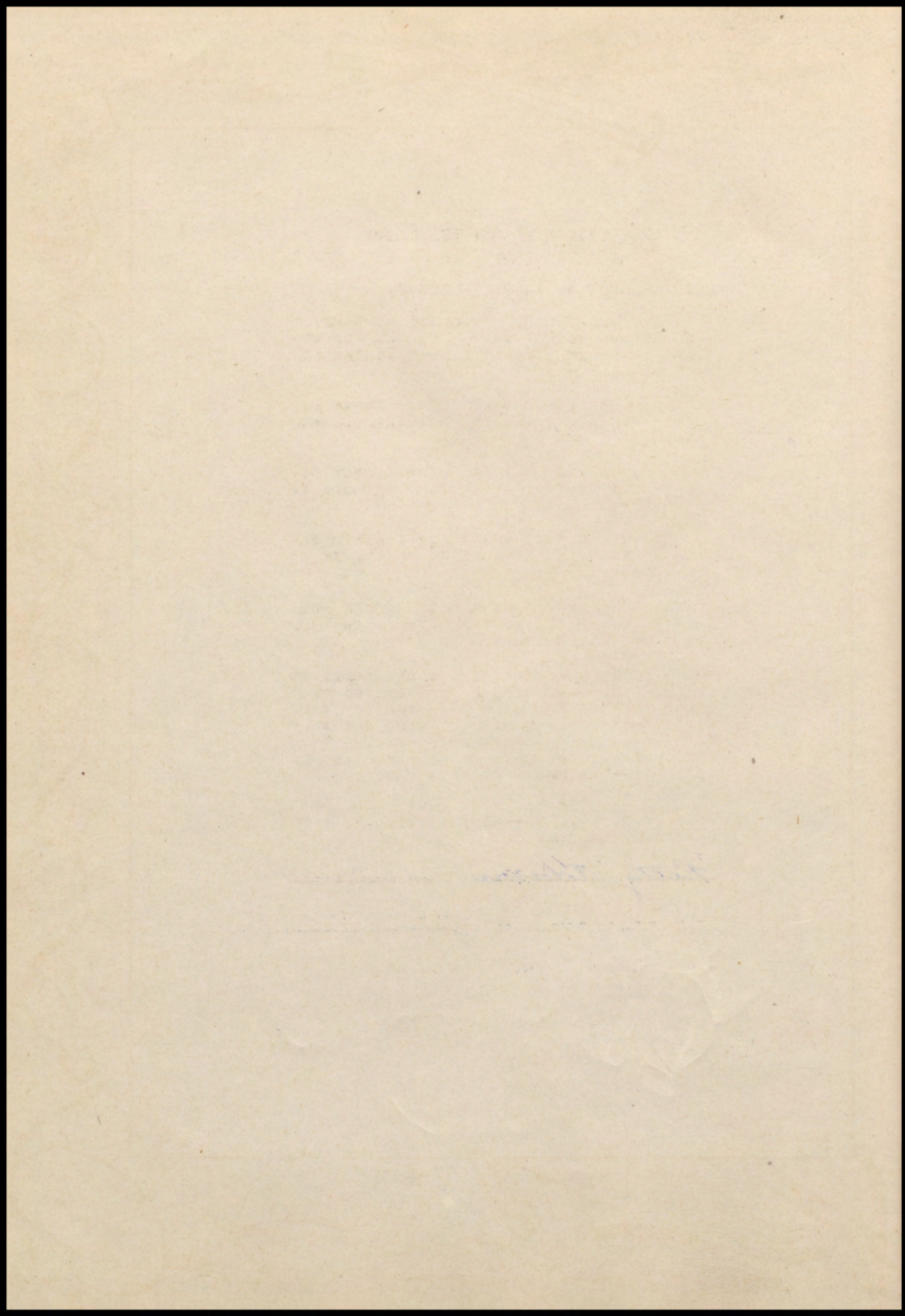

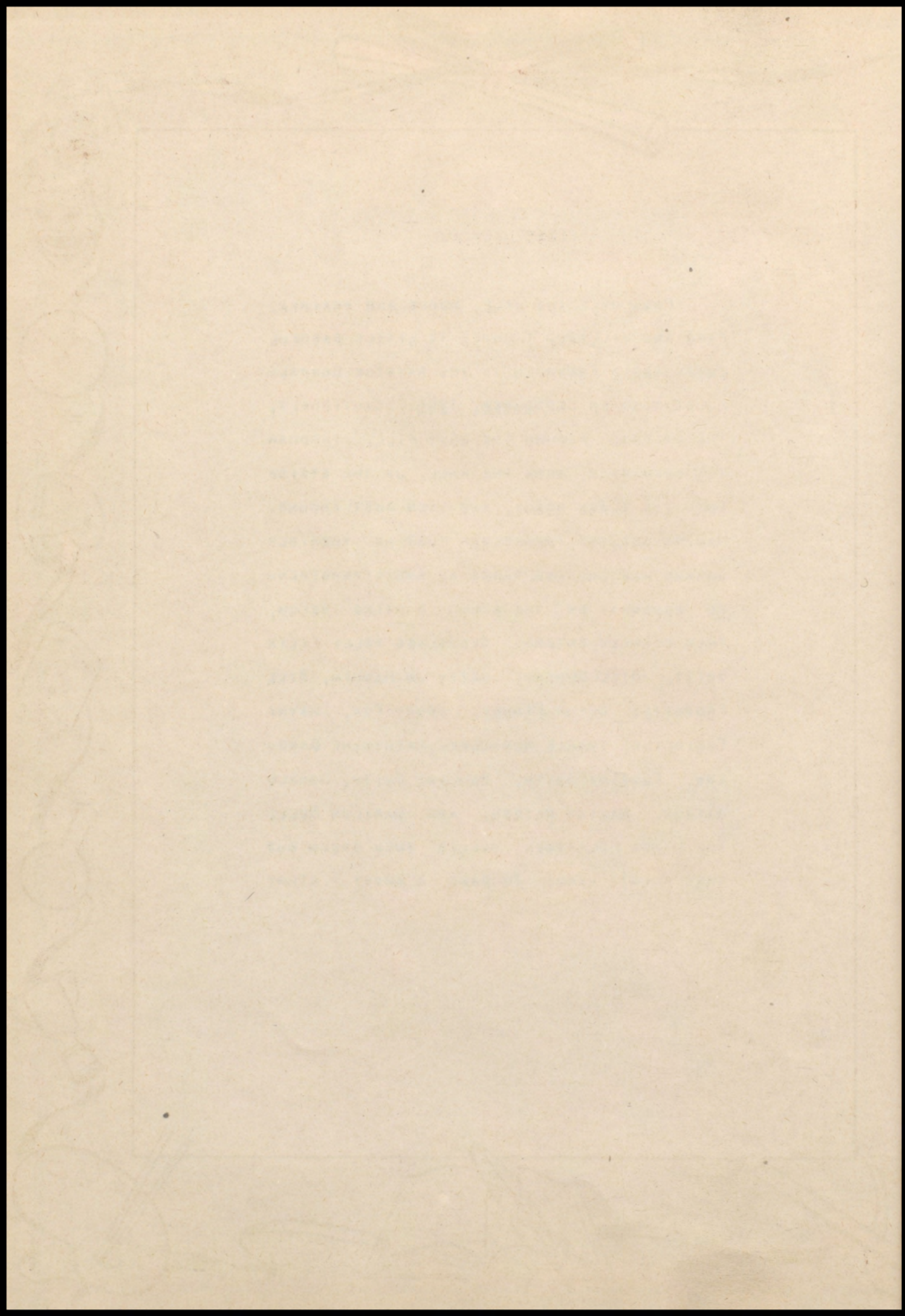





CLASS HISTORY

THEY DIDN'T MIND. TO MAKE A SHORT STORY

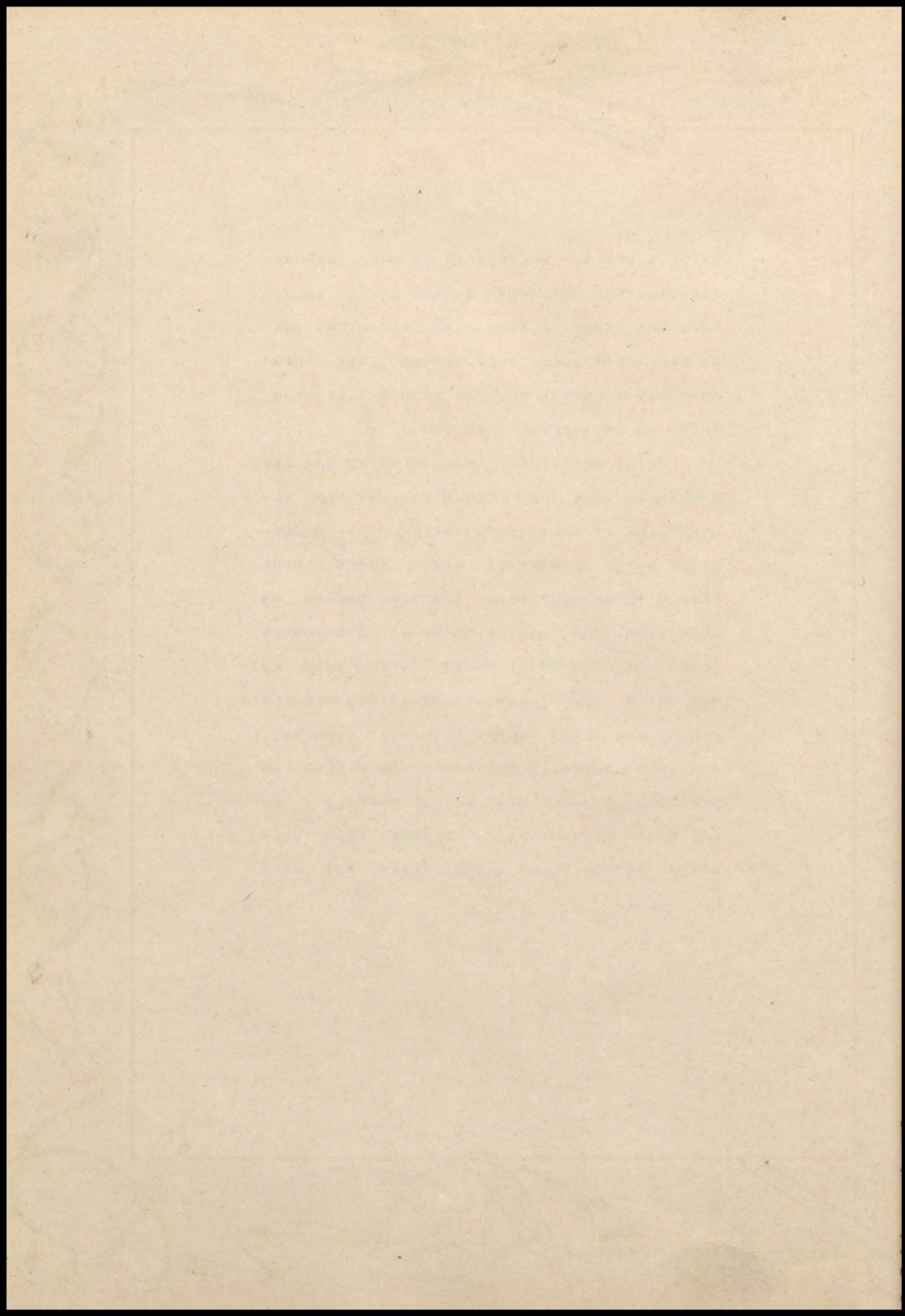

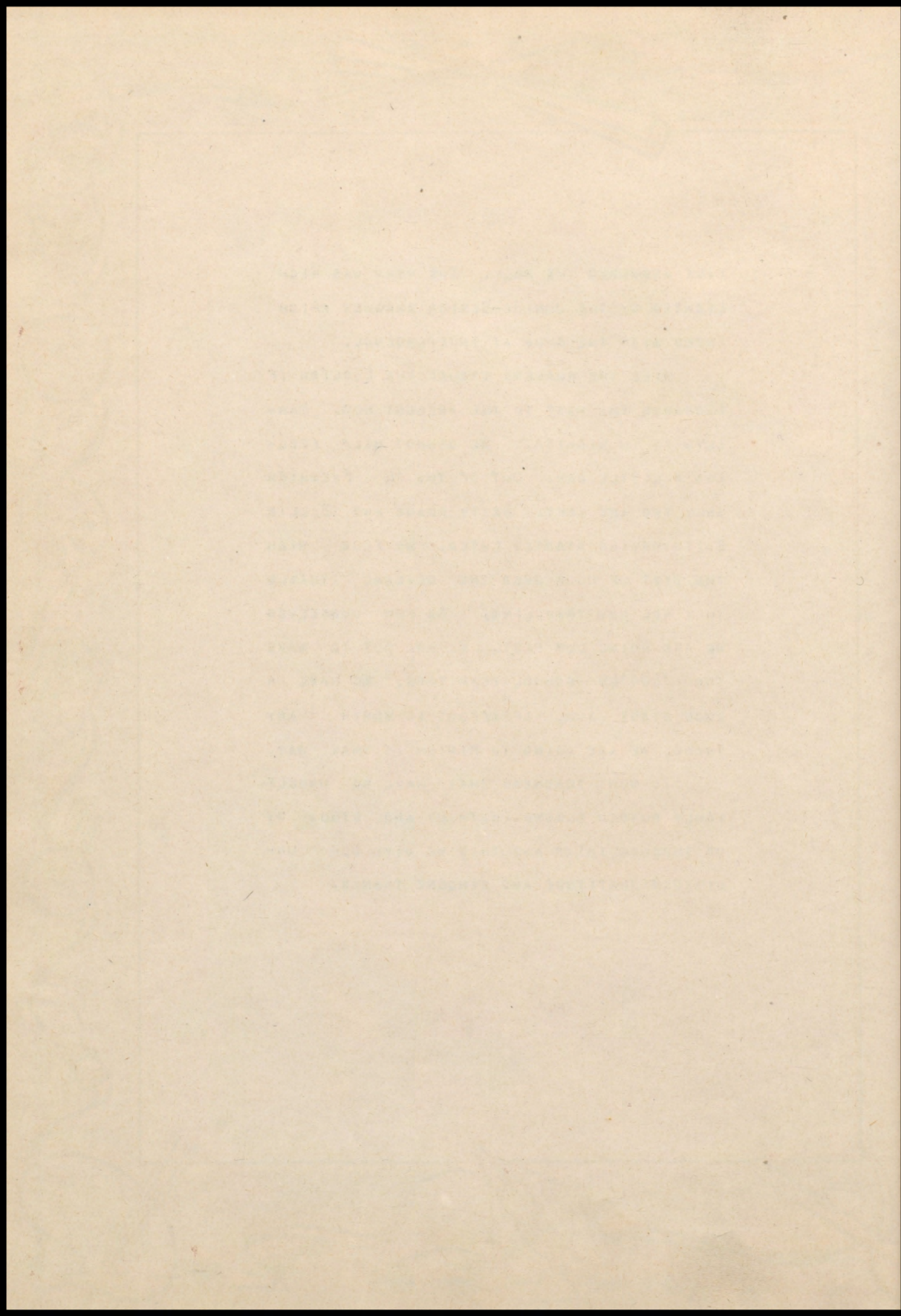


FIVE ANSWERED THE ROLL. THE YEAR WAS HIGH

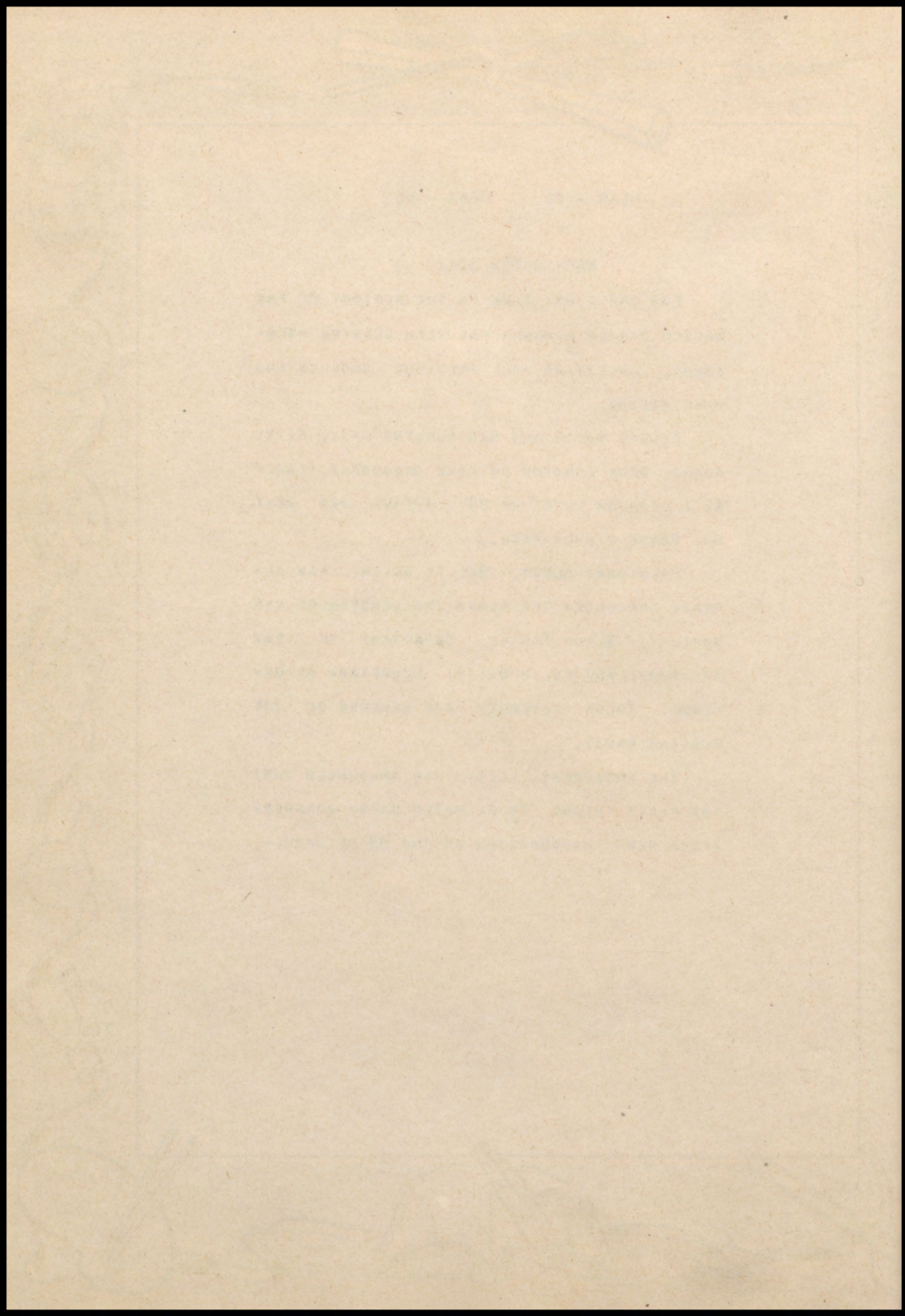

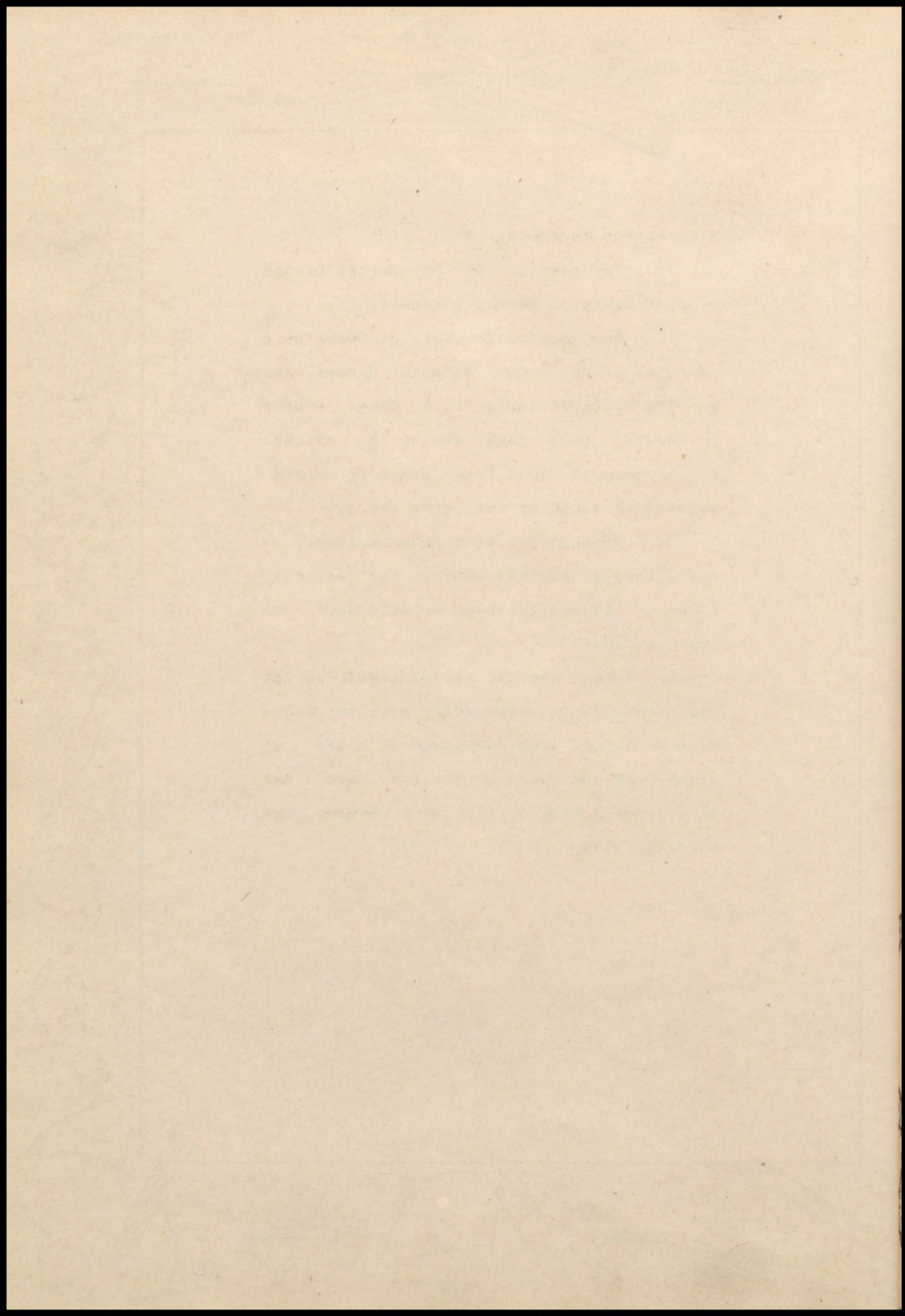
1. THE CAPITAL OF THE UNITED STATES WILL BE MOVED TO WAYSIDE, KANSAS.



spent, they took in a show in Garrettsville.

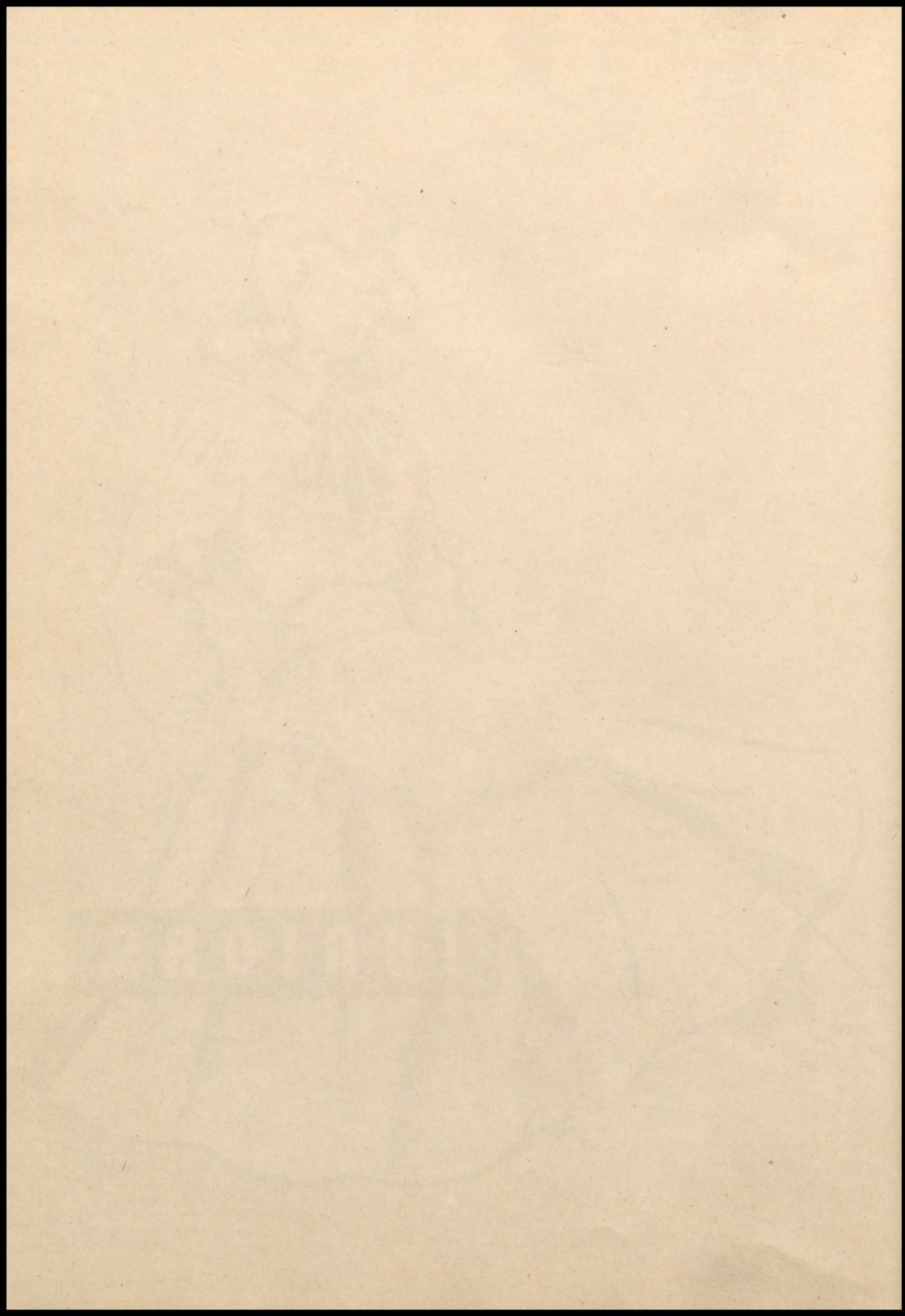
Next might each lay down in his

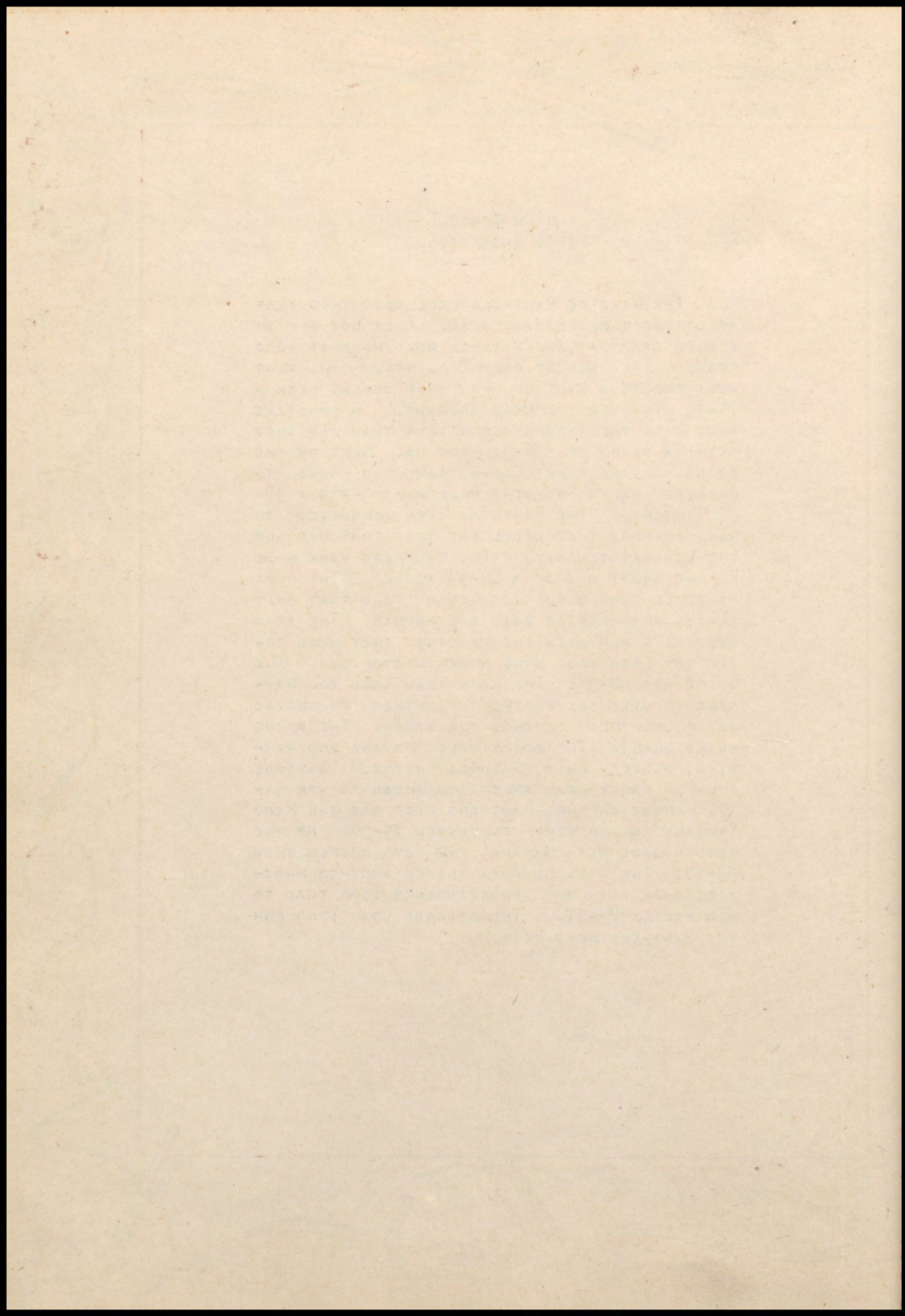





HIGH SCHOOL
