Leonard McCarty is a three star general in the U.S. Army.

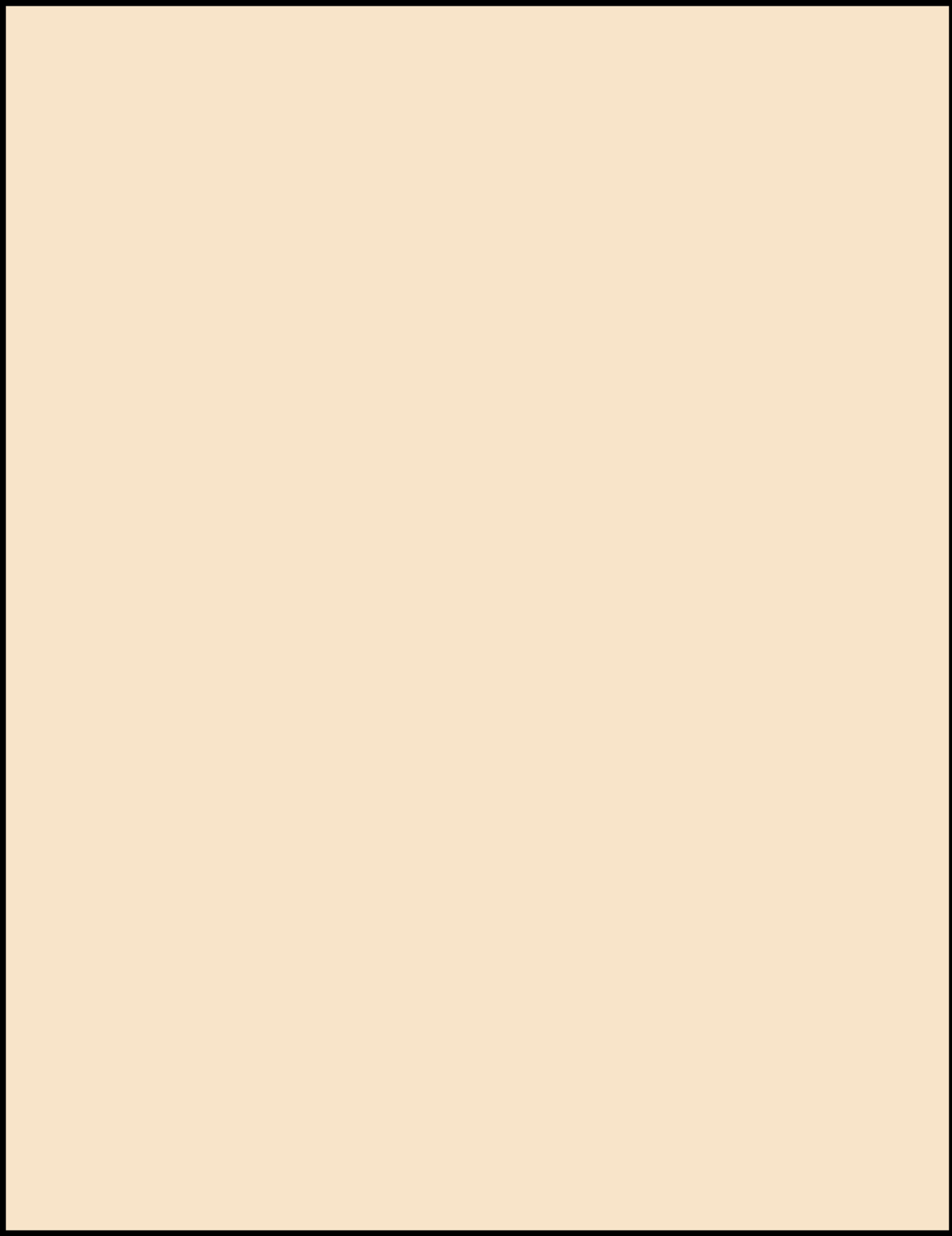
Mona Johnson is the coach at University of Kansas. They have an undefeated team.

Hazel Atkinson, now Mrs. Robert Beyen, is carrying on her career as a newspaper reporter.

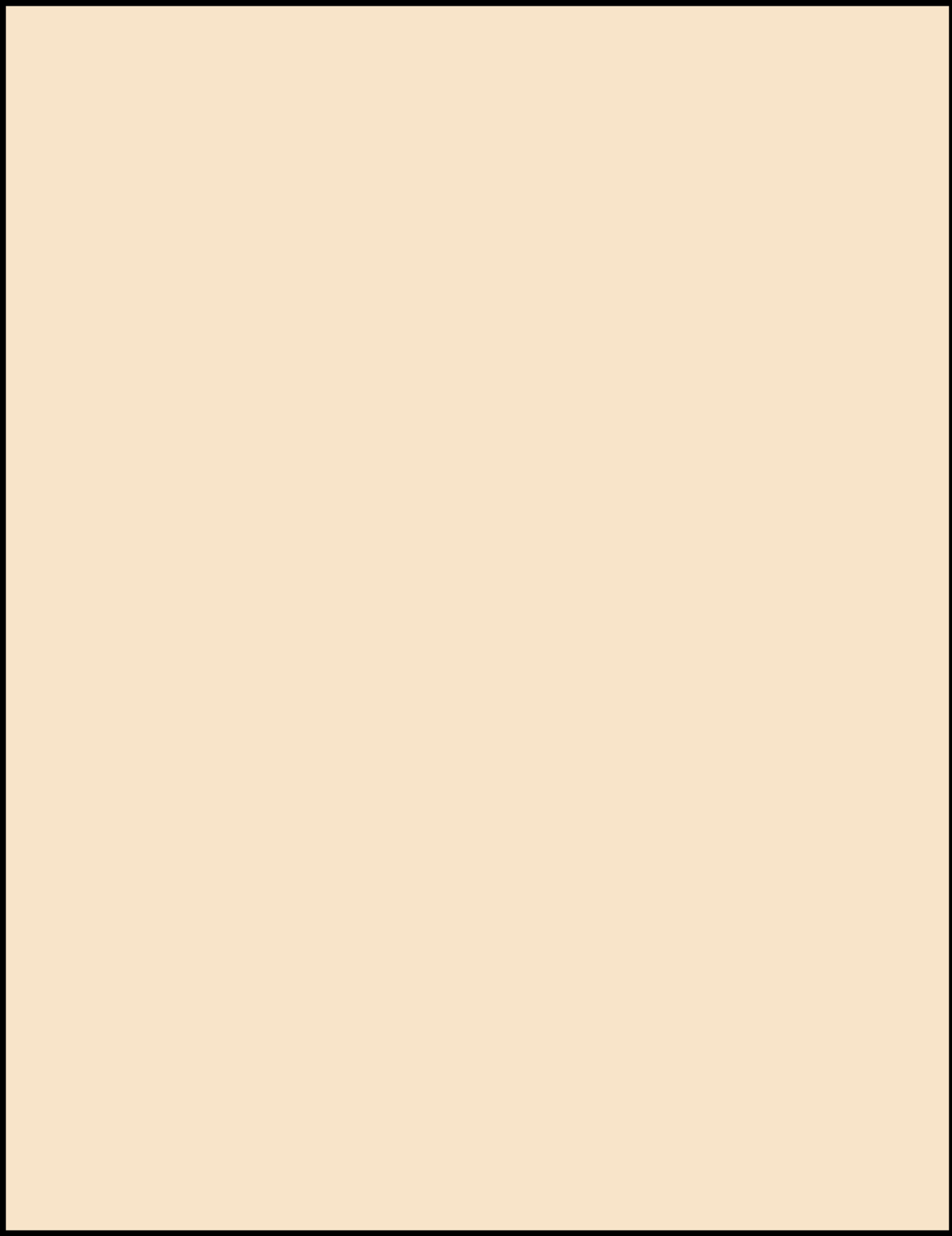
Otis Miller is the president of Miller and Miller Farm Association. His company has made great progress.

Shirley McCarty is an Air Stewardess of the American Skyline. She is quite popular.

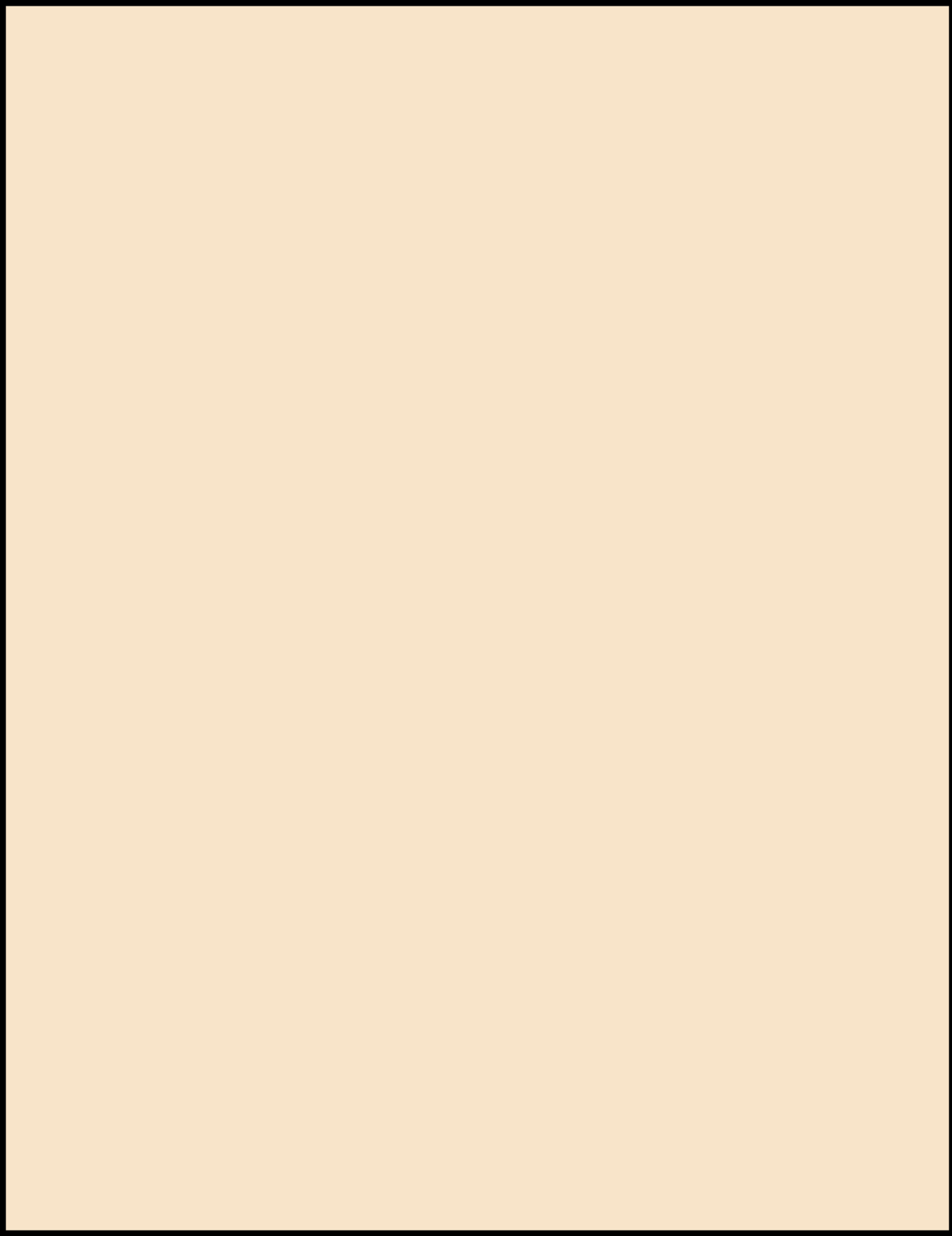
Donald Blackburn is a surgeon at Halstead. He has treated many famous people.

Do you remember when Lois was caught making eyes at John Watson? She almost shocked the socks off of him.

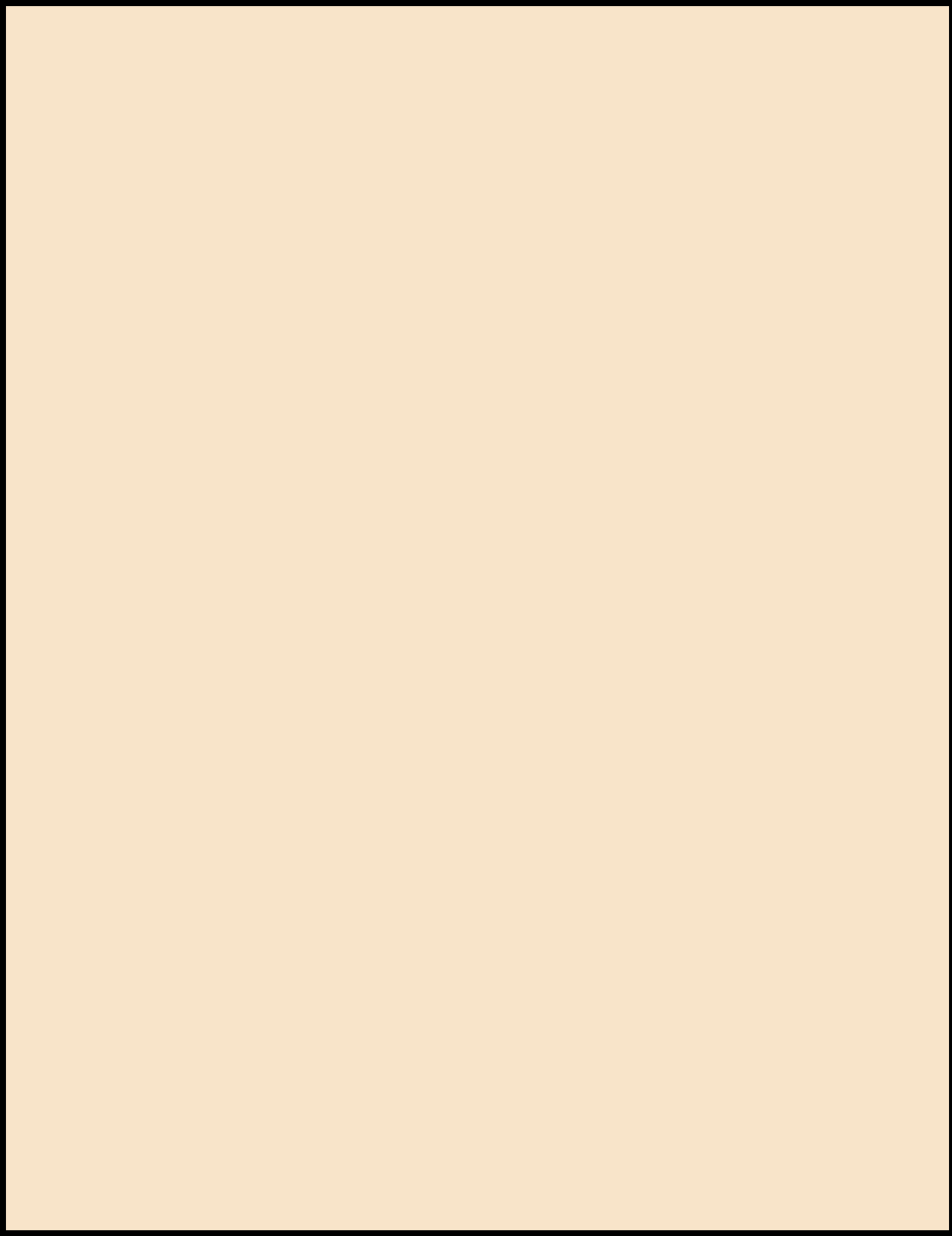
Do you remember when Beulah was a sailor. The most glamorous pin up girl I'll bet the Navy ever had.

Do you remember when Freddie was a lover boy? What a Romeo?

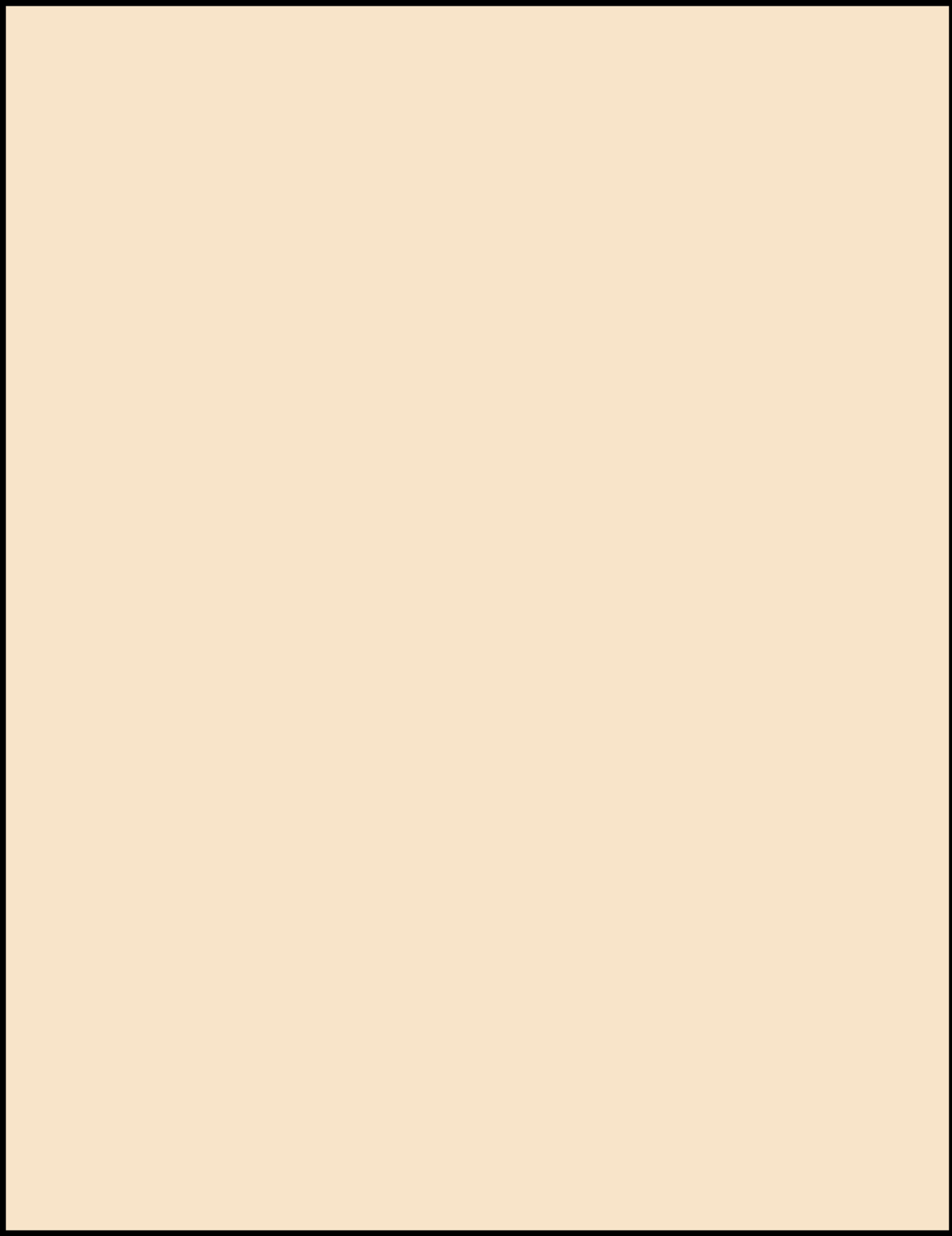

Freshmen Initiation

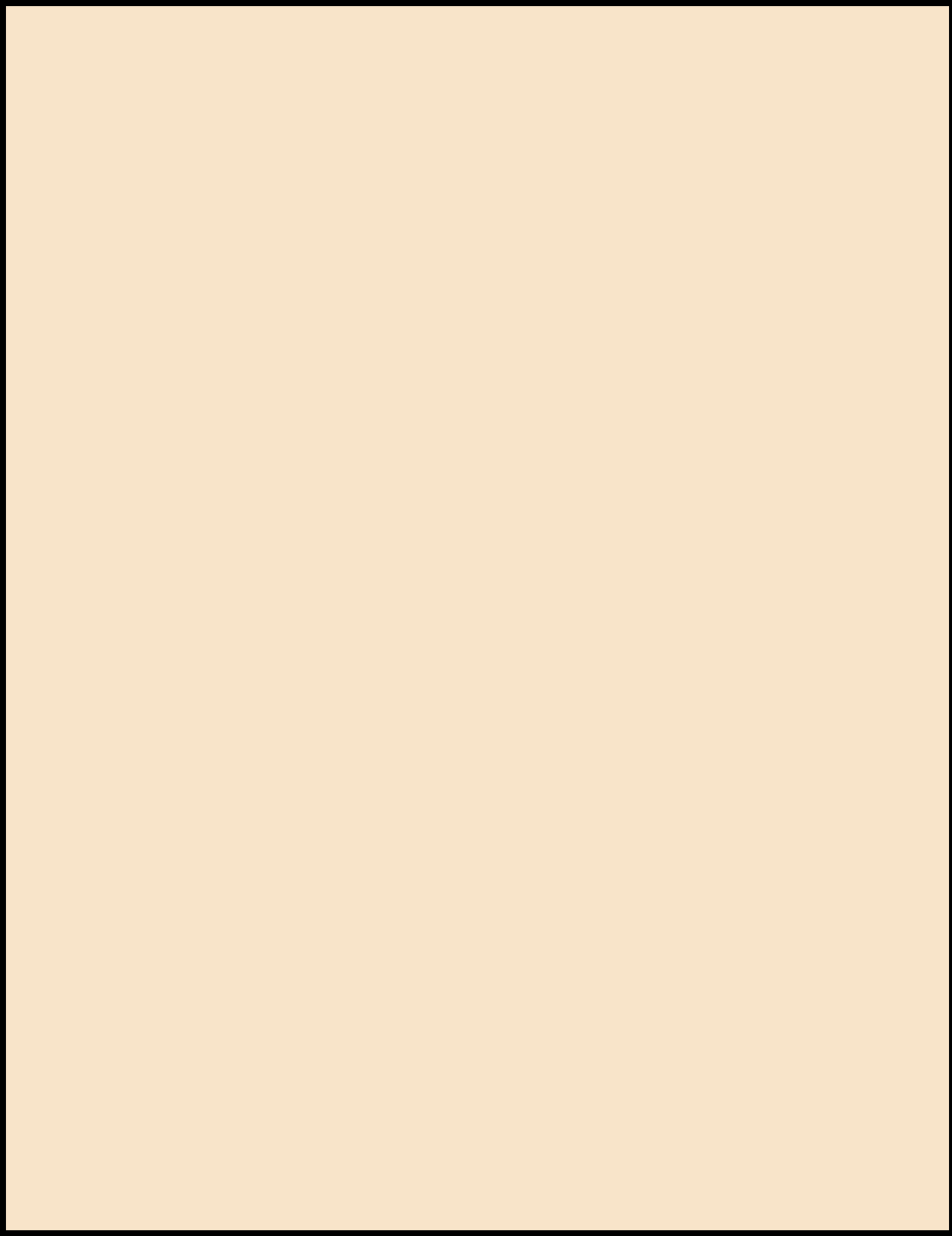

But a good time was had by all.

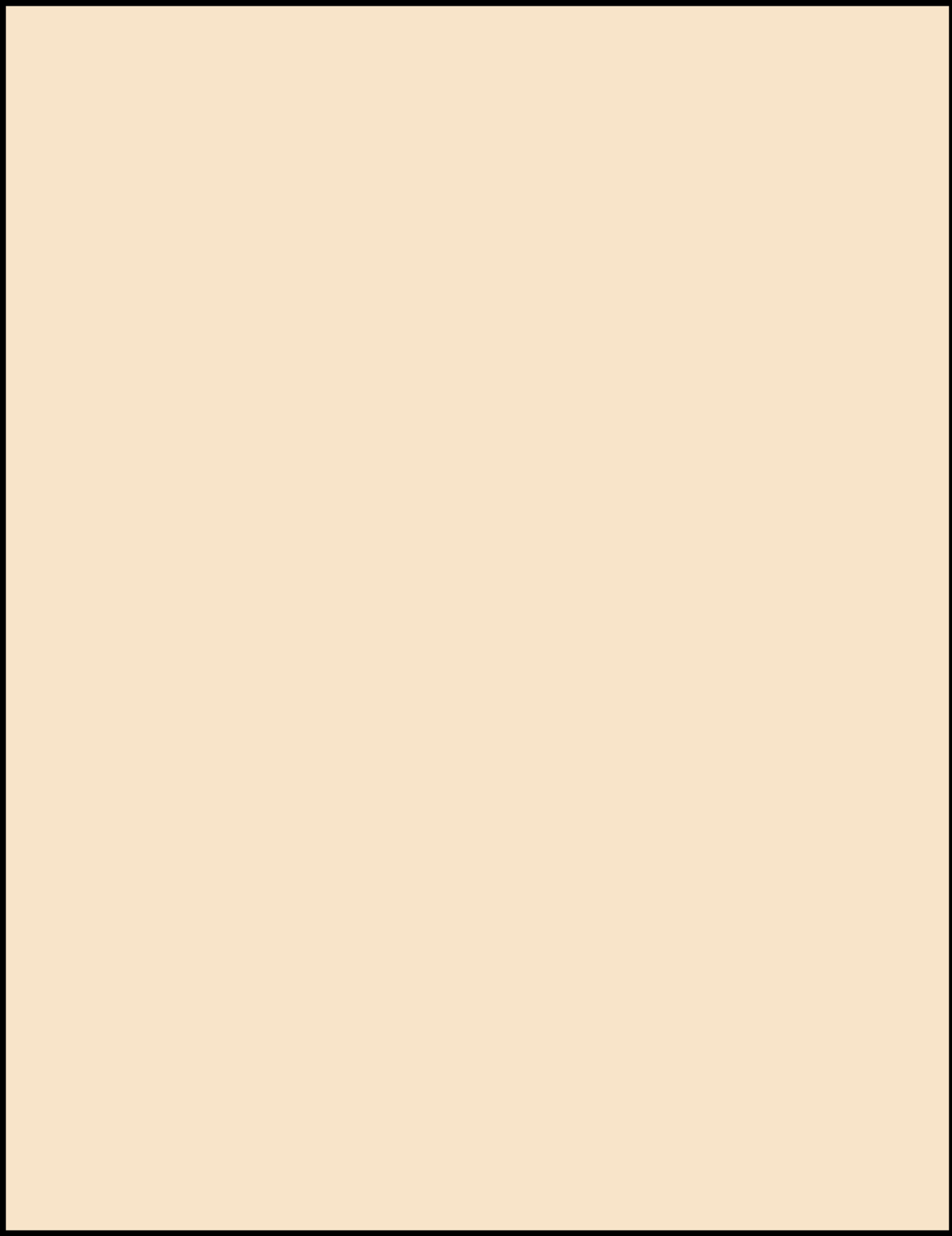
SOPHMORE SKATING PARTY

Couple skates, backward skates, moonlight skates, whistle skates, ladies only, ladies choice, and men only skates, gentlemen's tab were once again enjoyed.

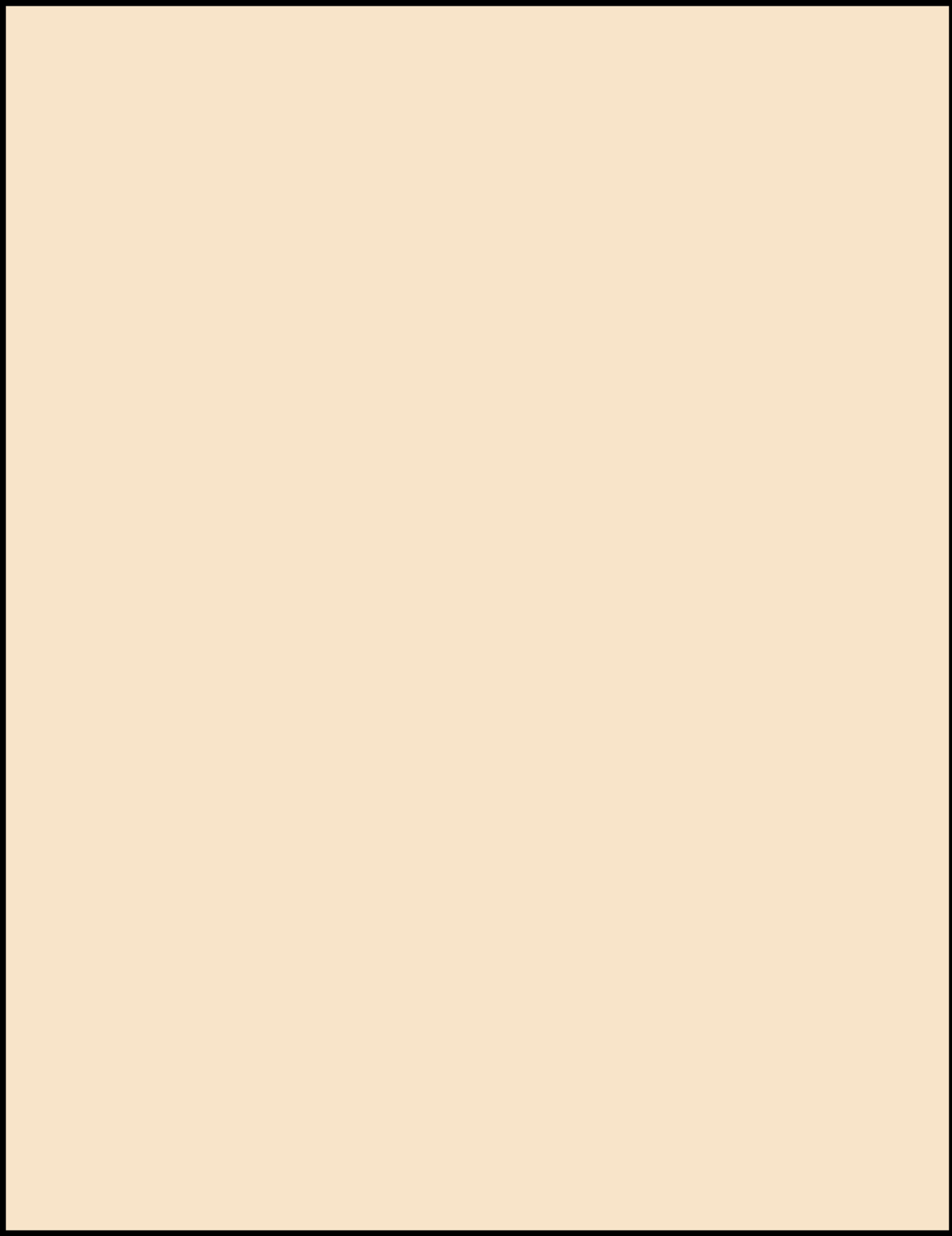
FRESHMAN HAY RIDE

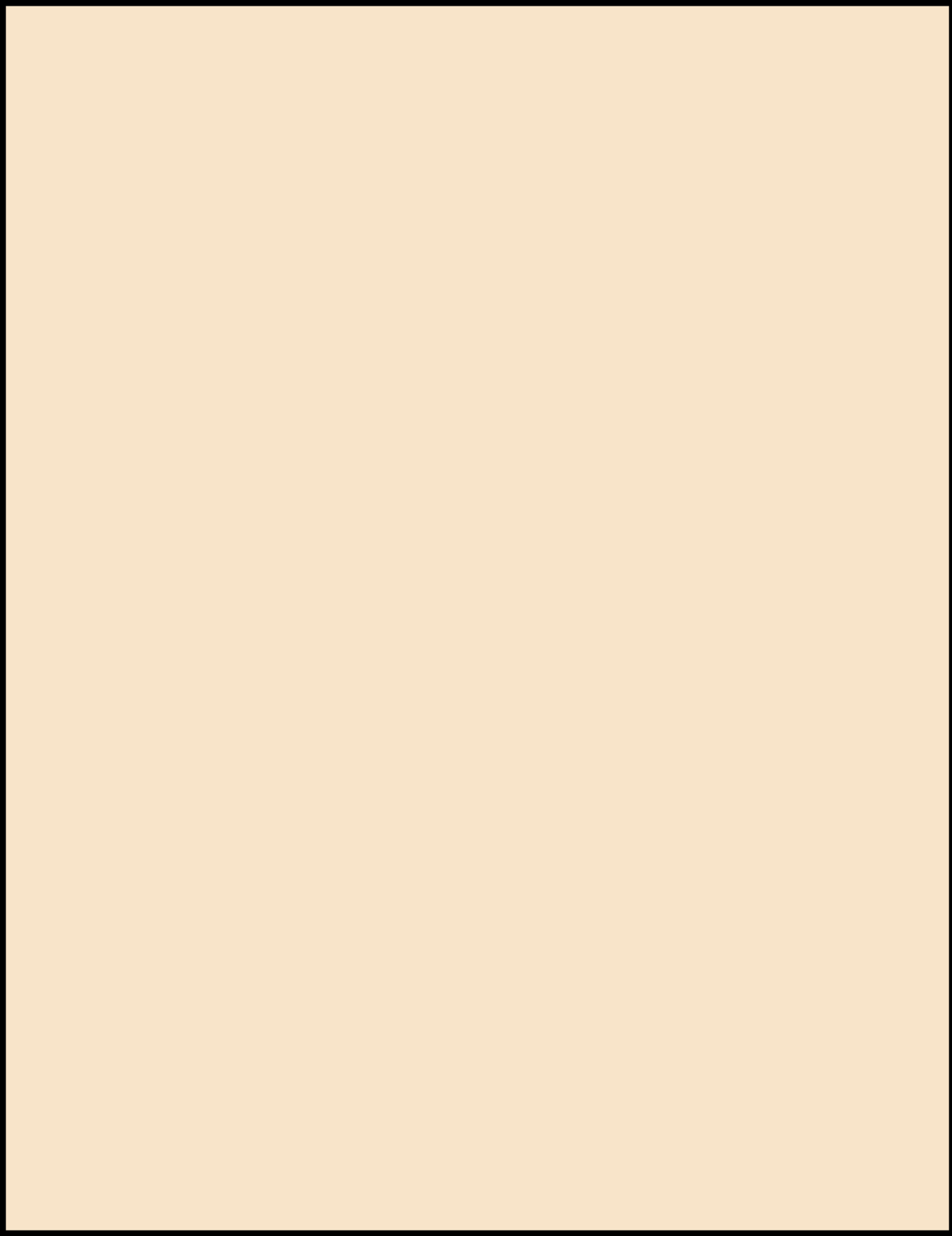

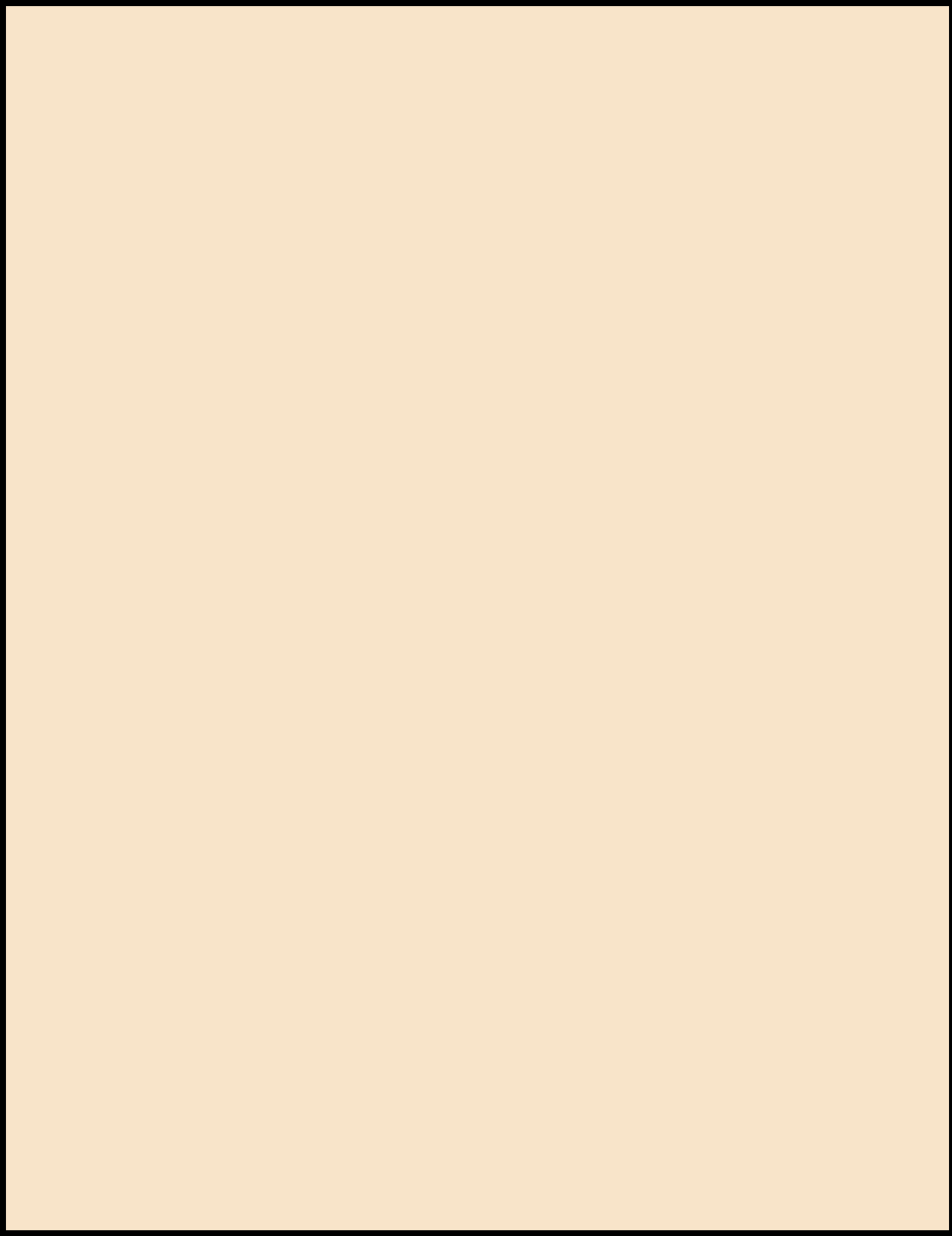

During the last half of the game. The Queen and her attendants sat on the stage and enjoyed the game. After the game was over there was a coronation dance in the High School Gymnasium.

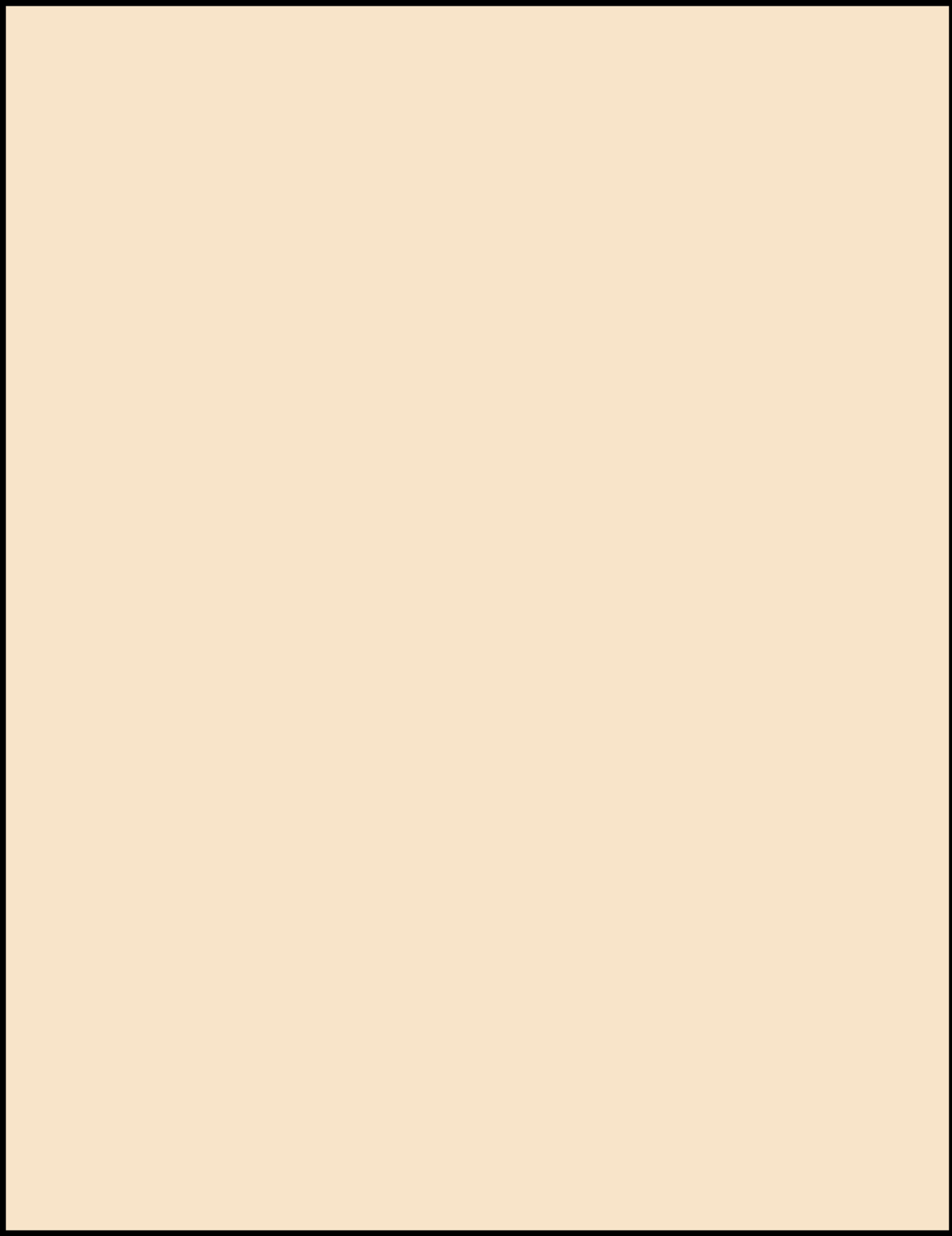

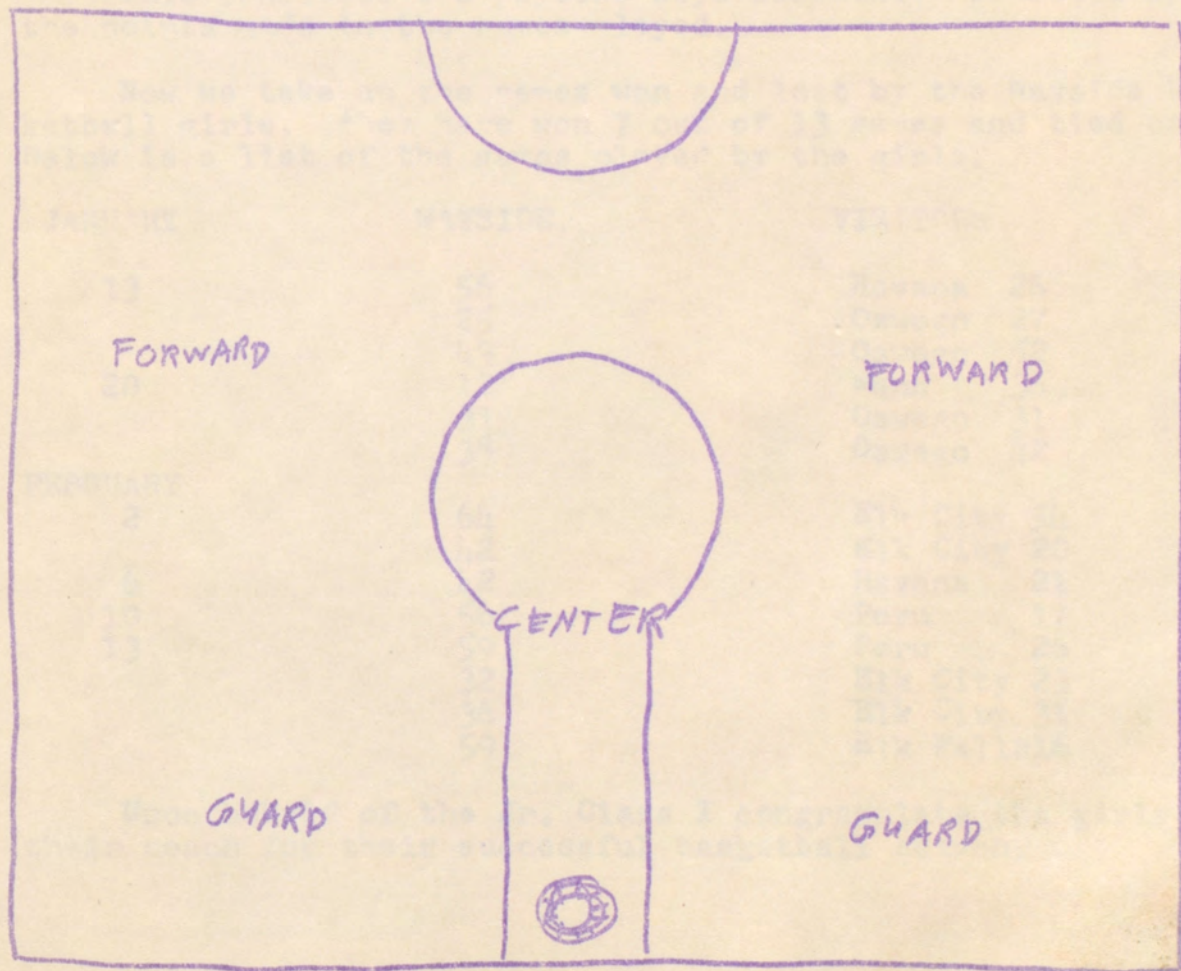
In the first Team basketball Wayside had five outstanding athletes, who held vital positions on the team.

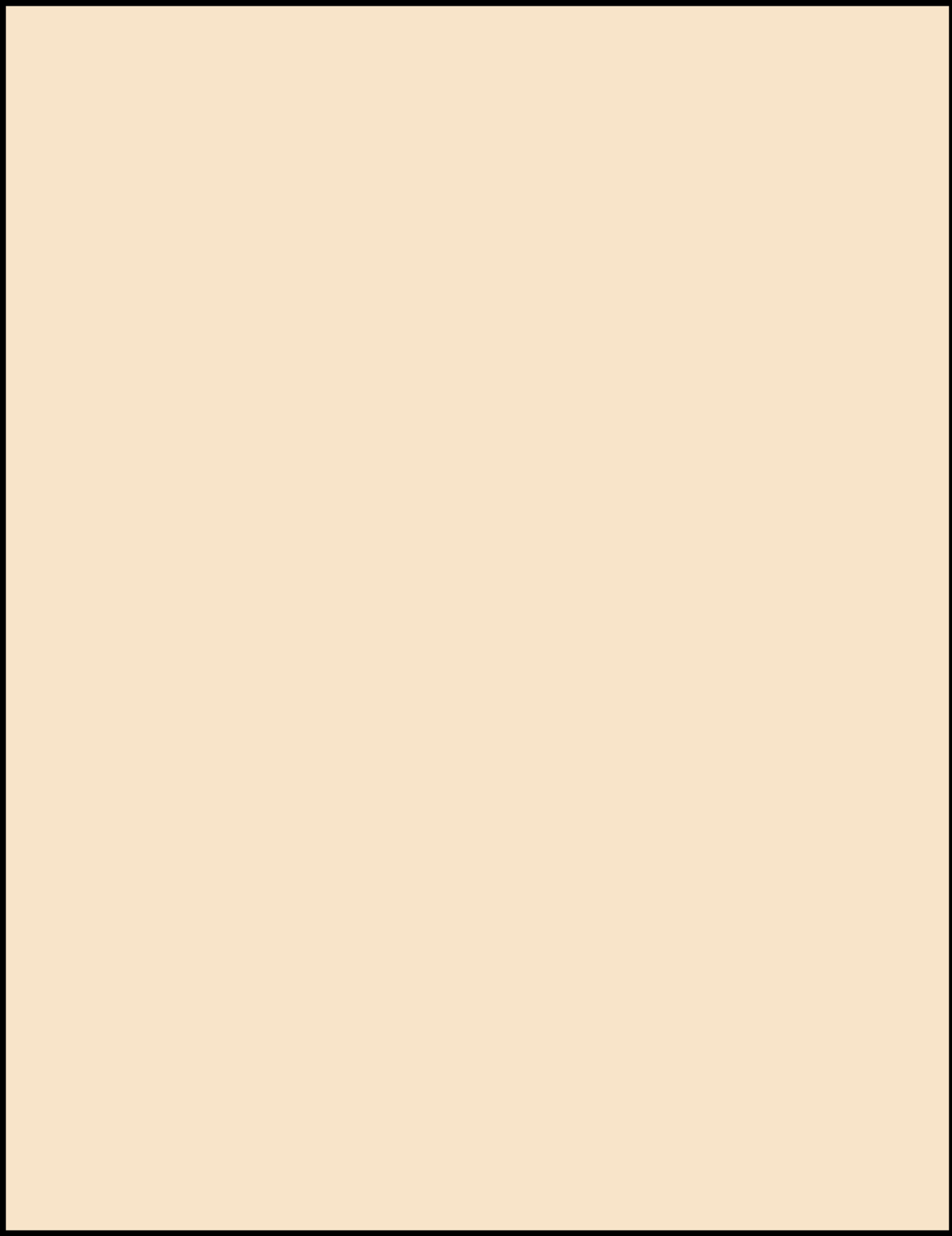
Jim bishop and Marvin Dunham were the Forwards. They showed their great accomplishment in the way which they could cooperate and their physical co-ordination.

A diagram of the basketball court is supplied below so that you may paste the pictures of the players in the respective zone define positions:





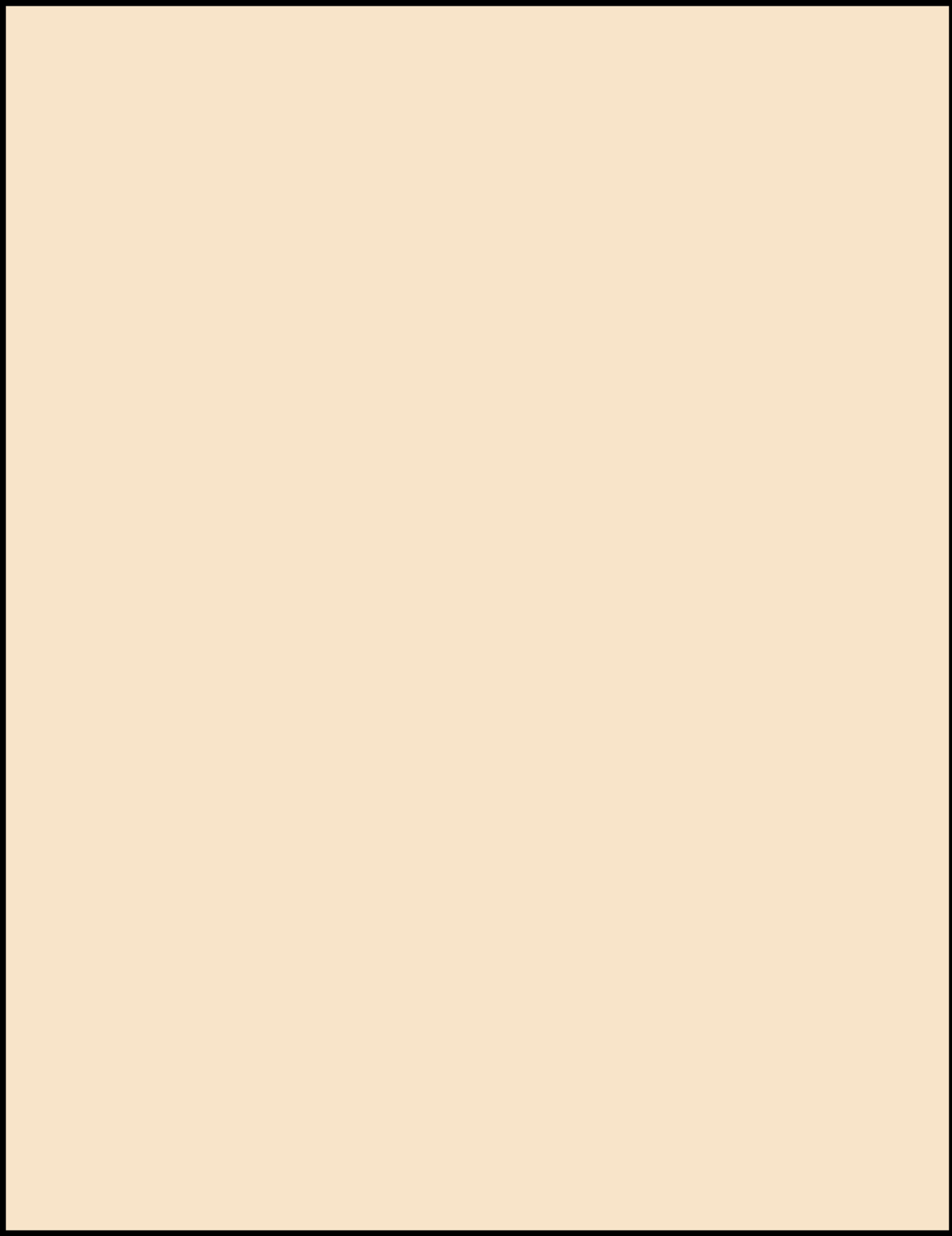

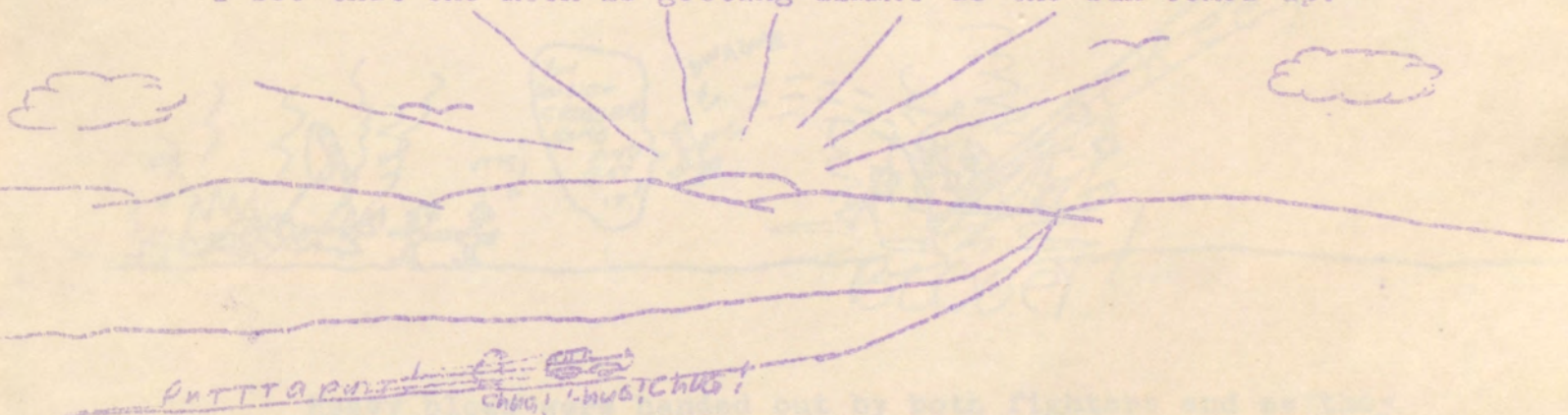
THE MILLER-LESSMAN AFFAIR

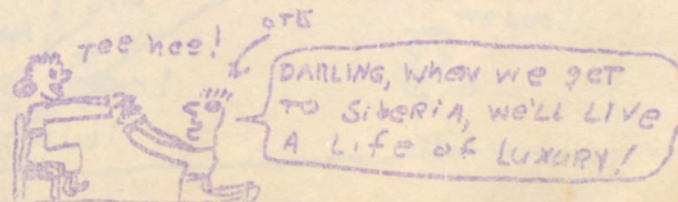

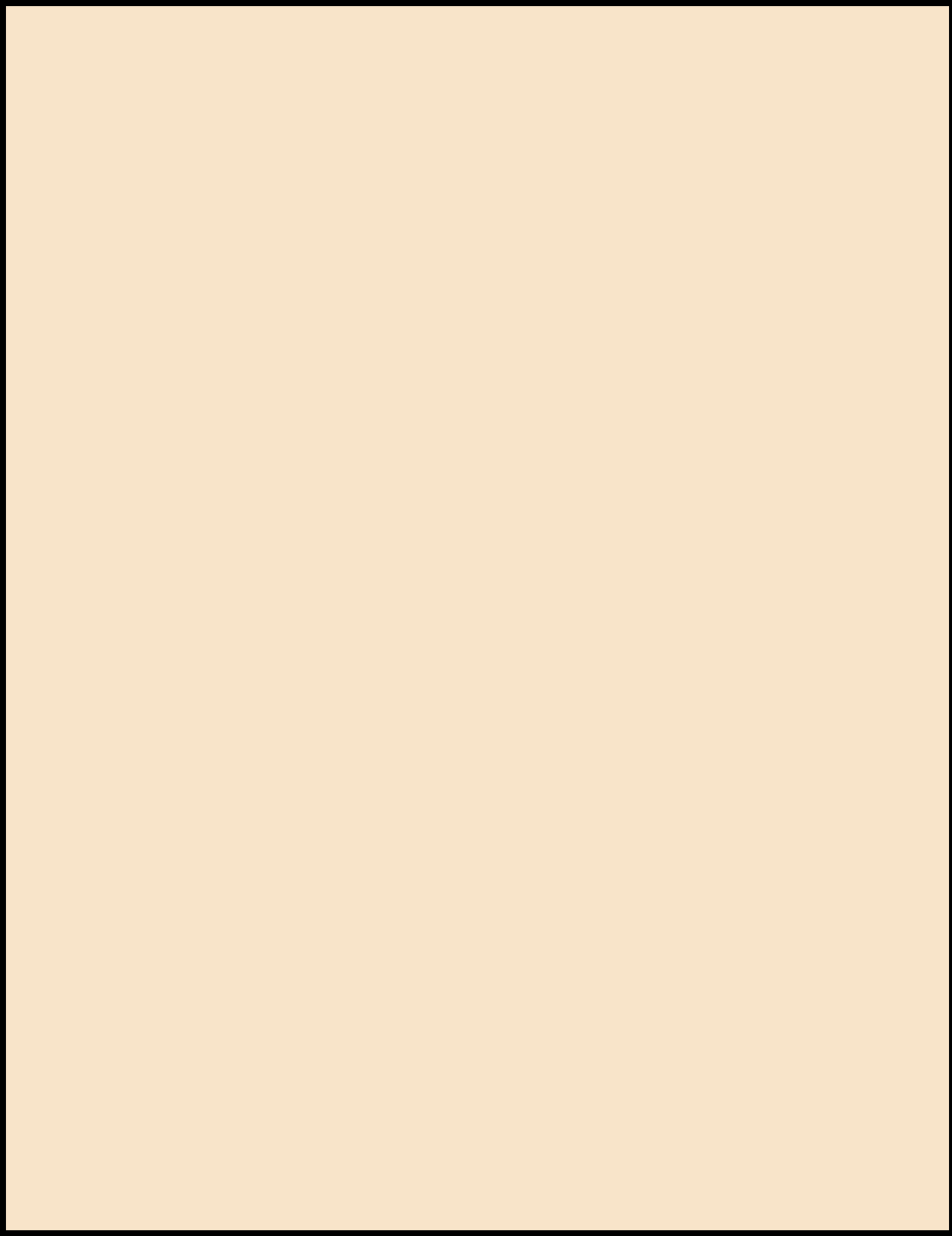

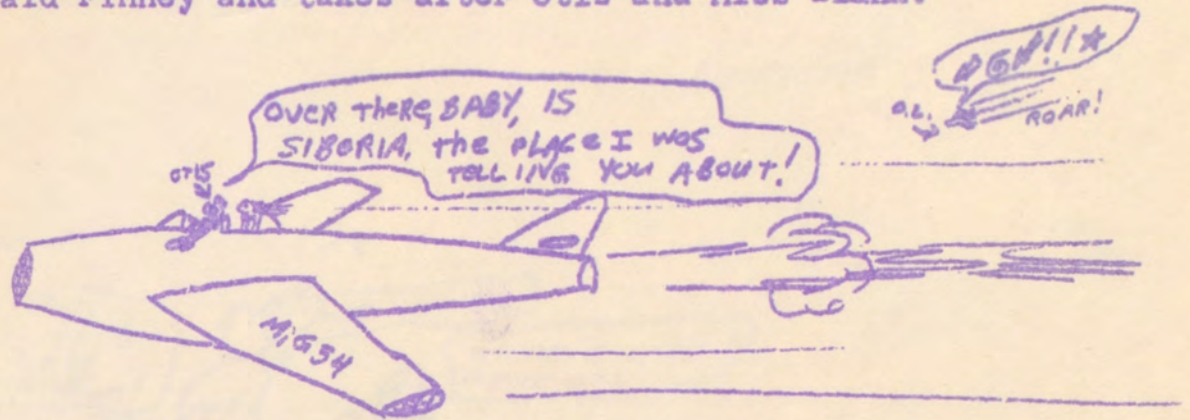

She is finally convinced, and they testily decide to rent a plane to fly off tomorrow.

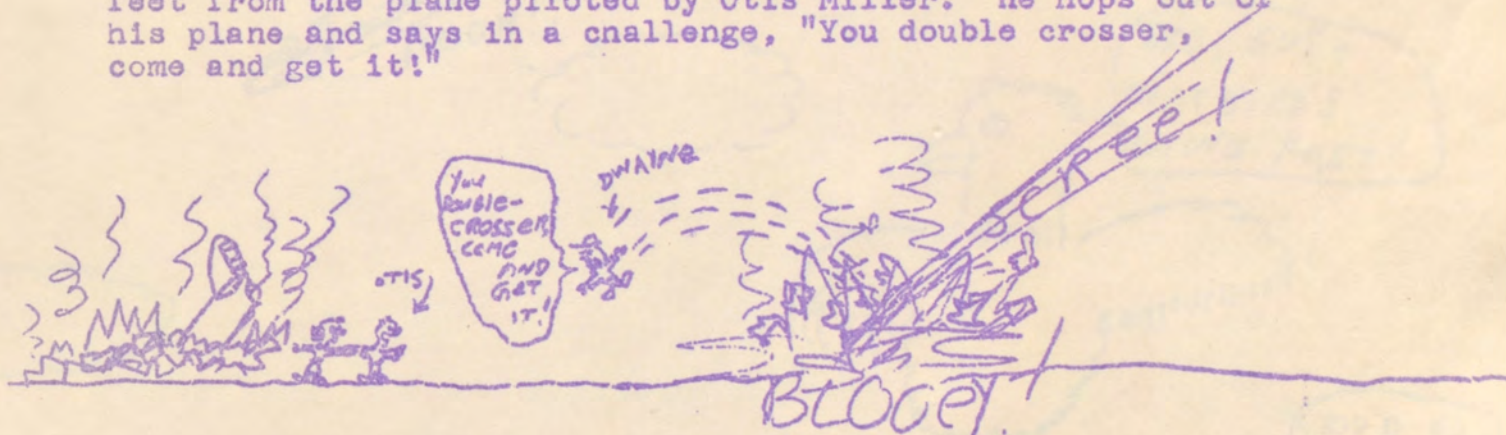

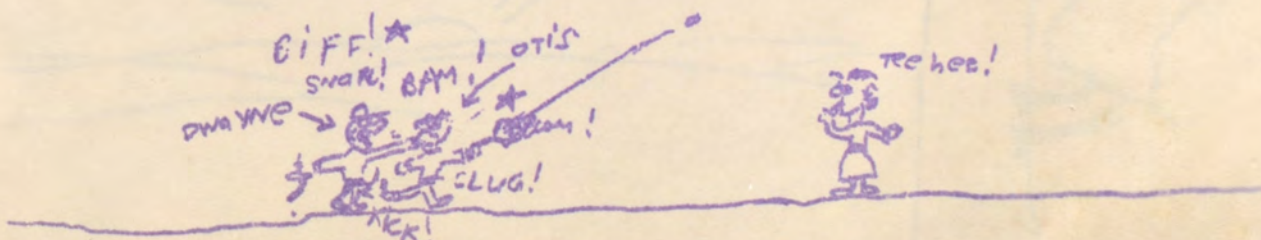
Dwayne and Otis, racing furiously, start shooting at each other. They succeed in using up all their ammunition.

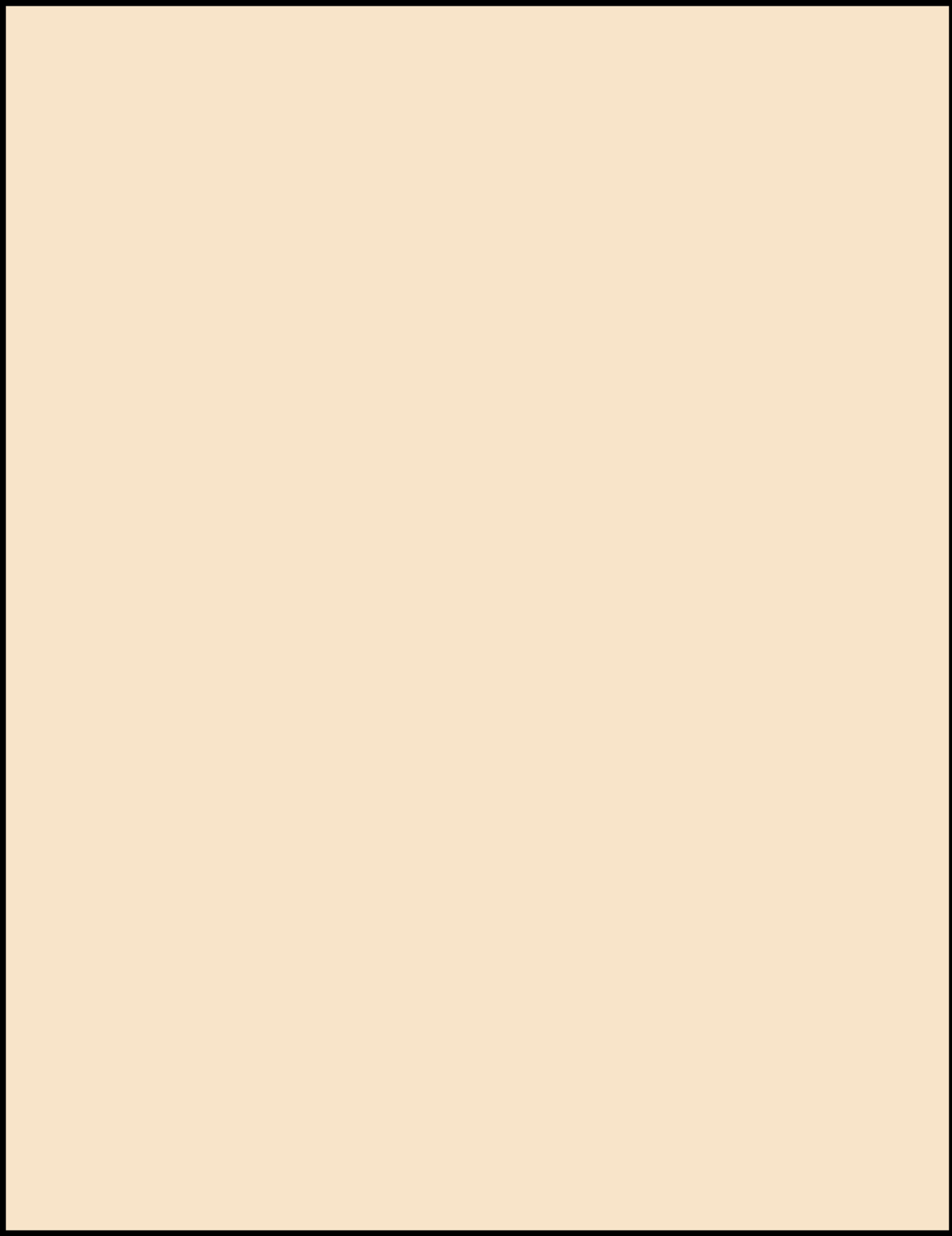

Heavy blows were handed out by both fighters and as they were fighting, they would occasionally hear Miss Blandk laughing.

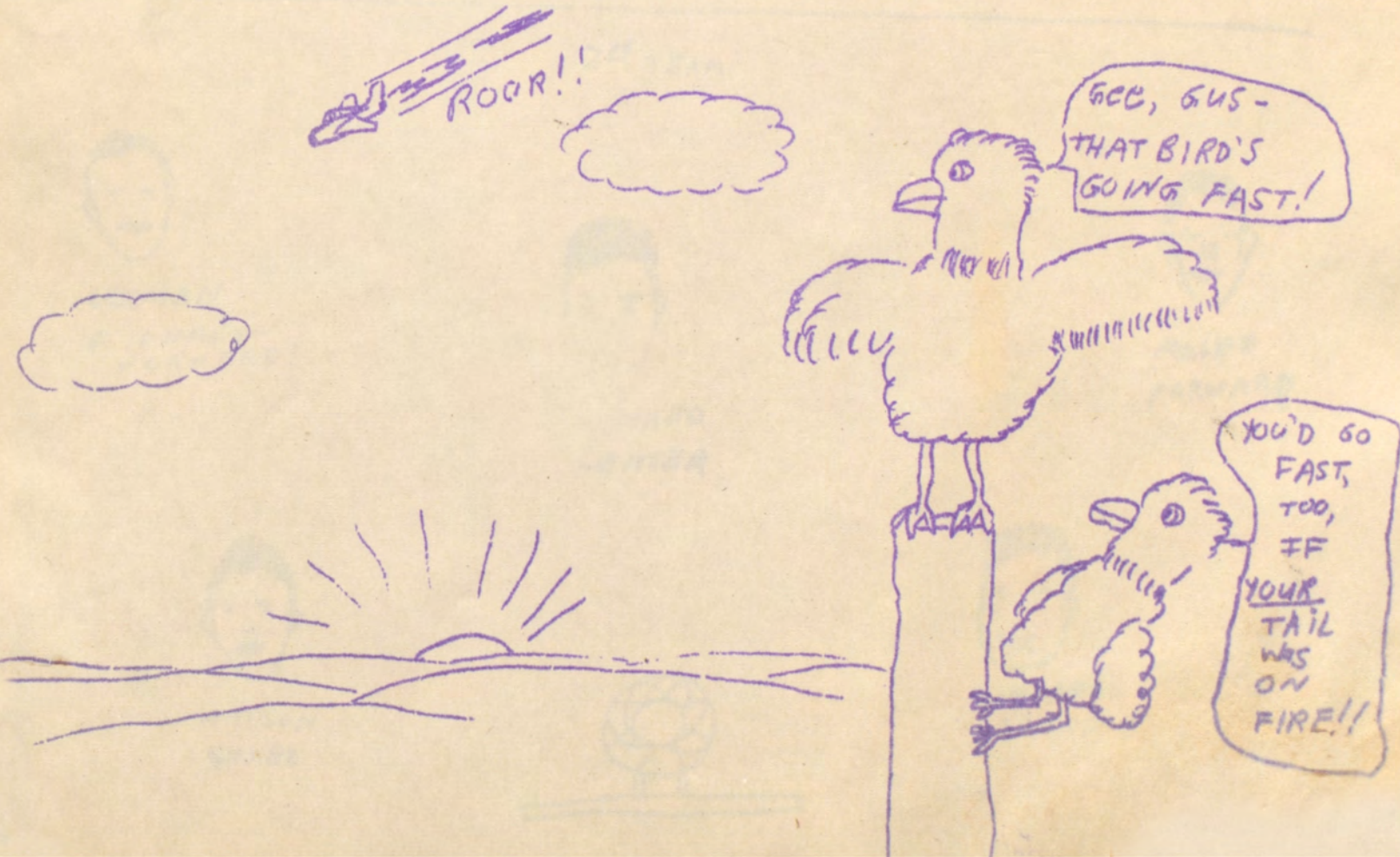


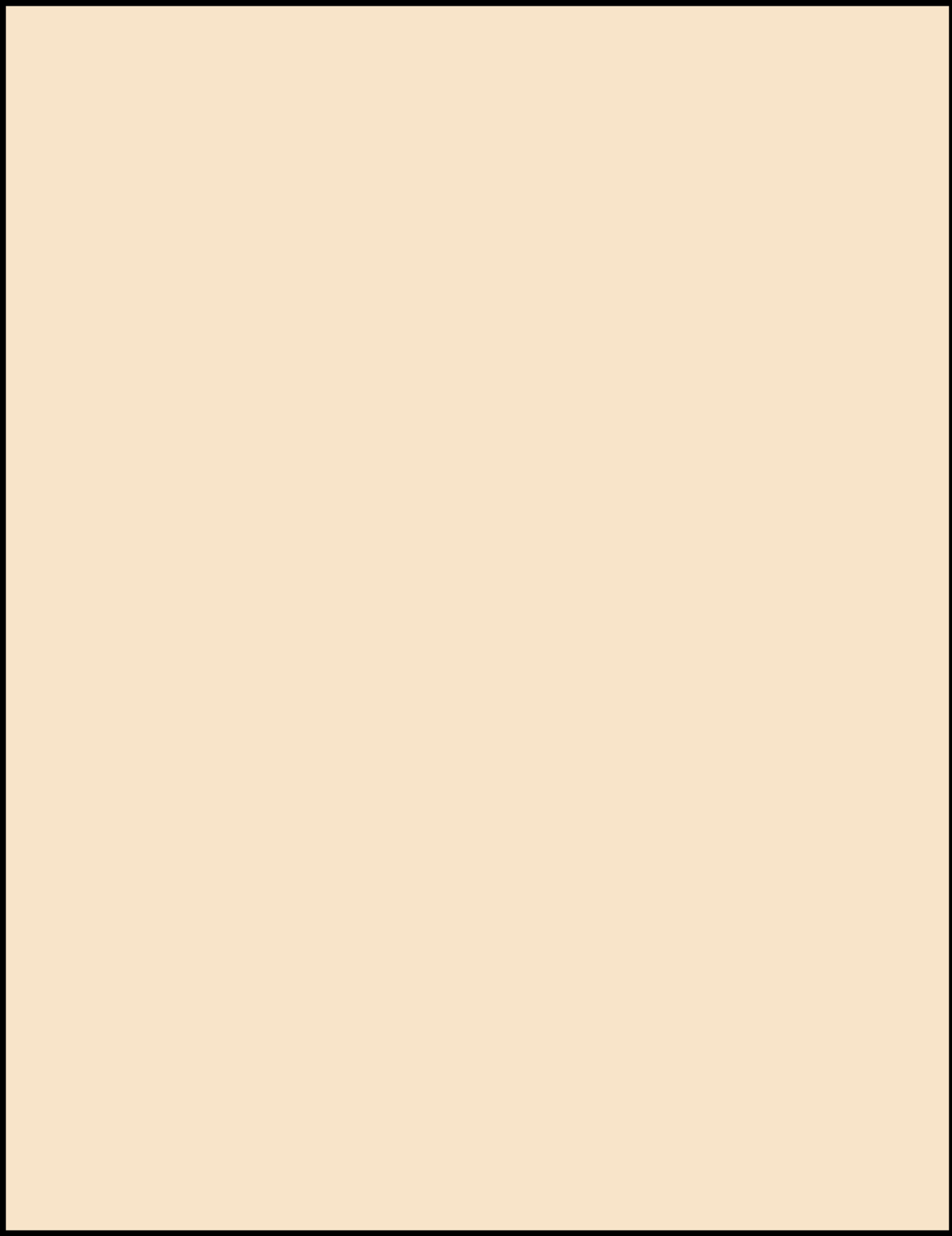


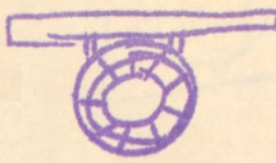
