Dr. Max O. Heim, superintendent of schools, will be leaving the Independence school system after three years service to our educational progress.

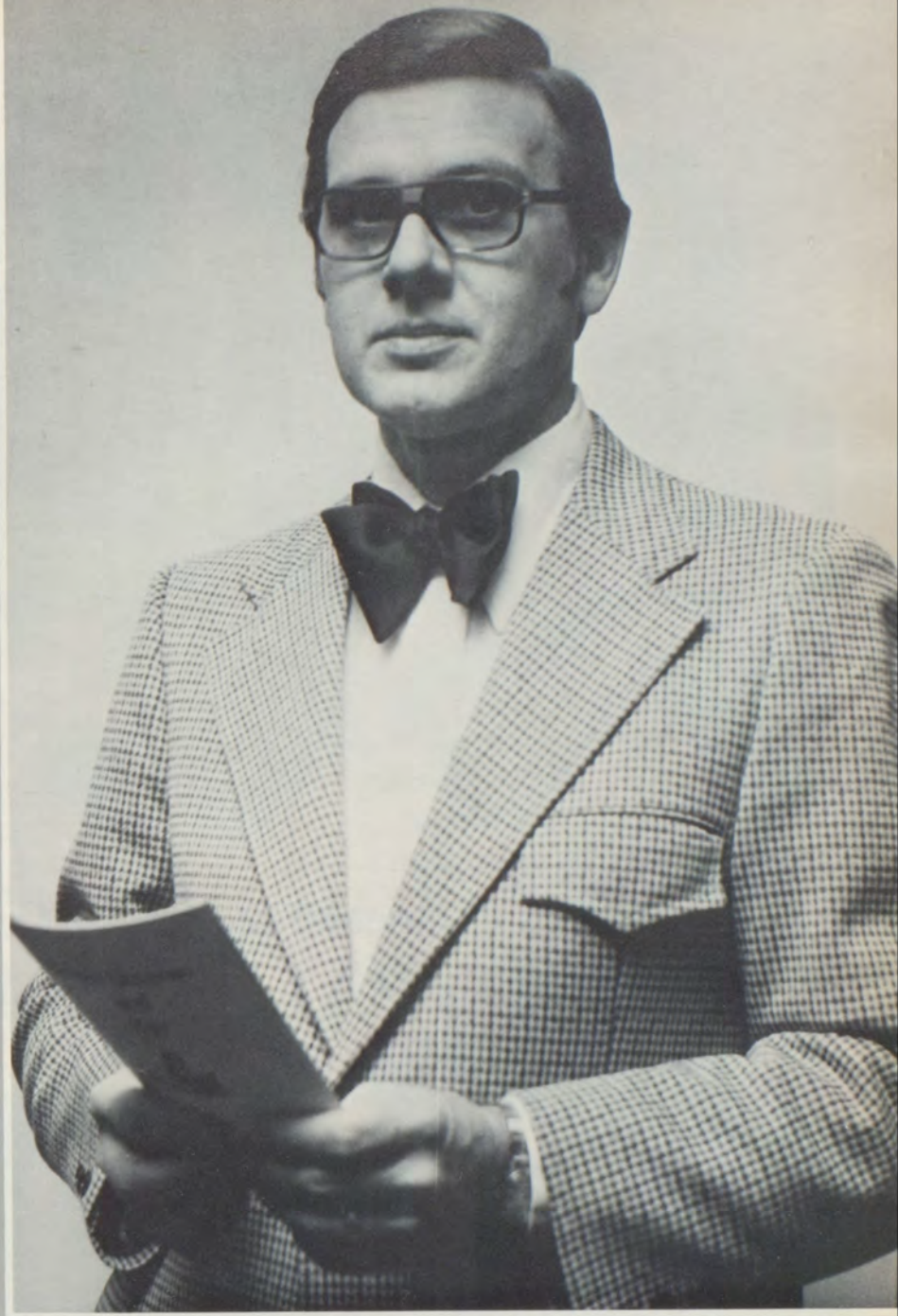
Many accomplishments have been achieved through Dr. Heim's leadership. During his administration, Dr. Heim has brought new ideas and techniques of teaching to Unified School District 446.

Perhaps one of his most important achievements should be attributed to the concept of "humanization in the classroom." In regard to this accomplishment, Dr. Heim "hopes that we've created an attitude to cause everyone involved in the education process to think about themselves ... students, teachers and parents. The most important thing there is for any human being is that he have a positive self image. Hopefully we have caused people to think about the importance of self image."

Another inroad gained during his administration was to establish an attitude of willingness to change, willingness to look at new ideas, and a willingness to work together in the whole area of curriculum development. "I hope we've caused the staff, including the superintendent, to look at the improvement of instruction. I think improvement of instruction is really what it's all about."

When asked what he wished could have been accomplished, Dr. Heim replied: "We have not begun to really get with it in terms of the whole area of improvement of instruction, staff development, humanization of the classroom. It's a very slow process and if it's going to be effective the people must be involved. You must involve people in what is going to happen. So we've not done as much as I had hoped that we could do, but that's just simply because of the whole process that it takes to move things."

Dr. Heim feels strongly about the role today's school plays in society. "The school is playing a larger role than it has in prior years and that's why I say that things like the importance of self concept are so important. Every little kid, and every big kid ought to feel good about himself. We ought to make every student aware of the fact that he has some kind of contribution to make to society, regardless of

where he comes from or what he does, or what he's going to do. Education must prepare people to live in a changing climate, to be able to adapt to change, to make people flexible."

During the past three years many improvements have surfaced at Independence High School with the approval of Dr. Heim. The most important ones to the high school student are the addition of both girls' and boys' athletic pro-

grams and the mini course concept.

The Independence school system will miss the enthusiasm of such an administrator as Dr. Max O. Heim. Through his efforts, with the cooperation of many others, he has brought many new ideas and philosophies to Independence. He has greatly benefited the patrons of U.S.D. 446 these past three years and his educational eagerness will be truly missed.

As always the business courses remain popular classes with students. The rhythm of typewriter keys can be heard through the halls any time of day. Dictation and Shorthand are also recommended business practices.

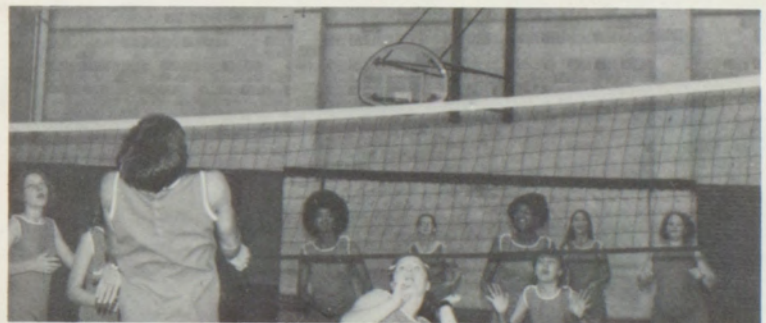




PHYSICAL EDUCATION

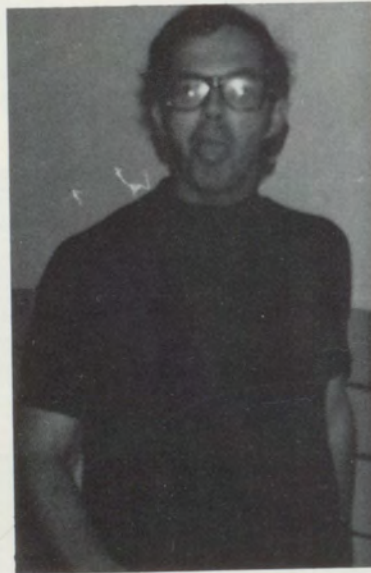


WITH MANY PROJECTS
