So, all hail the chief, Dr. Leonard Steinle.

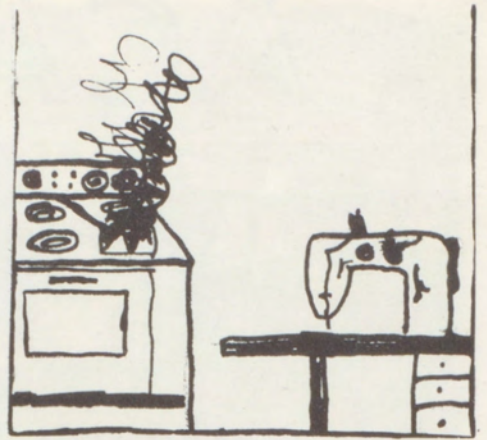

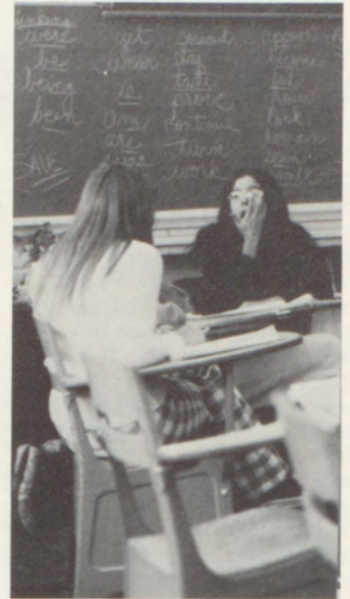


Special Study

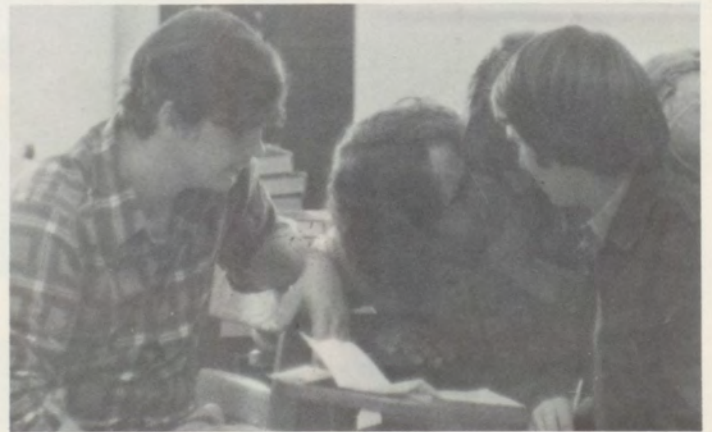

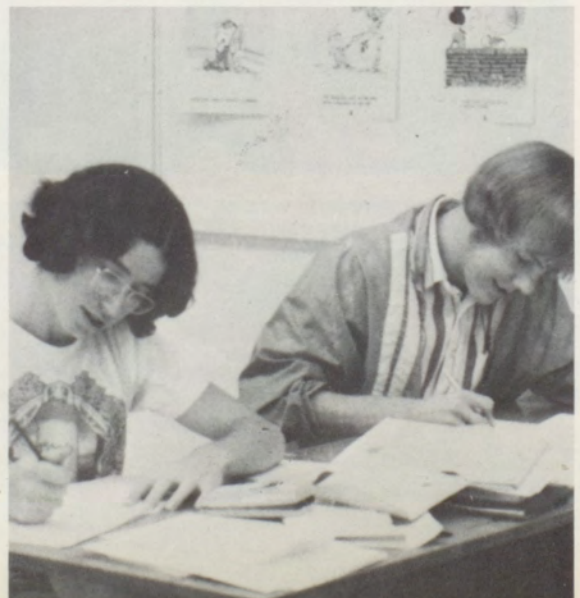


Clericals Limber Up Fingers

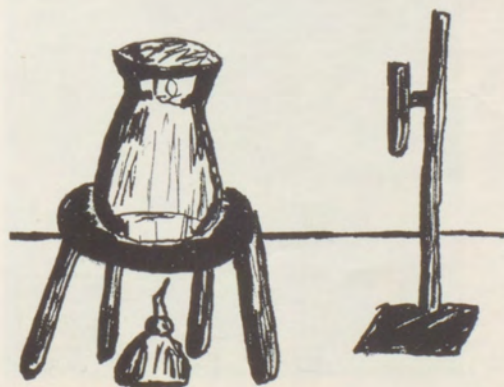


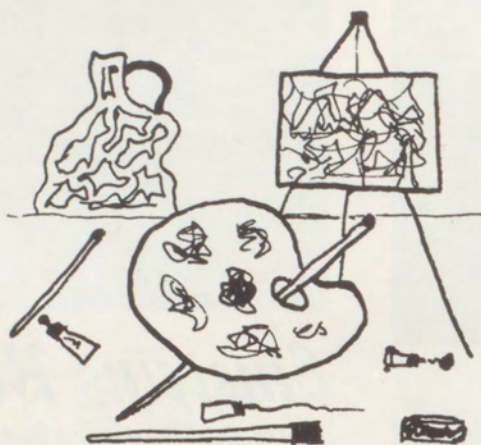
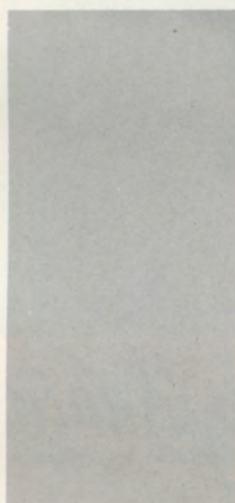
Einsteins Born Again

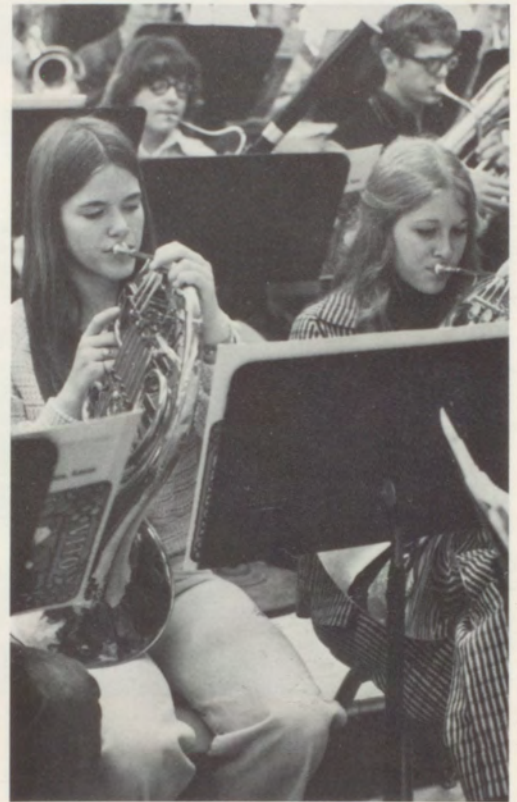
Future Industrialists Work With Materials And Processes

He likes to meet students, talk with them and help with any problems which may come up. He's always glad to lend a helping hand and continually compliments the students on their work.

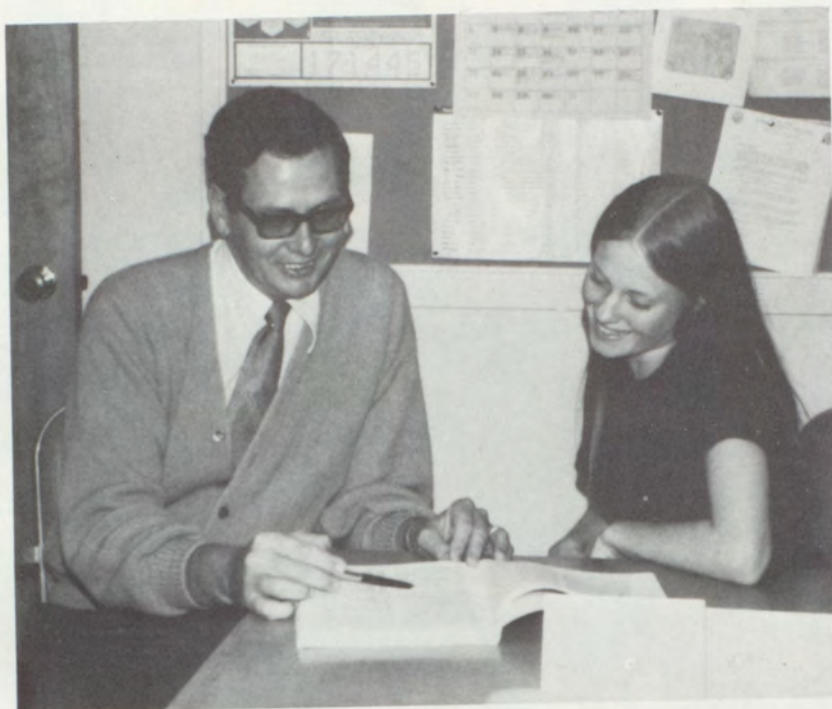


Administration

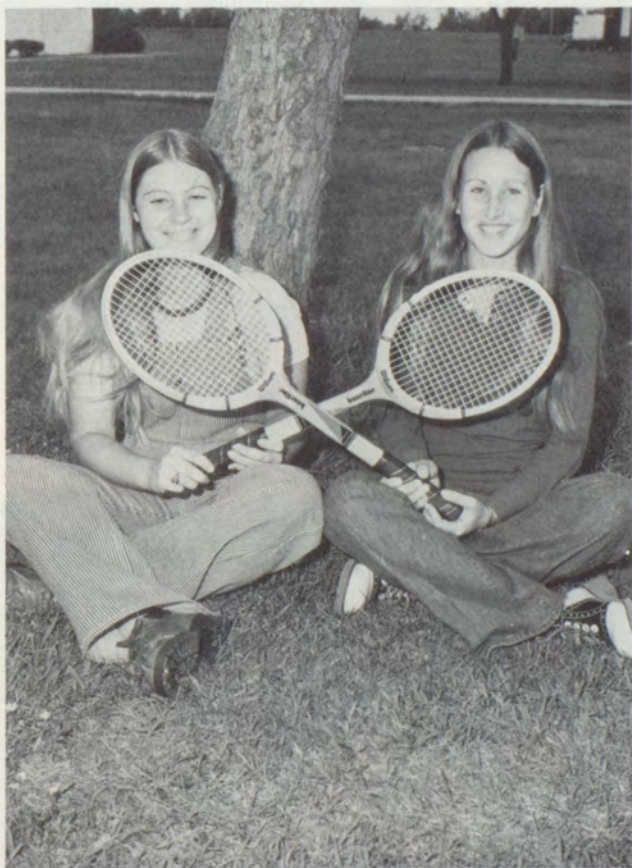


Tennis provides beauty and talent on the court

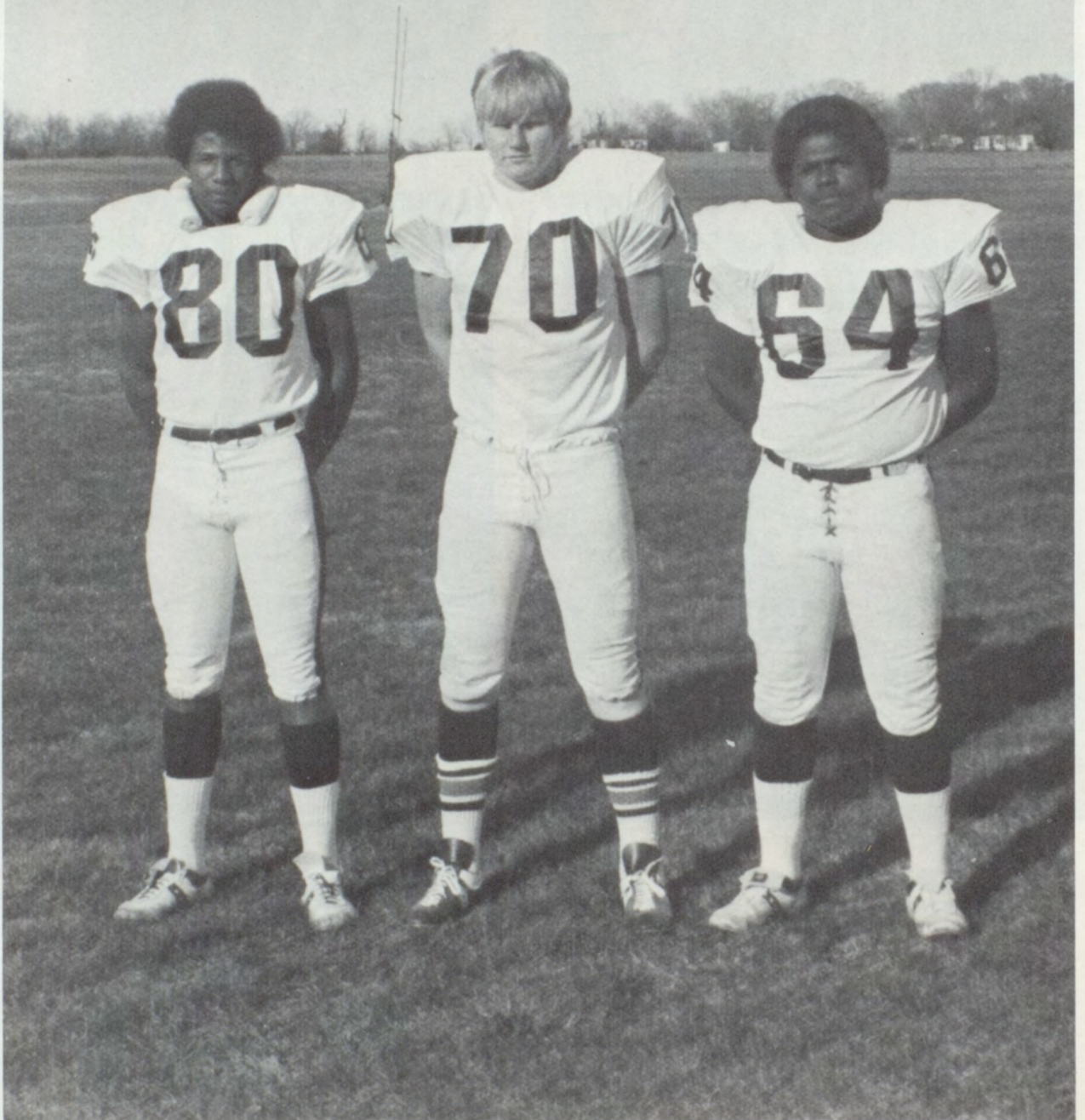

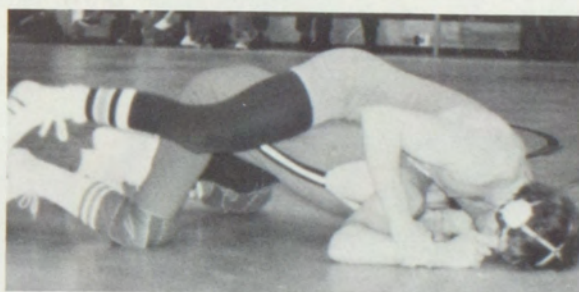

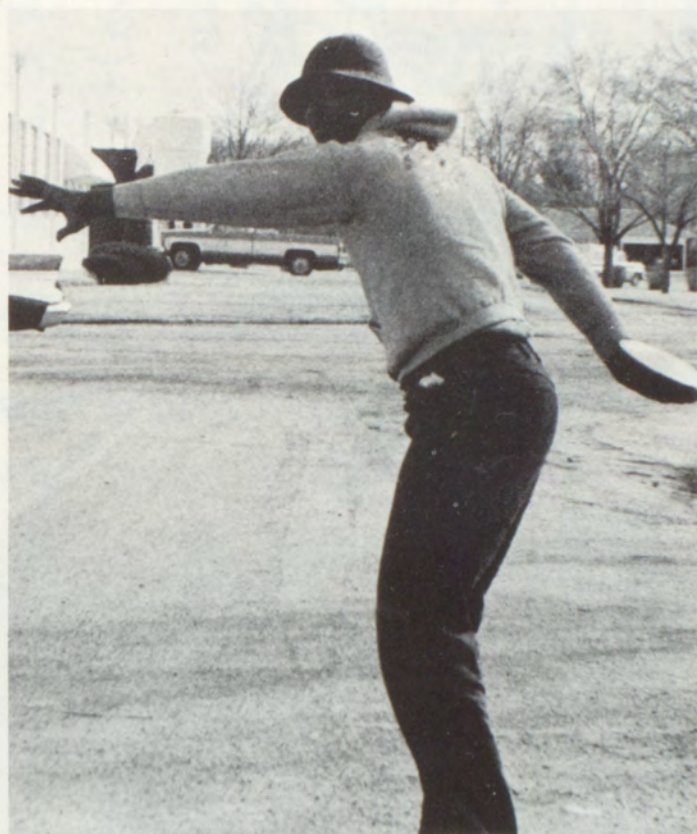

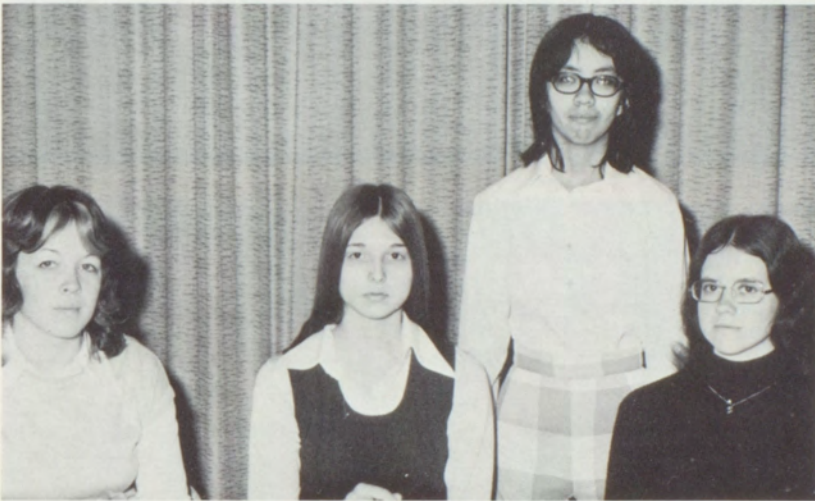
