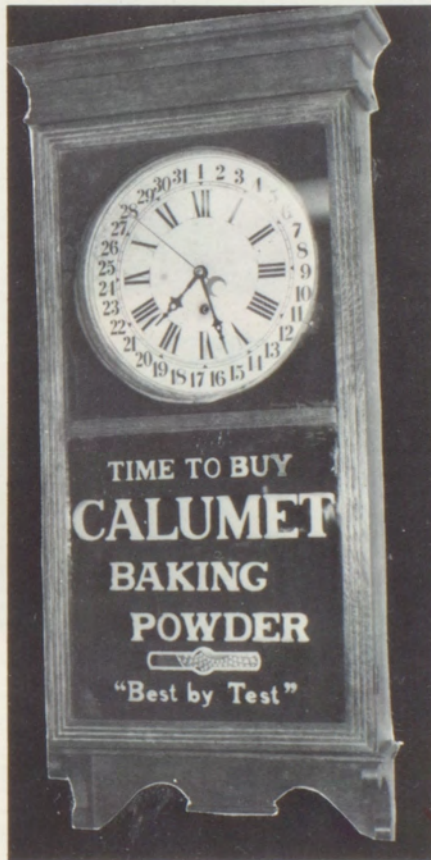
This year Shirlene Turner joined the staff along with Linda Johnson. These teachers help give the students a helping hand.

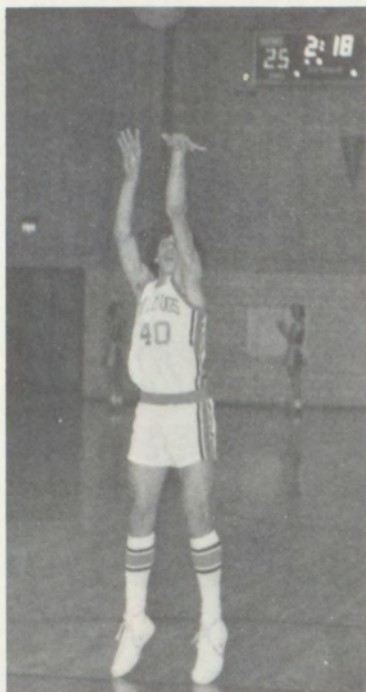

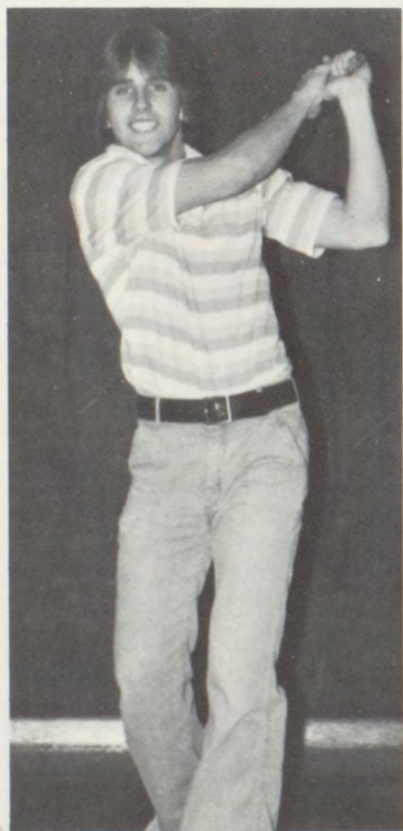

Along with last years returning letterwomen, Lona Reeves and Janelle Wallace, the team hopes to have a successful year.

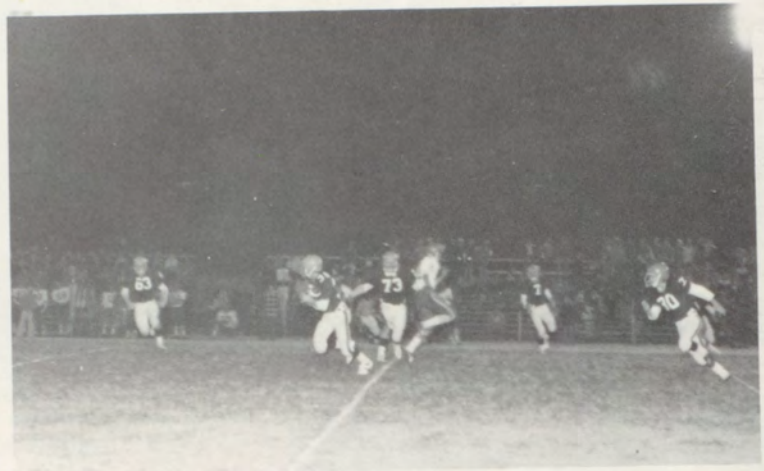
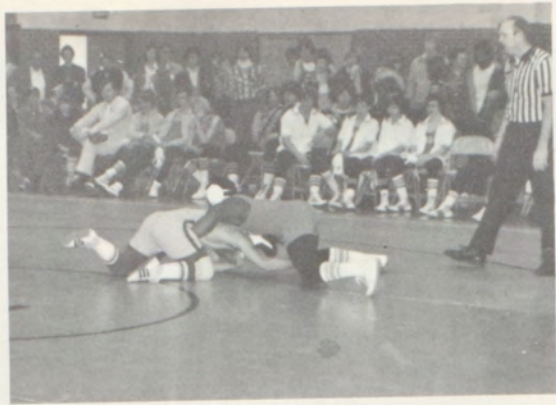

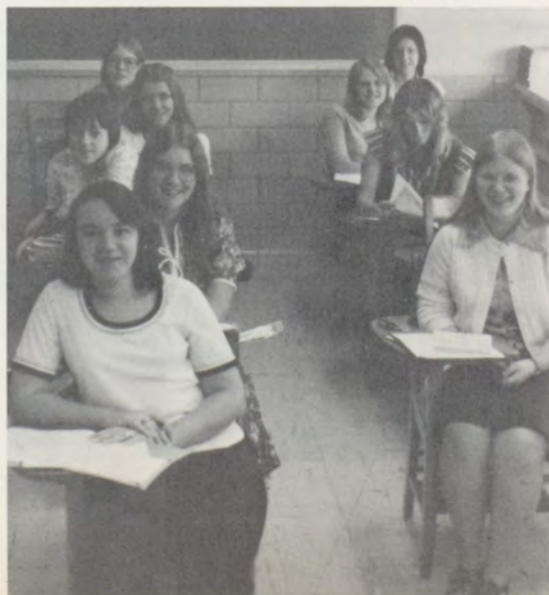
Debate Provides Experiences Worth Remembering

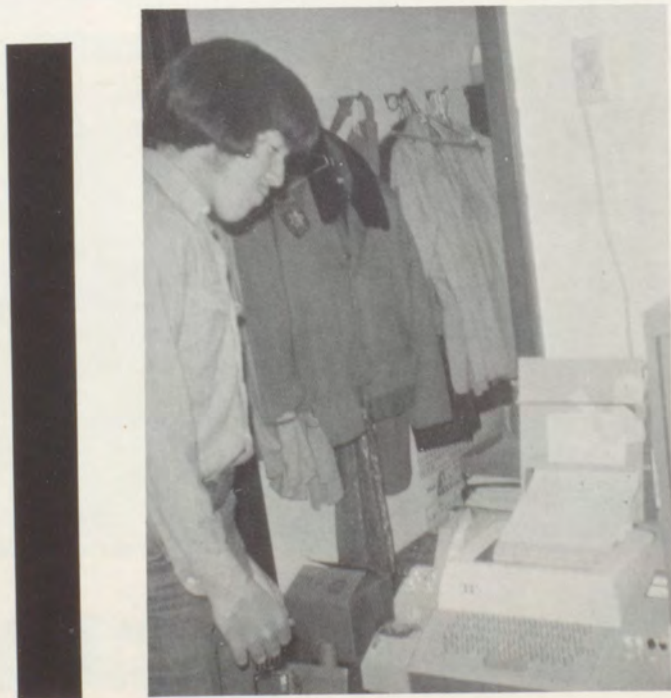


Passing one by one

Our school district has been successful in providing an "awareness" program for many students of IHS. The Alternative Education program, under the direction of Mr. Larry Murdock, was instituted to provide students on-the-job experience in becoming aware of the duties in their area of professional or occupational choice. Over 120 students were placed in 28 agencies in our community. No salary was received by any of the students, and all were placed on a volunteer basis. The idea prompting the installation of the program into the curriculum of IHS was to allow the students to participate in a job area, not as a potential employee, but as a participant in activities that range from remedial chores to observing and aiding in tasks that require much extensive training. The participating agencies are asked to use the student in the same manner that regular employees are asked to conduct themselves, with the same rules and regulations used to govern their conduct. It is hoped that the students will be an asset to the employers during the year, and that the students will gain from the association with the employer and the job. The student can be valuable to the agency, and the agency can be of great value to the student. This is a reason for the great success the program has enjoyed. Another reason for success is the agencies participating in the program. The agencies include Mercy Hospital, USD 446, Sheriff's office, ARCO, Independence Nursing Homes, and agencies too numerous to list here.
