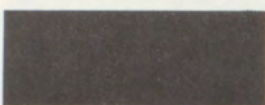
FELLOWSHIP OF CHRISTIAN ATHLETES KEEPS OTHERS IN MIND

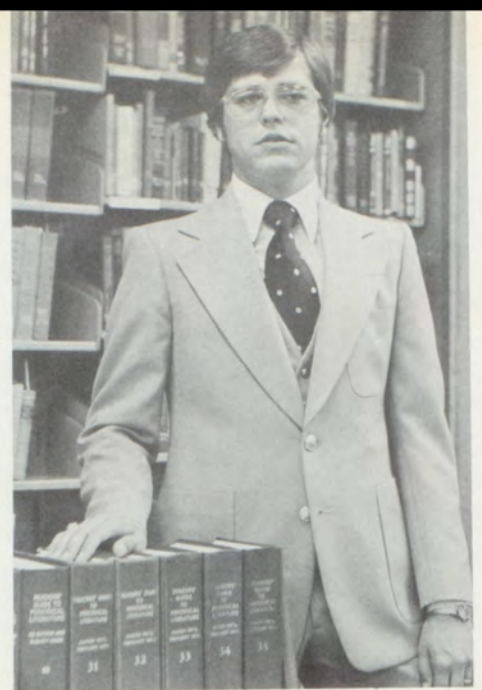

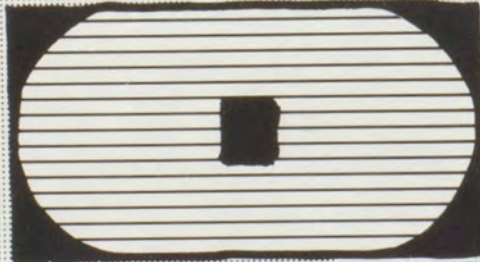

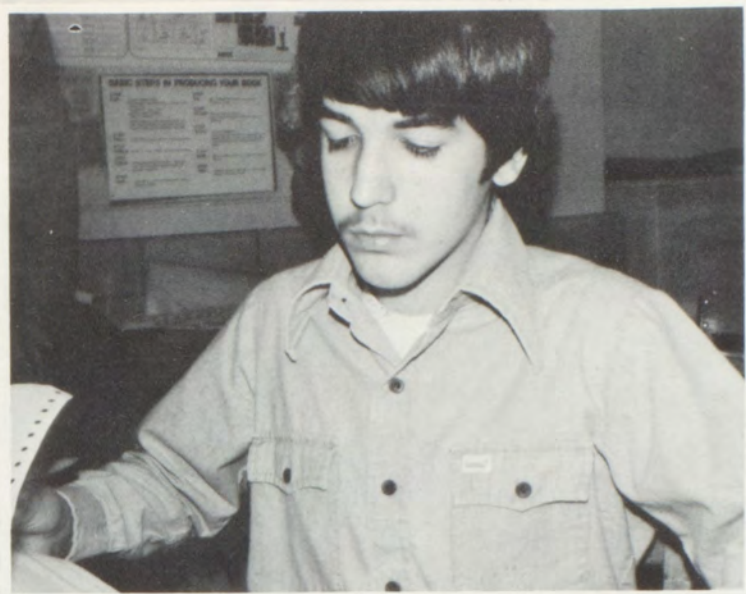

Nikes explores business careers

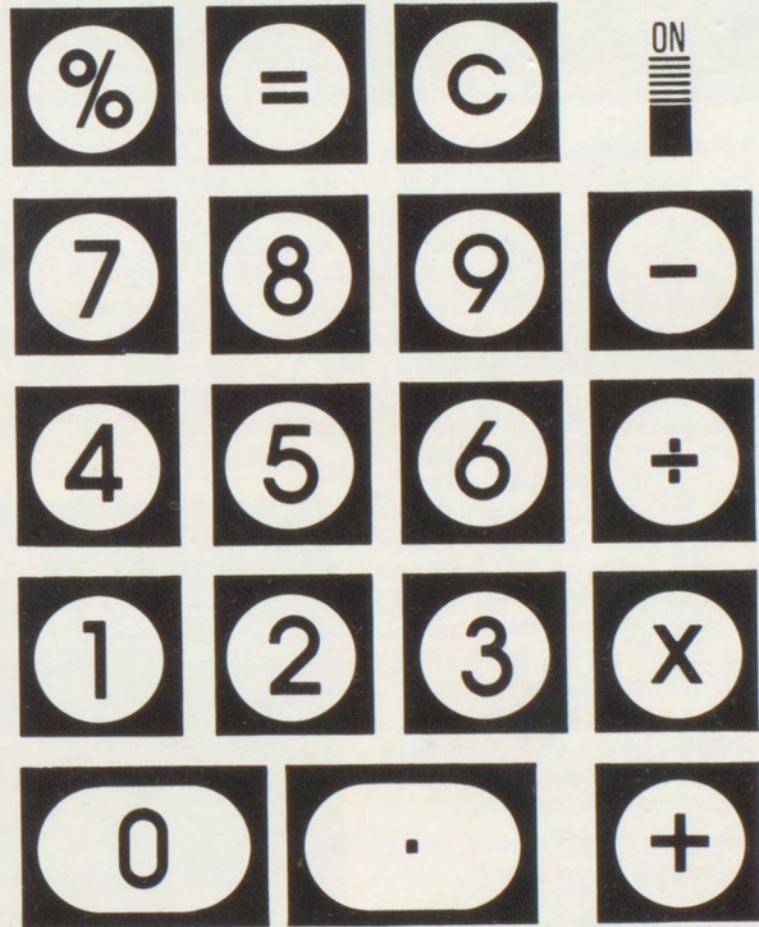

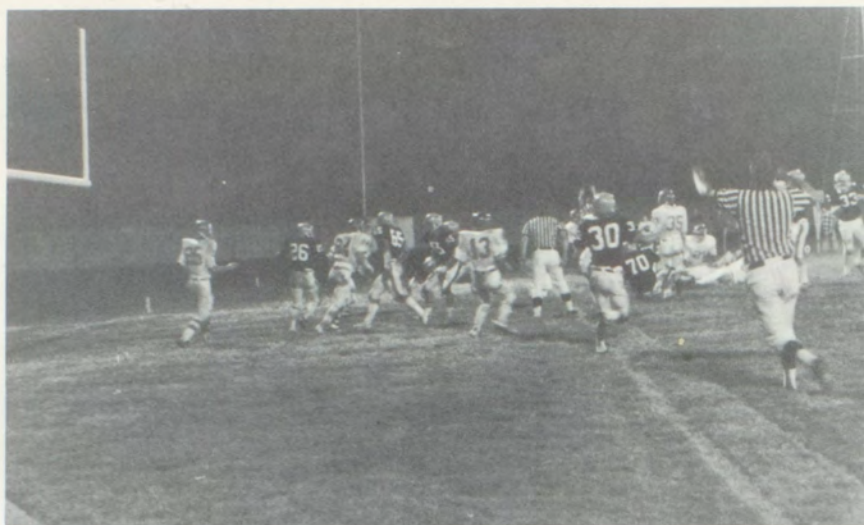

The junior varsity squad also had a good season, compiling a 6-2 record. The jayvee defense allowed only 47 points all season, and recorded three consecutive shutouts.





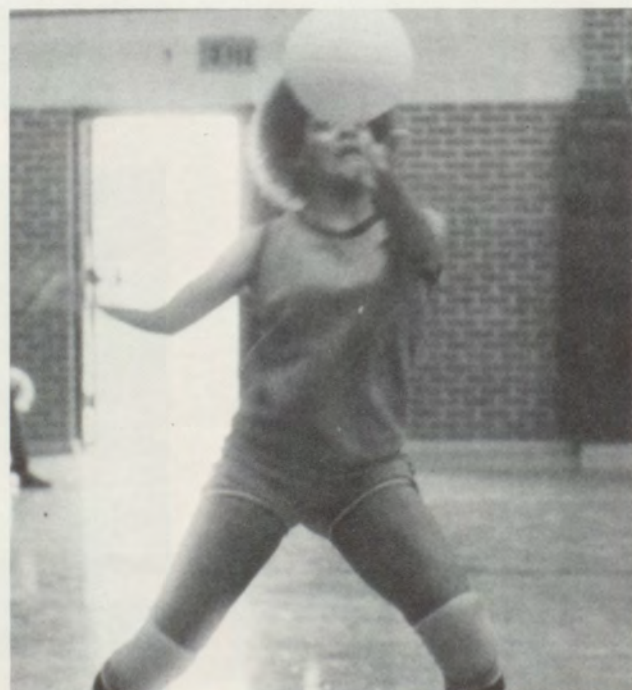

Social Science makes us better Americans

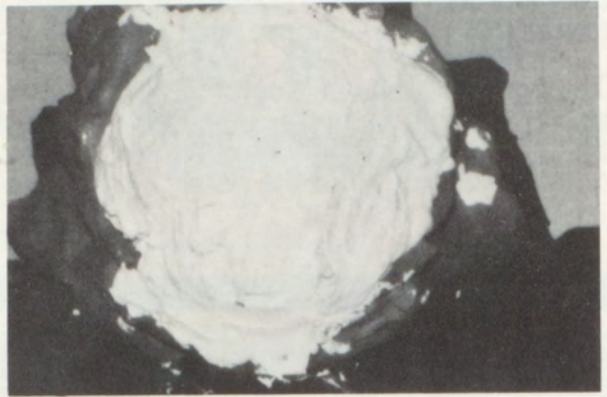

English classes perfect students' skills

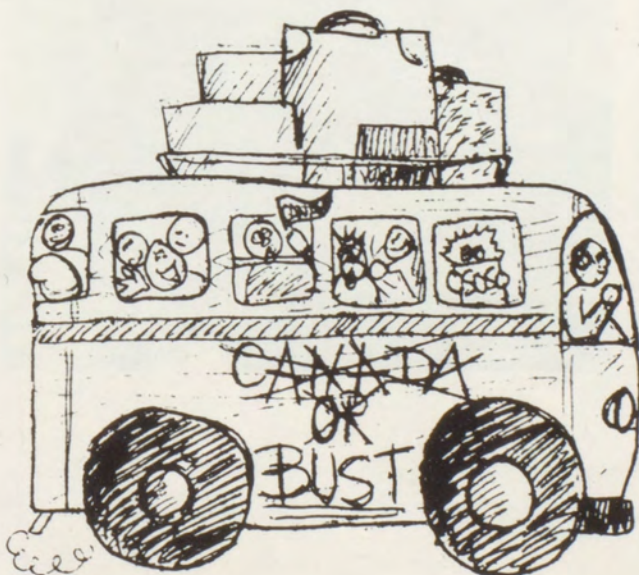

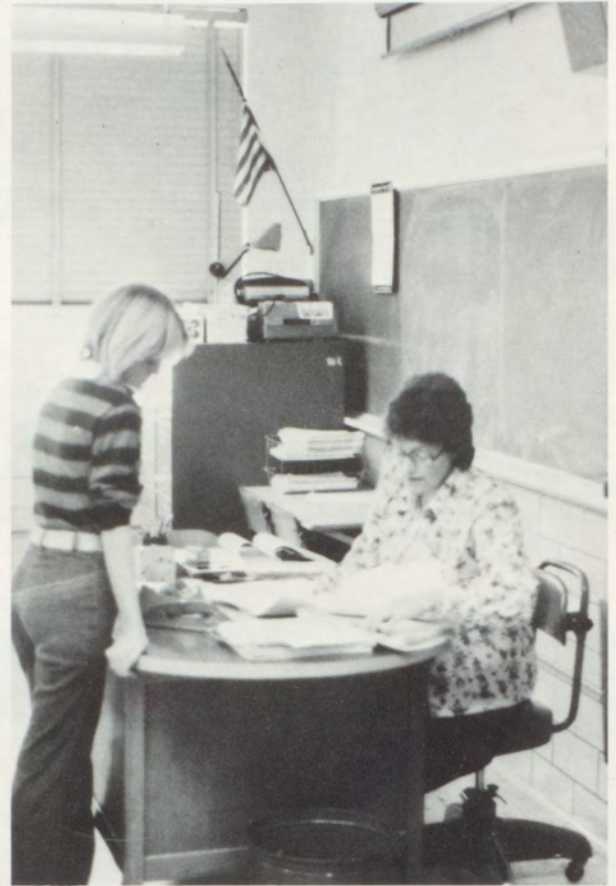
Students learn to express themselves in a different language

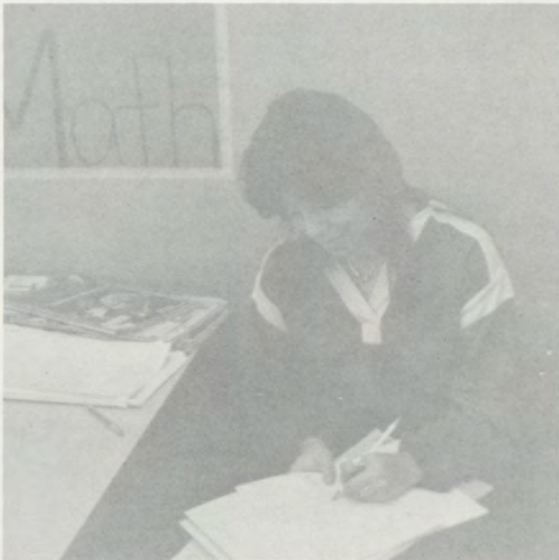


Business students total up careers

Valuable assets acquired from Industrial Arts



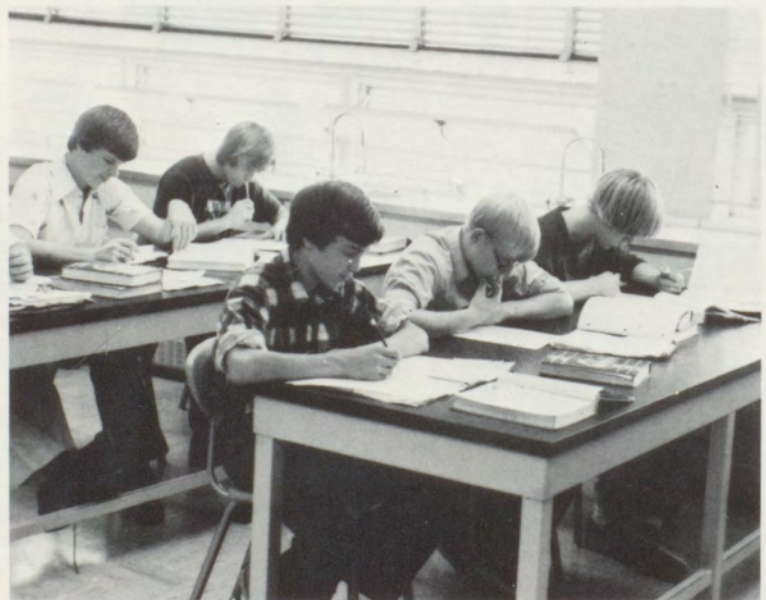
