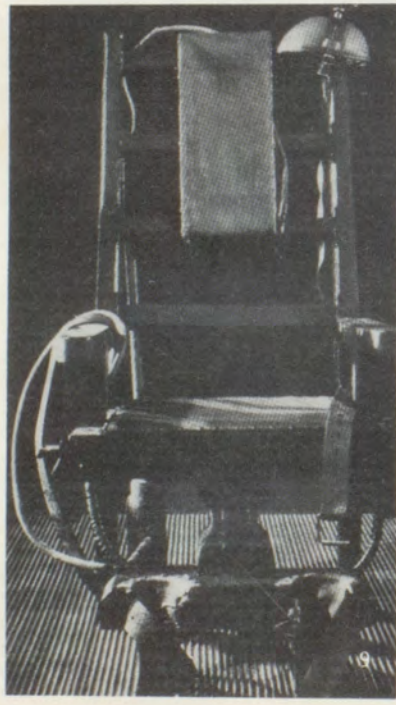

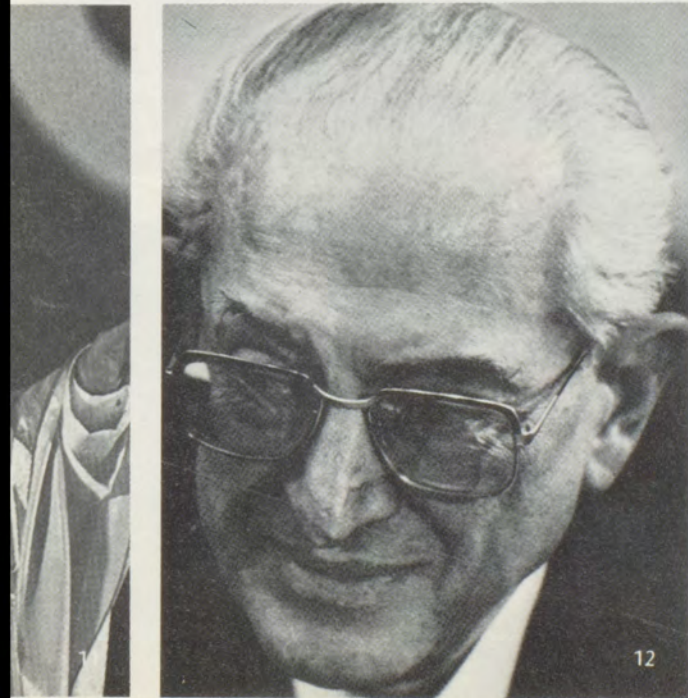
A nuclear arms freeze (6), capital punishment (9), and mismanagement of the EPA by former chief Anne Burford (10) were controversial topics home and abroad.

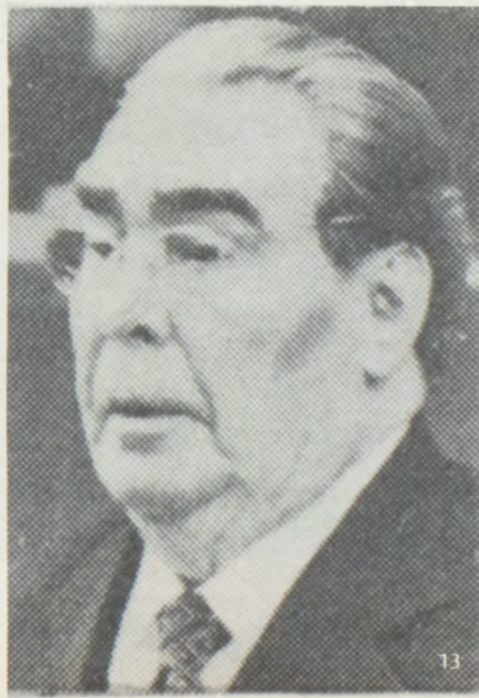

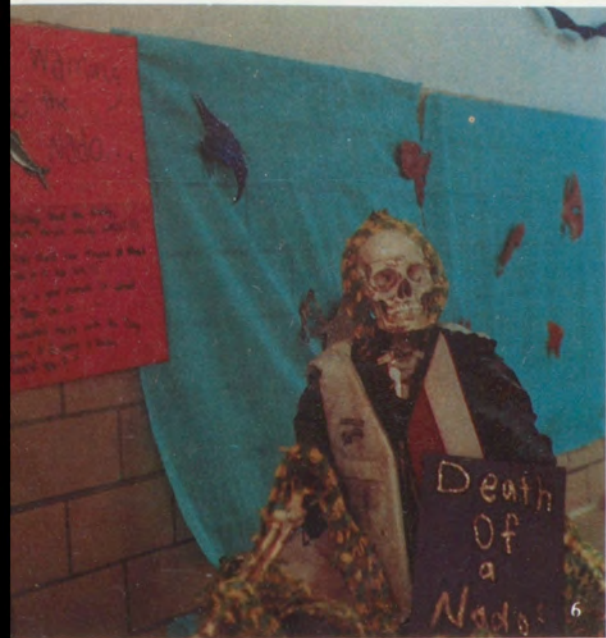

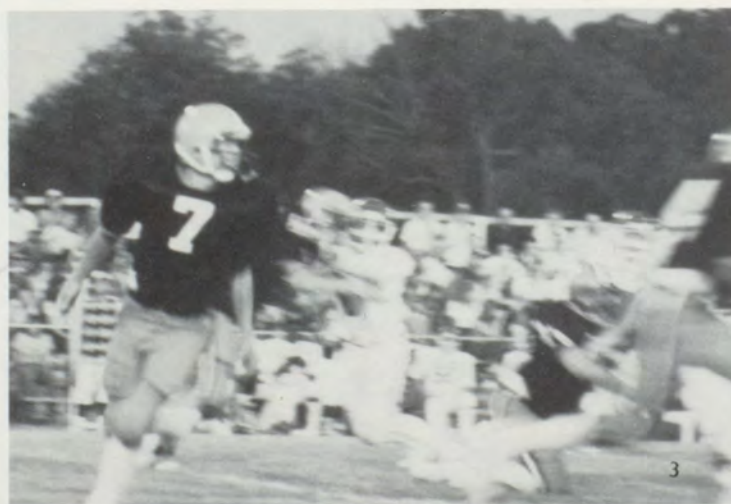

Special recognition . . .

Charles Belt.

Charles Belt, veteran thirty-four-year printing instructor at Independence High School, retired spring of 1983 from his first and only teaching assignment.

Mr. Belt came to Independence on a Monday in August 1949, after completing his college work on the Friday before. He has seen the printing shop change from letterpress to offset printing.

The despairing question, "What'll I do for notepads now?!" was heard in the faculty lounge when he first announced plans for retiring. In addition to supplying the entire school district with personalized notepads Mr. Belt started the tradition of the spring free faculty steak dinner. How did it get started? Mr. Belt commented, "When the men had a separate lounge, back when the high school and college were still in one building, they provided soft drinks and coffee and a little profit built up so we had to think of something to do with that profit."

Reminiscing about past teaching experiences, Mr. Belt recalled, when he was at the end of his seventh grade year, he had to make a choice between enrolling in music or printing and since he knew and liked the printing instructor, he enrolled in printing. Over his years of teaching he has had lots of pleasant experiences but his worst teaching experience came only three years ago when a skunk got into the printing room the week school started. The skunk was finally trapped, but the smell lingered for weeks afterward to remind both instructor and students of the episode.

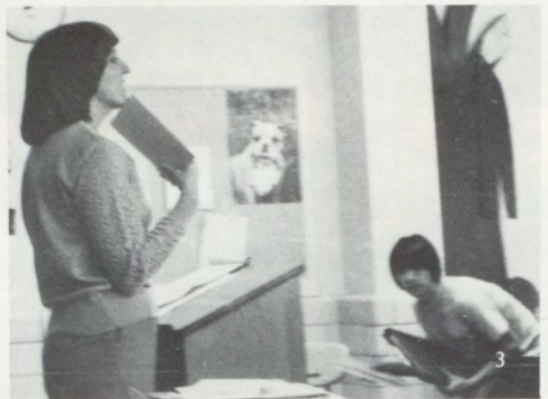

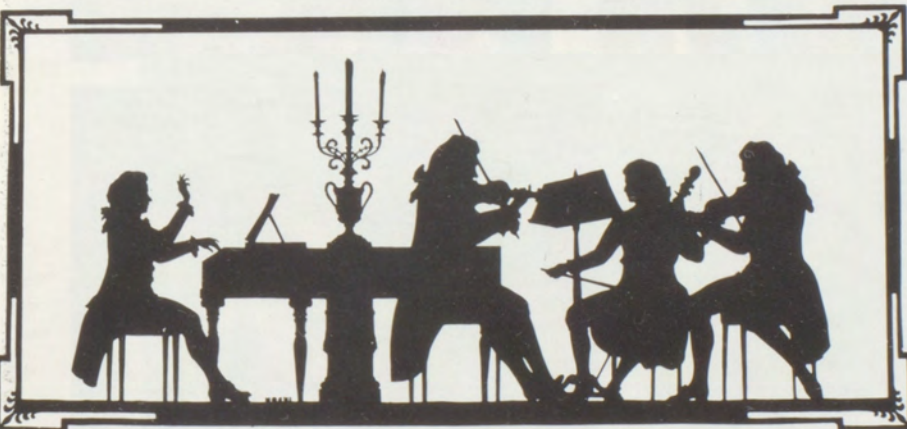

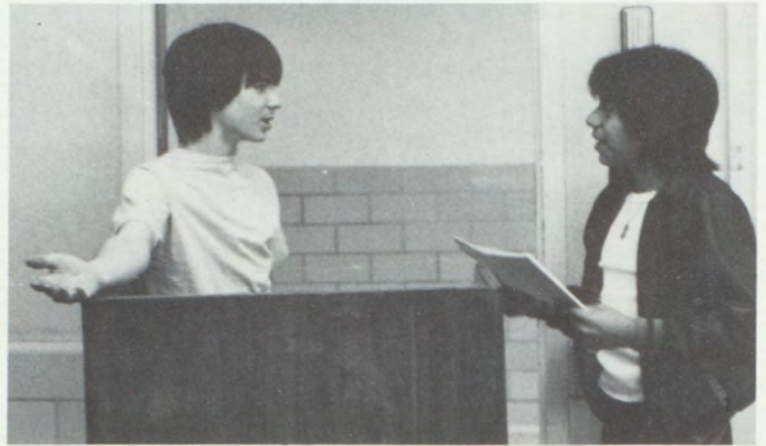

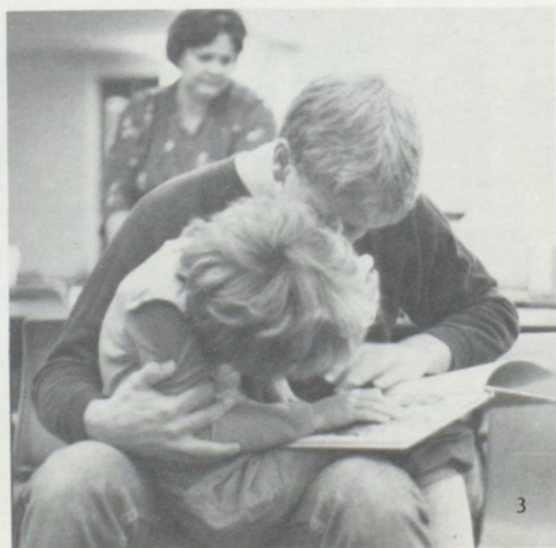

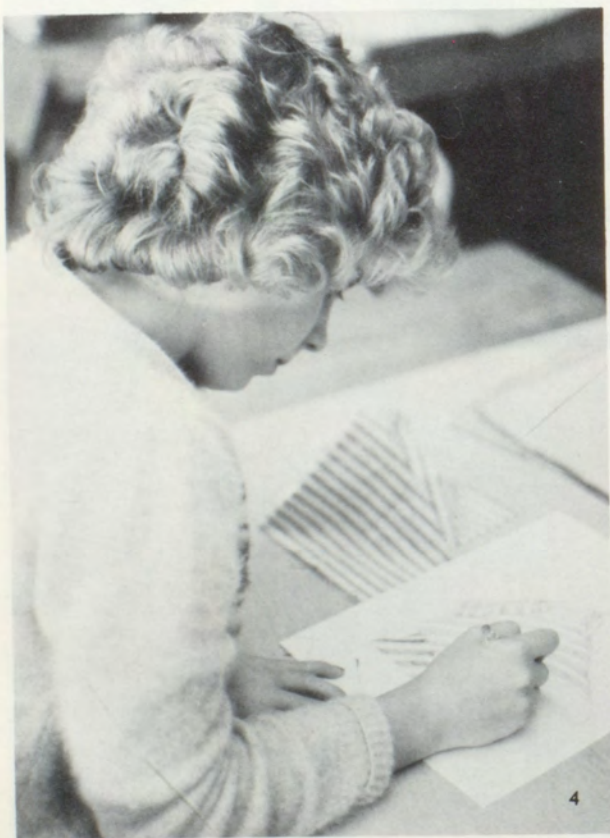

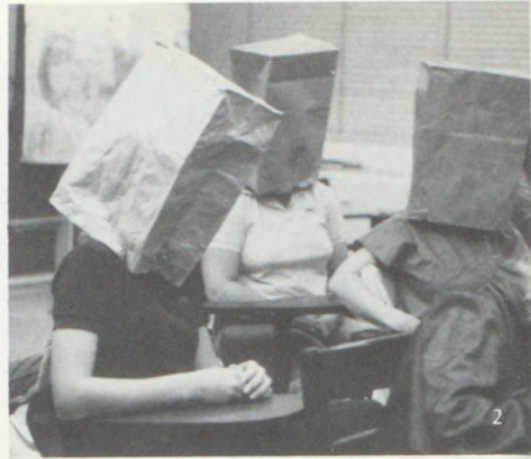

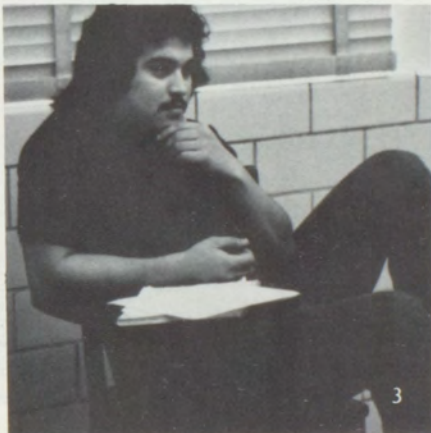

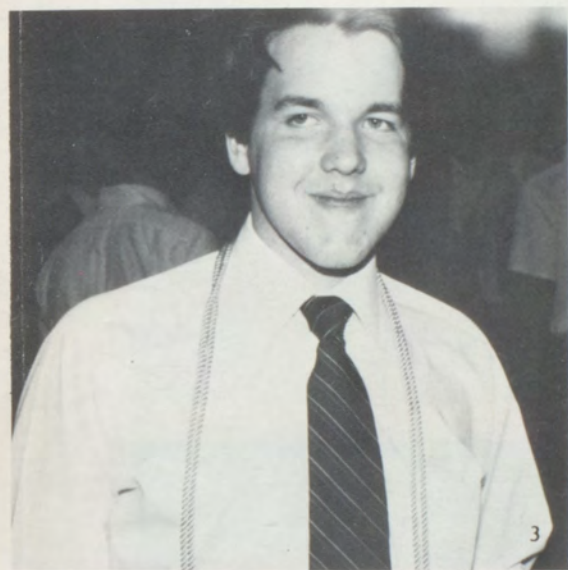
