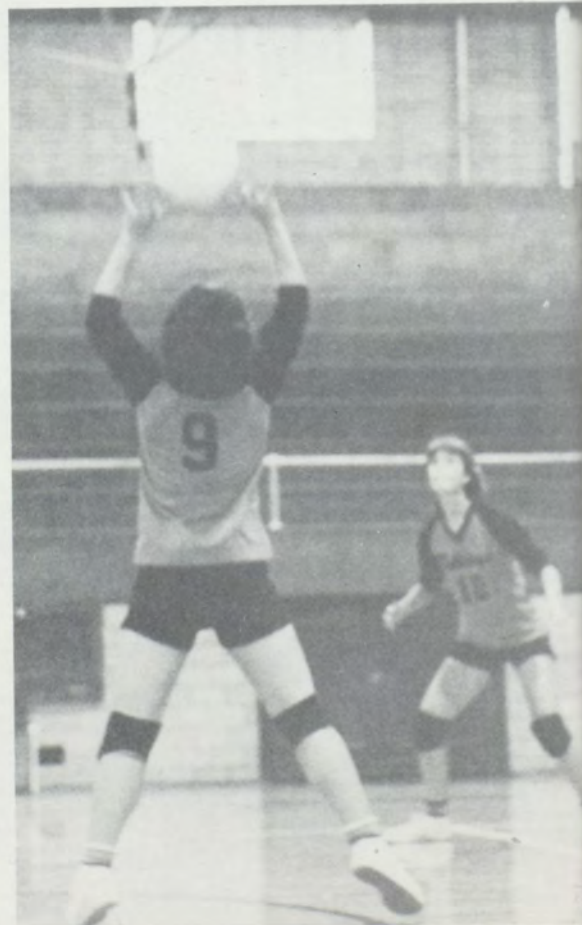
# Lady Spikers Become SEK Champs

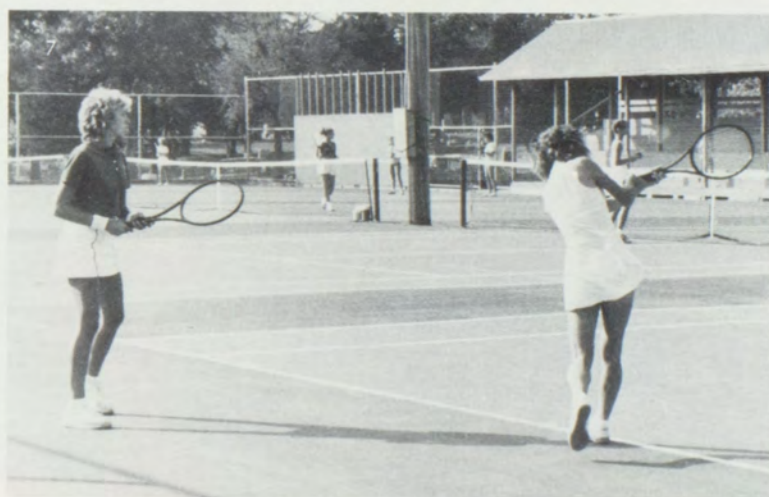

# One Tremendous Season



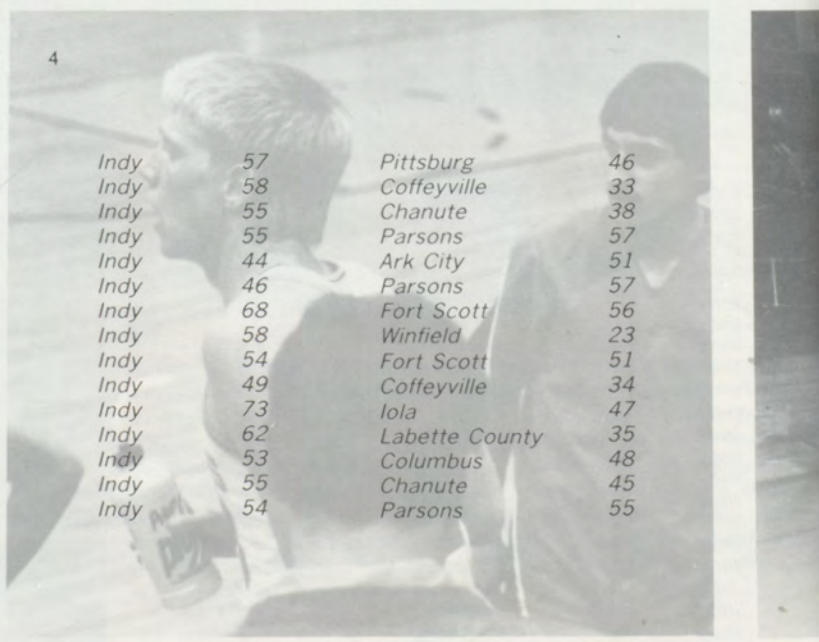

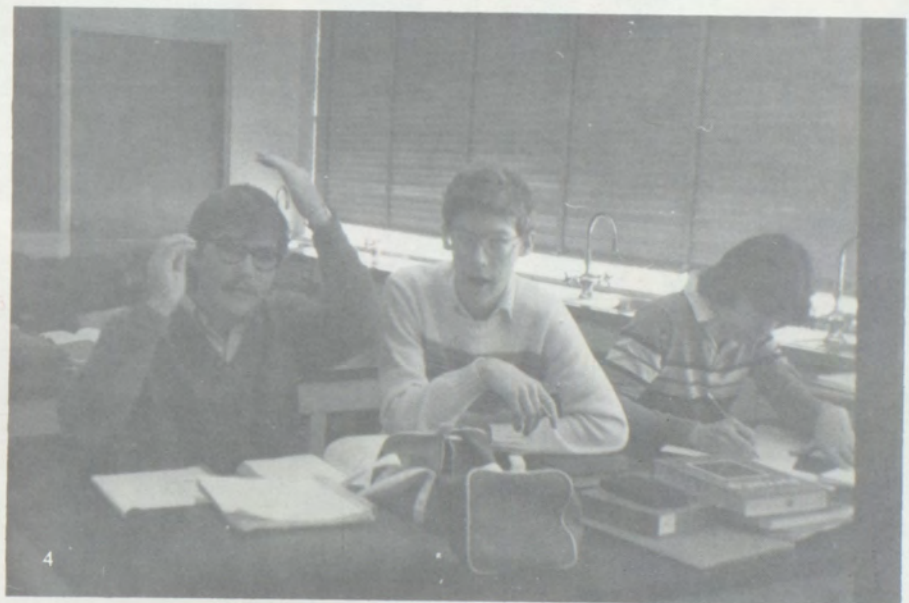

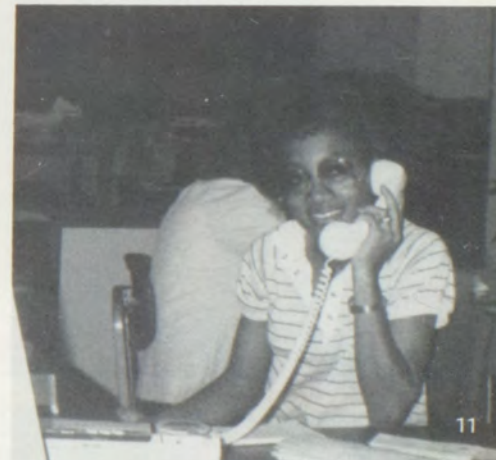

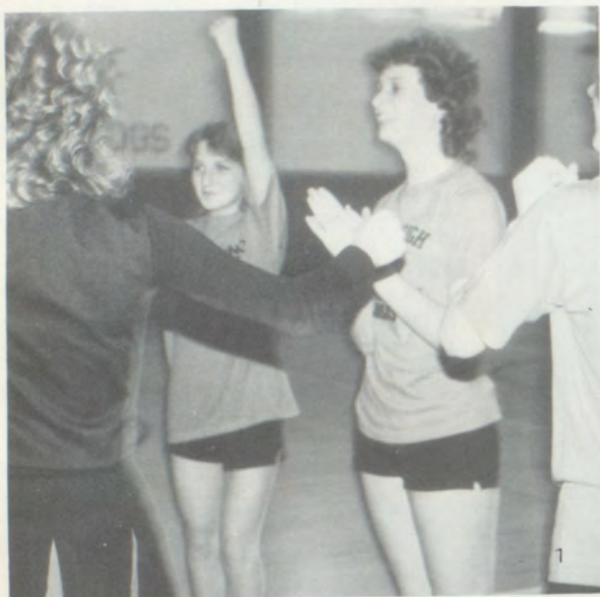

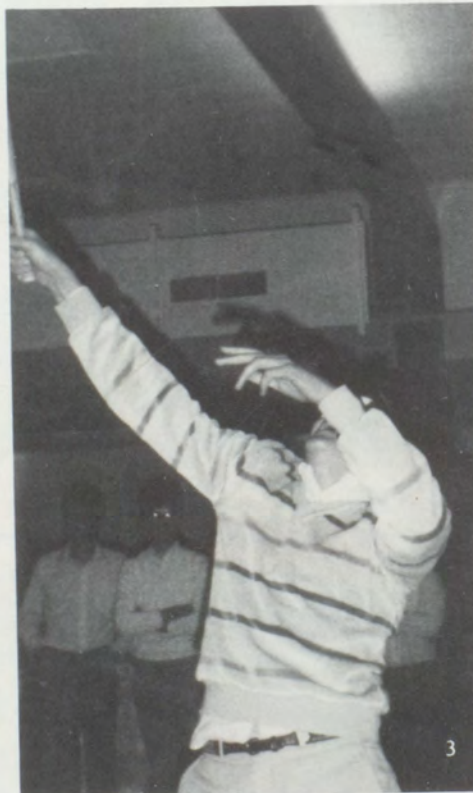

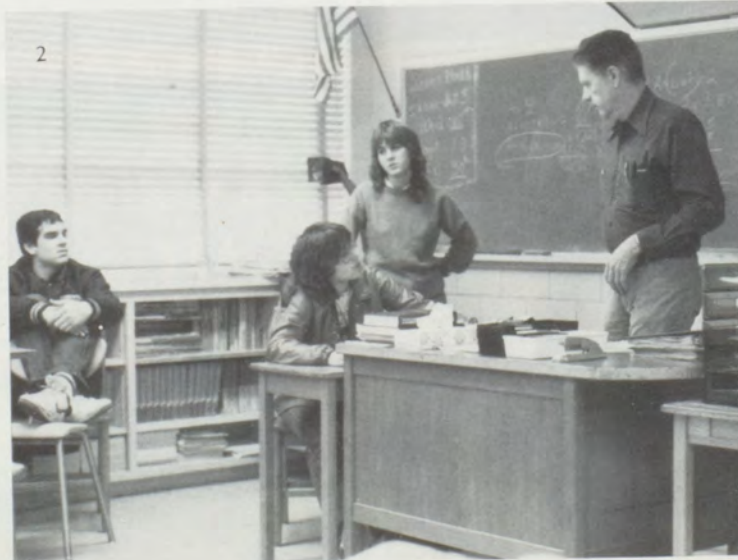

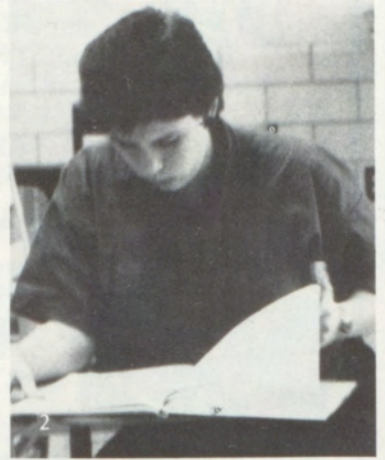

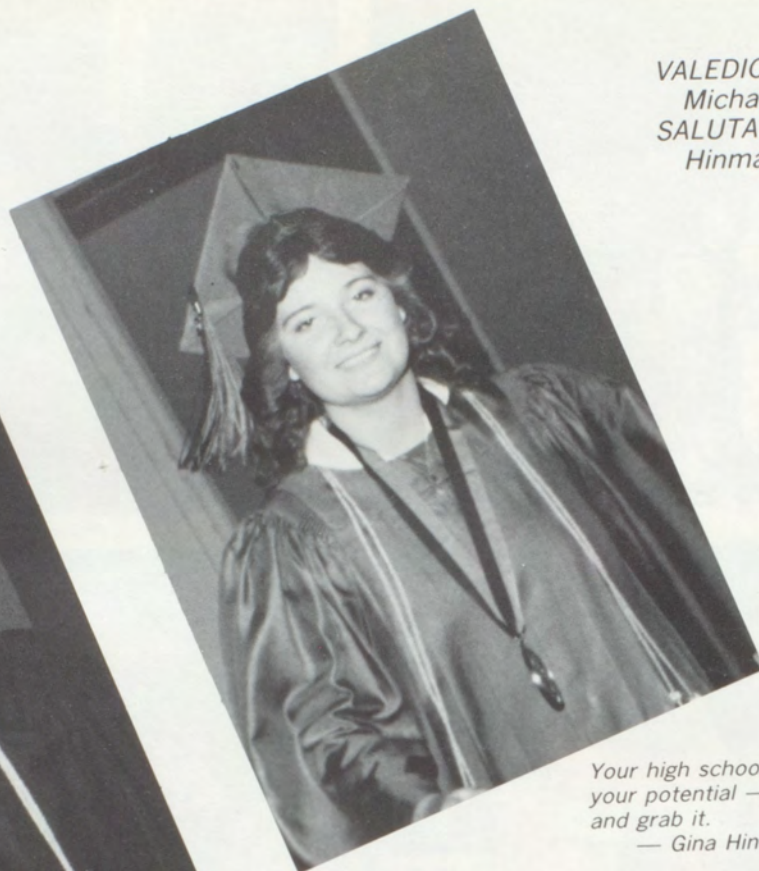

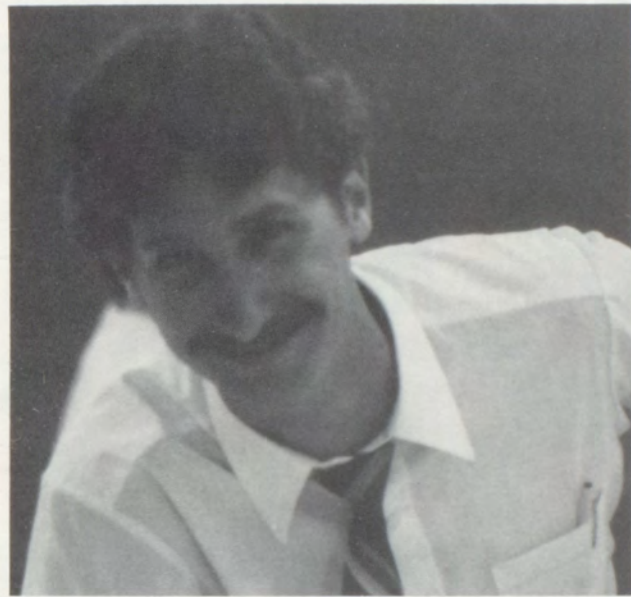
