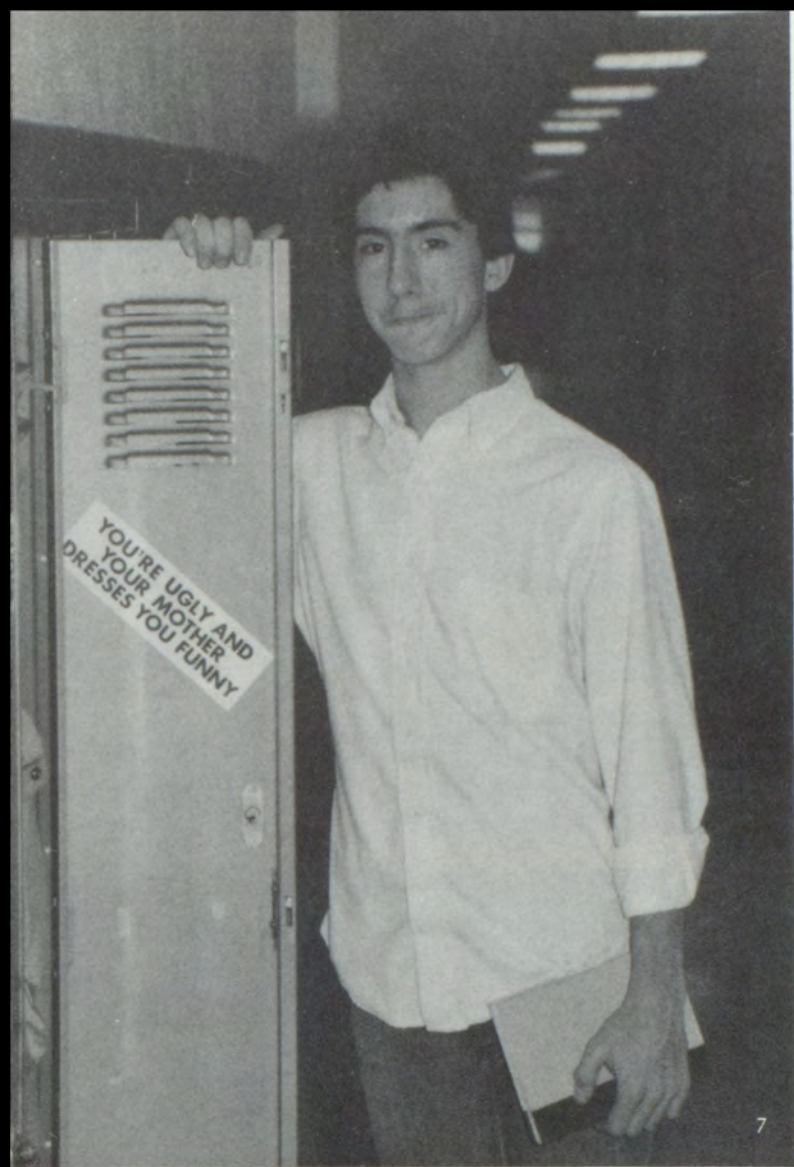

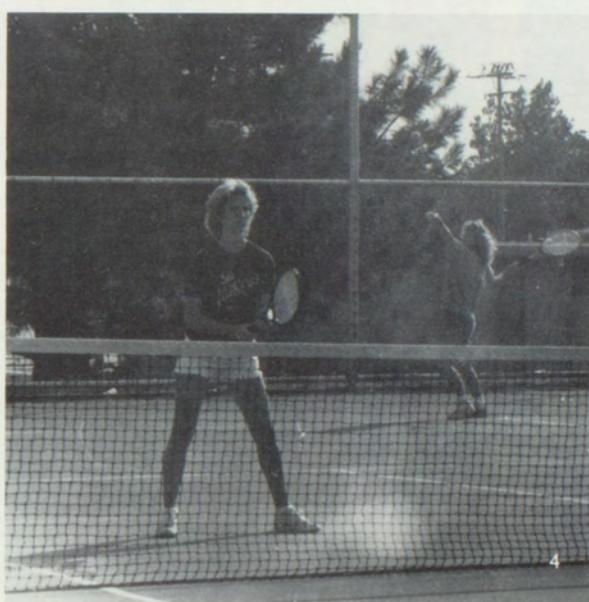

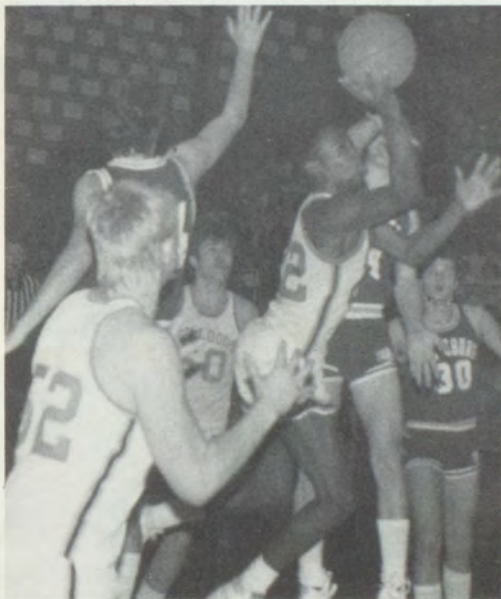

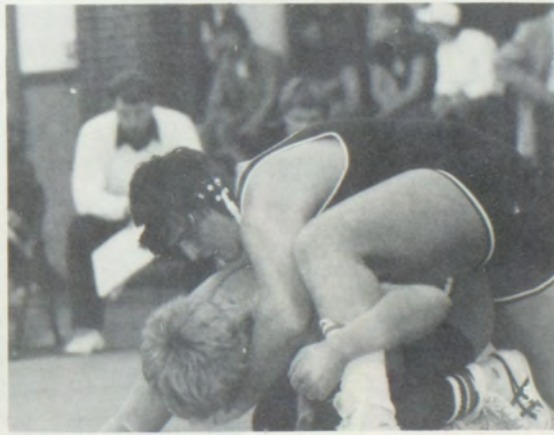

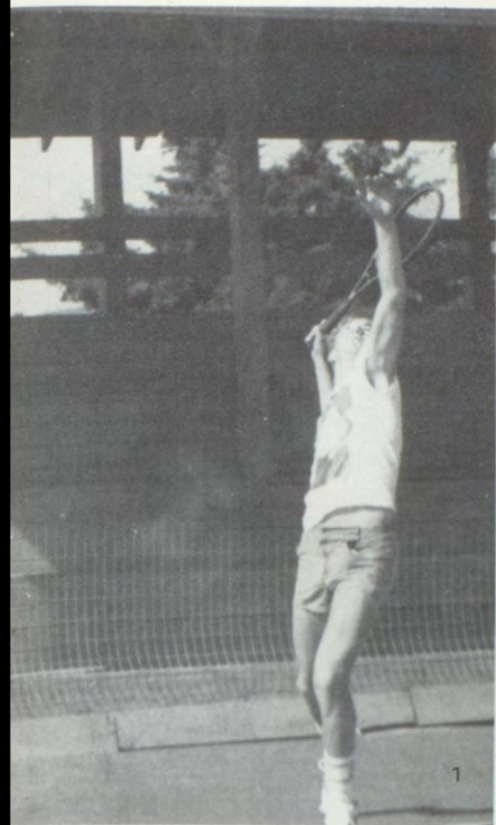

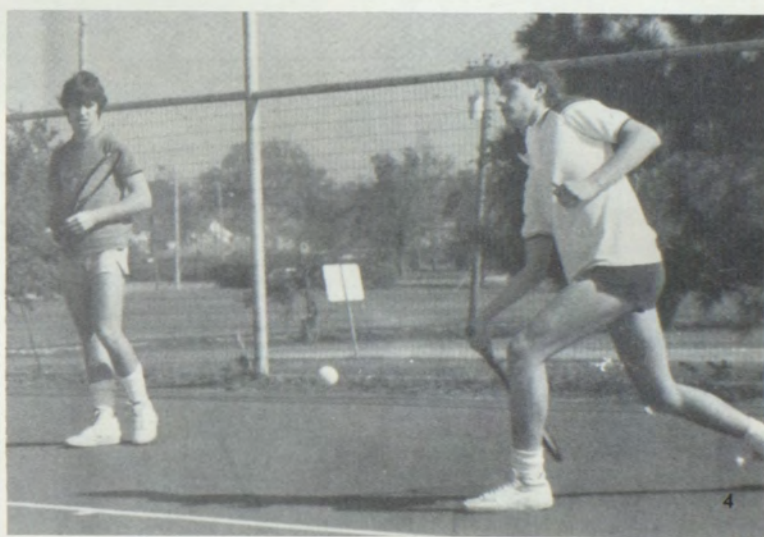

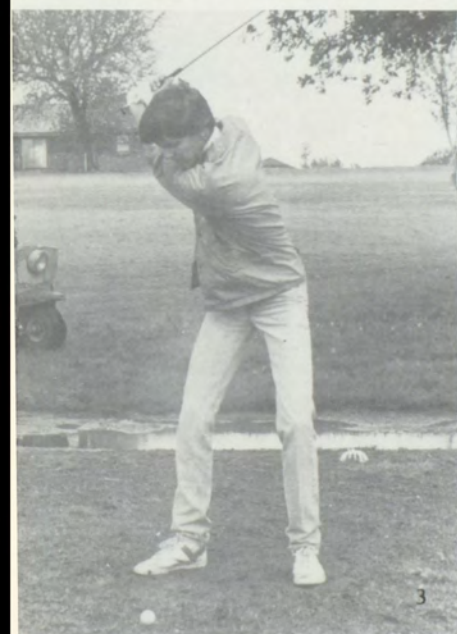

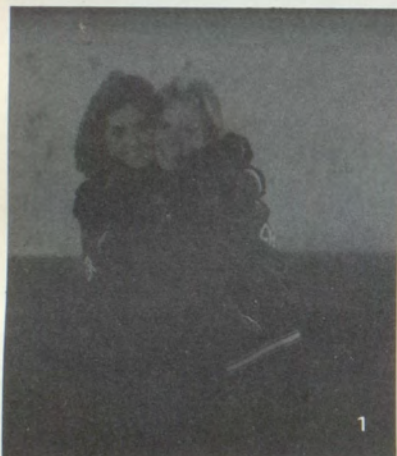

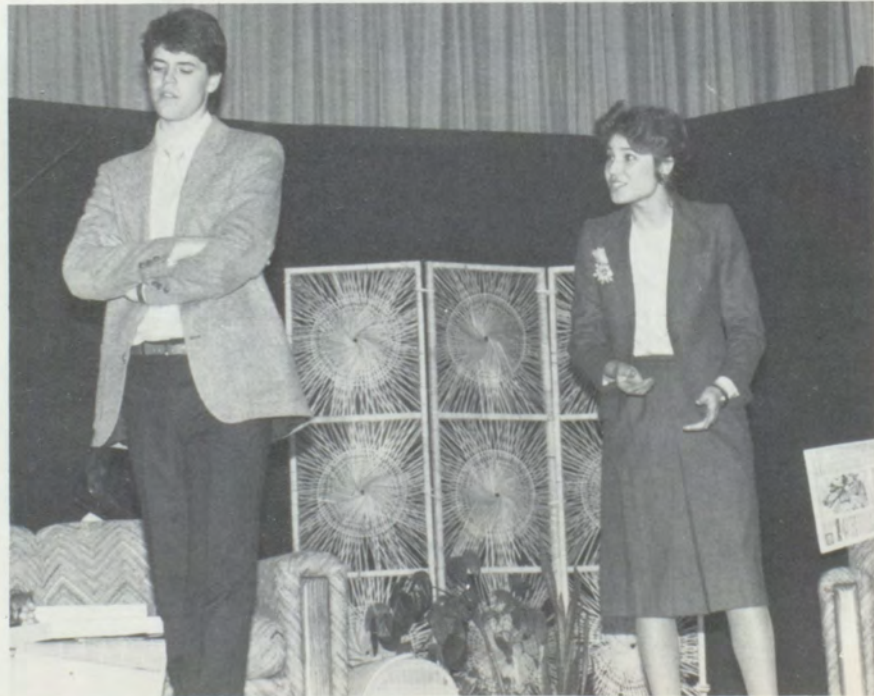

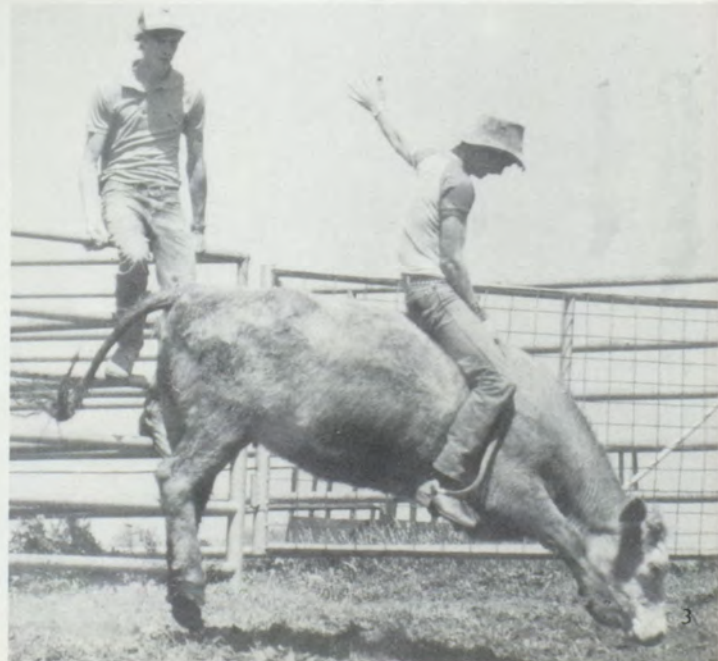

Youth & Business improves students business knowledge

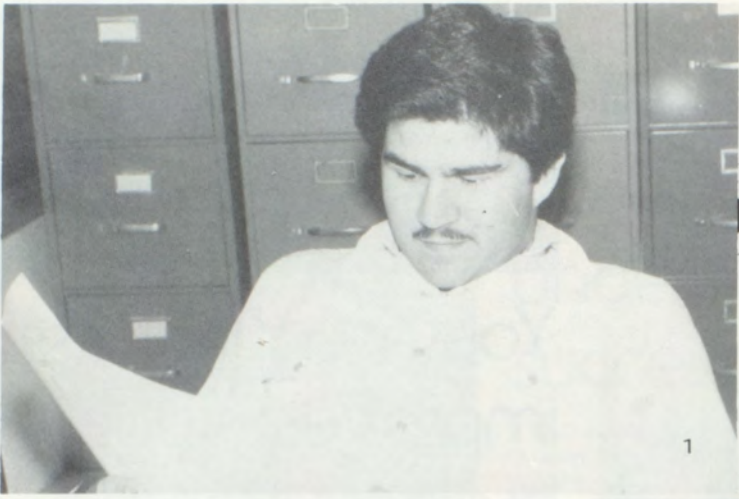

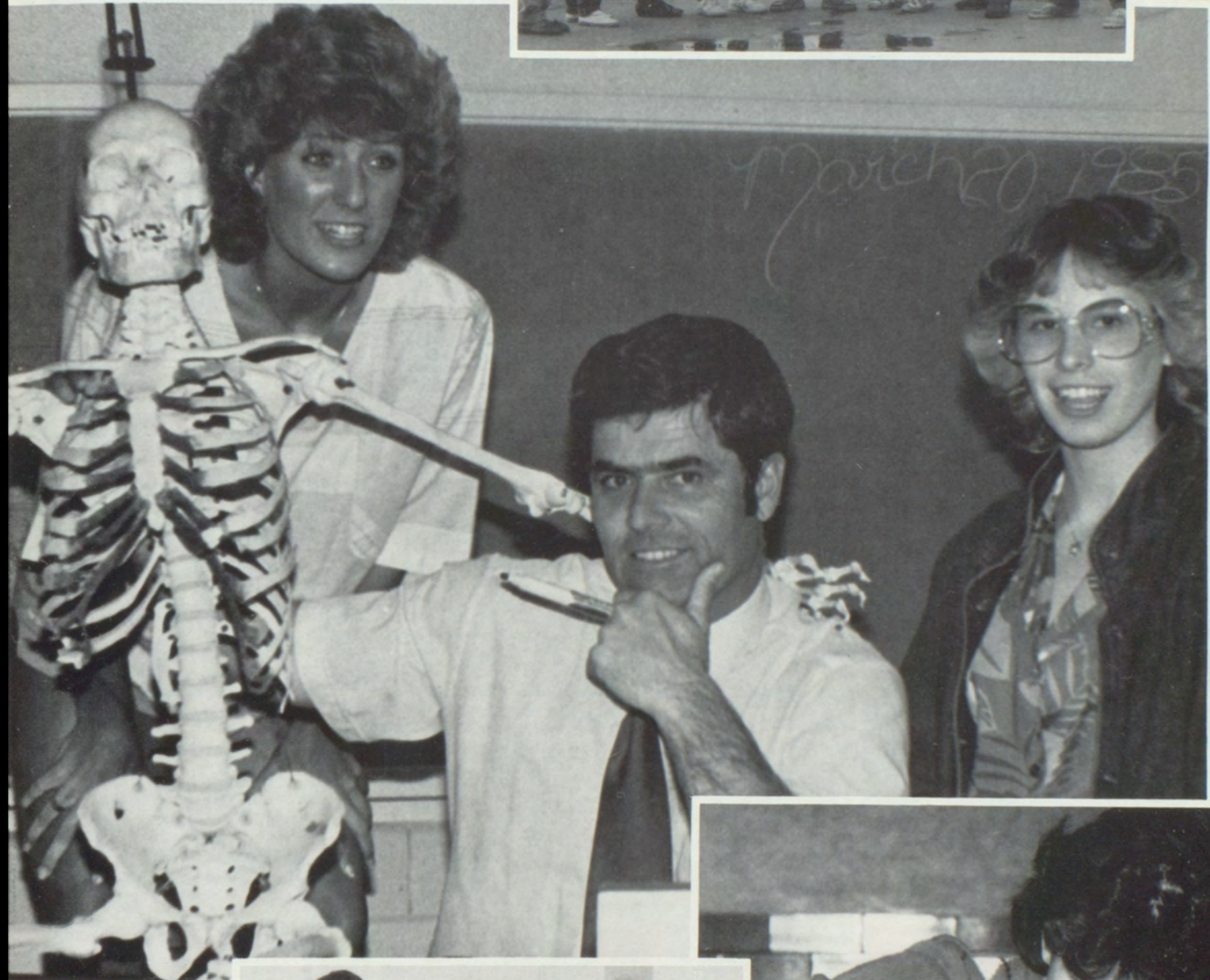
