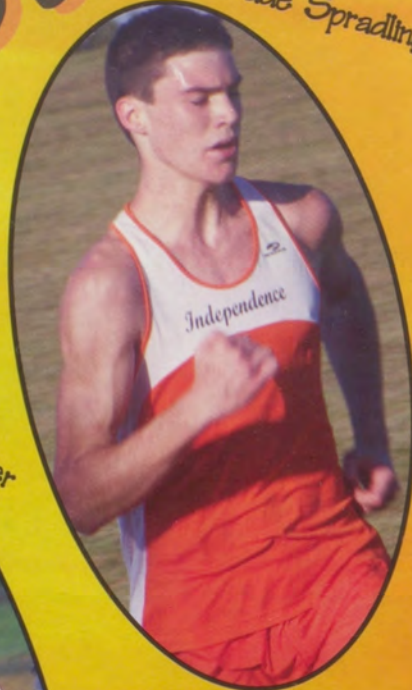
The Bulldogs opened their 2010 season with a 61-51 victory over the Iola Mustangs. IHS had not scored 60 points in a game since 1958! The Dogs then came back strong again the next week when they played the Osawatomie Trojans. With the help of **Matt Bromely** setting the new school record with 342 rushing yards, the Bulldogs came out on top with a 56-22 win. The Dogs hosted the Fort Scott Tigers for their third game of the season, and remain undefeated with a 28-14 victory. The next week, the boys traveled to Labette County. Although the score remained 0-0 after the first quarter, the Bulldogs came out with another victory, winning 41-7 over the Grizzlies. Next, the Bulldogs faced their rival, the Coffeyville Golden Tornadoes, at home and came out on top with 34-8 win. The Dogs still remain unbeaten with a 41-20 victory when they traveled to Columbus the next week. 6-0 for the first time, the Bulldogs traveled to Chanute to face the Blue Comets the following week. The Dogs put up a tough fight, but lost 25-28. The Bulldogs came back strong when they hosted Girard the next Friday night and came out on top with a 47-8 victory. For the last game of the Dogs normal season, they hosted the Parsons Vikings. Once again the Dogs won 53-13. That following Tuesday, the Dogs traveled to Coffeyville to face the Golden Tornadoes in the first Bi-District game of the season. With 322 rushing yards from **Matt Bromley**, and the interception from **Peyton Botts** in the final minute to hold the Dogs at 34-29, Independence came away with their second victory over the Golden Tornadoes for the season and were on their way to Regionals. The Bulldogs were eager to host the Paola Panthers the upcoming Friday evening for the 4A Regional game. Although the dogs held their ground resulting in a scoreless first quarter, Paola came through and won 0-28. "This season was a year to remember," says Coach Boldra

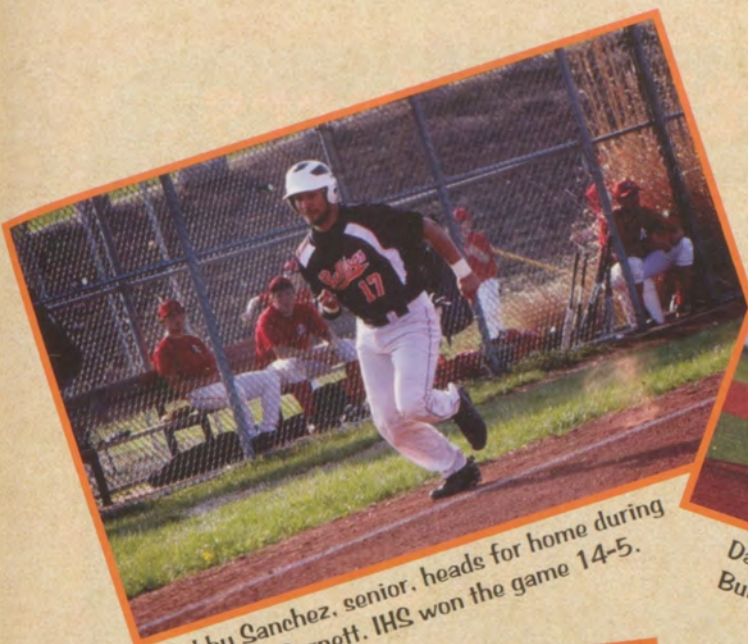
Sadly, the season ended in that Regional championship game against Baxter Springs.

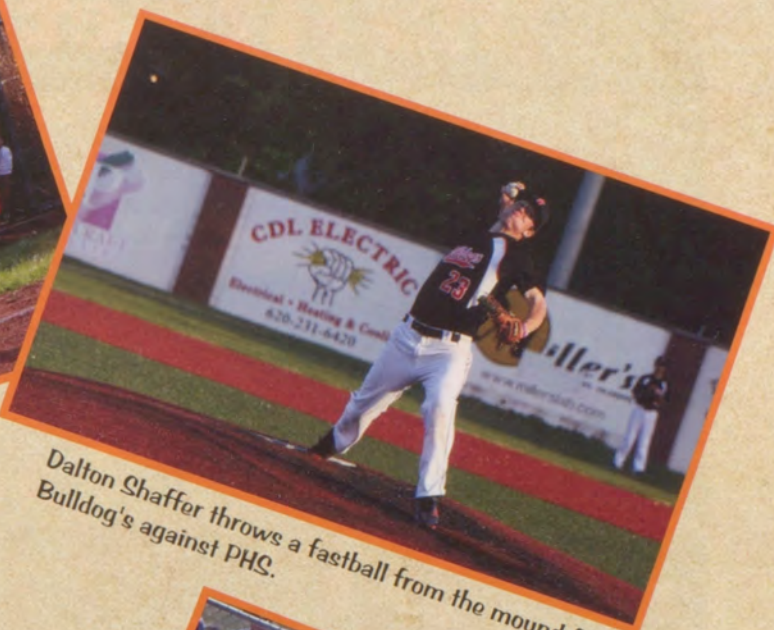

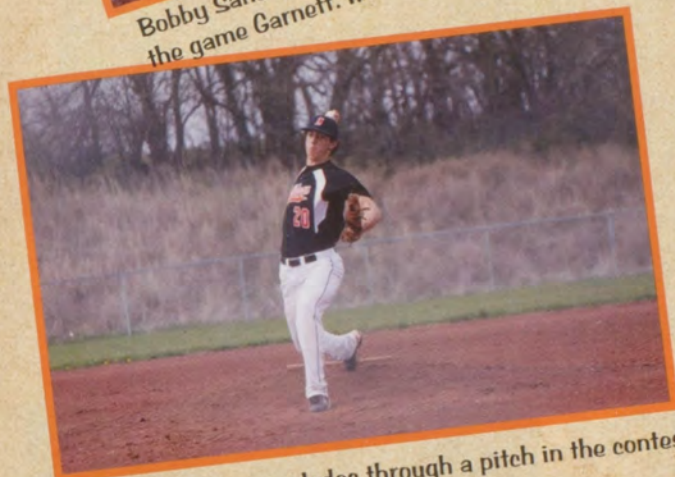

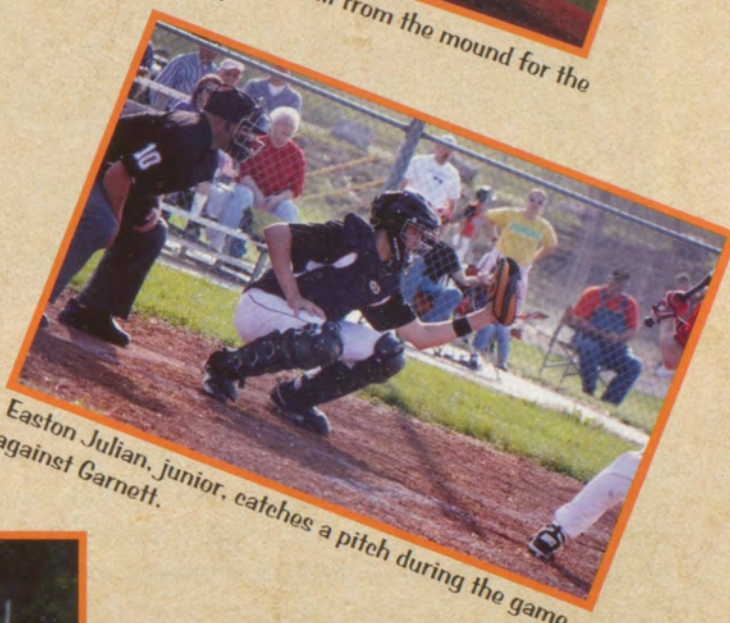
Bobby Sanchez, senior, heads for home during the game Garnett. IHS won the game 14-5.

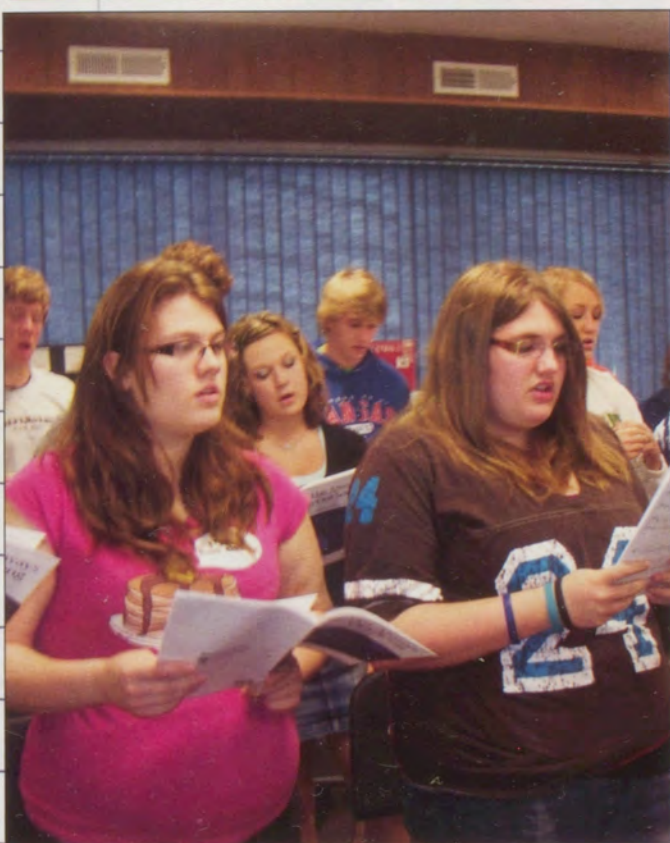

When Mrs. Staton (department chair) started teaching, the department was called home economics, but today it's referred to as family and consumer science.

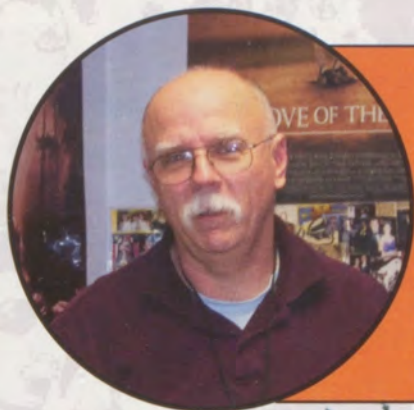

Mrs. Staton will be remembered for her quiet demeanor. "Sherry was a class act," said Kelly Cox. "She was always willing to help and always had something nice to say."

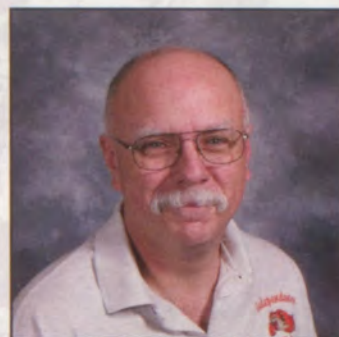


Four Faculty Members Resign from IHS

This year, Paula participated in girls tennis and track.

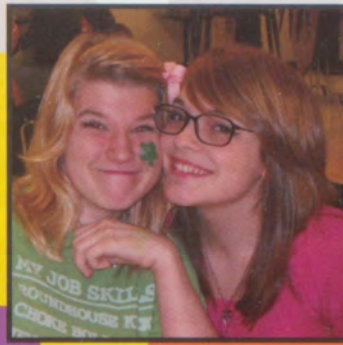

Kayo's Boys Honor Legendary IHS Coach



Walter "Kayo" Emmot coached varsity football at IHS for 13 years. He racked up six straight SEK league championships and finished with an overall record of 90-13-3 from 1954-1966.

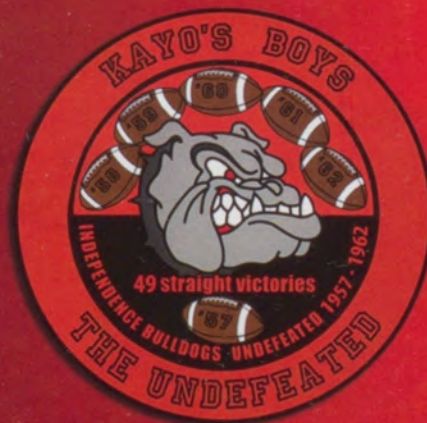
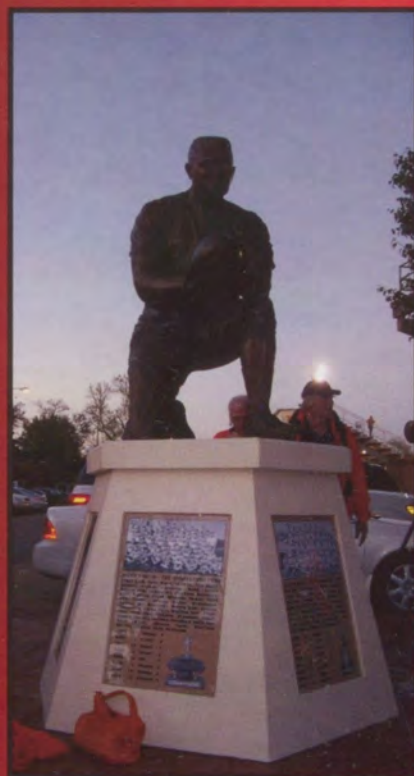
Left: IHS varsity players pay tribute to Coach Emmot prior to the unveiling of the statue.

Kayo's Boys' winning streak extended over 49 games beginning the 1957 season through the second week of 1963 season. This incredible feat gave Independence High School the longest winning football streak in the state of Kansas at the time.

Kayo Emmot's bronze statue was officially dedicated October 28 before the start of the IHS-Parsons game, where the Bulldogs beat the Vikings 53-13. Nearly 200 of Kayo's former players returned to Independence for a reunion, which coincided with Neewollah festivities.

The reunion was held prior to the game, and a sea of fans and former players wearing their letterjackets and orange and black filled the stadium. Members of the Emmot family, including son and former IHS teacher, Ray Emmot, were on hand for the game and dedication.

Kayo was inducted into the KSHSAA Hall of Fame in 1980 and later the field at Shulthis Stadium was named in his honor.

Back in the fall of 1939, the Independence High School gymnasium was finally opened for the first time. It was the finest physical education building and sports competition venue in all of southeast Kansas.

On February 11, 1971 the building got a proper name: Losey Gymnasium, dedicated to L.E. Losey, physical education instructor from 1913-1952. From there on out it has always been known as "Losey."

Finally after 72 years of being the only varsity home court everybody has come to know and love, we bid farewell to Losey Gymnasium as being our primary venue for IHS Bulldog varsity sports.

Several former coaches and players were on hand for the final varsity game played at Losey, including Jerry Hart and Ron Schwatken, coaches of the boys' and girls state championship teams, respectively. Gina (Smith) McLenon, assistant girls basketball coach and member of the state champ team has fond memories of the venue.

"Losey is just full of IHS history. Although it's sad to see it end, I'm excited for the future of IHS sports and having our own facility at the high school," said McLenon.

Losey Gymnasium has been through everything with us. It has seen three basketball players who have become professional basketball players, one Independence Community College national title, two state basketball titles, and four state wrestling titles.

Losey will undergo major renovations, including new and enlarged public restrooms, new locker rooms, new seating and overhead lighting, an expanded court layout to accommodate two regulation-size courts running east and west, and a brand new gym floor. Losey will also remain the competition site for all middle school, junior varsity, and freshman sports.



EMT, CNA, & CMA



Through an agreement with ICC, IHS students can earn certification as a CNA (Certified Nurse Aide), CMA (Certified Medication Aide) and EMT (Emergency Medical Technician) on the IHS campus.

In CNA, students learn how to take care of elderly patients, which includes cleaning dentures, dressing patients, and ensuring their comfort. In the CMA course, students learn about medications often prescribed for the elderly and learn to make drug cards and give the elderly their medications.

In the EMT class, students learn how to take care of victims of car wrecks and people in need of medical attention. Additionally, they are taught to use the equipment each ambulance carries.

These courses provide valuable skills and certification, as students can go to work immediately in one of the local nursing homes or build his resume toward application into a nursing program.

"It's a cool, hands-on program," said Endesah Flannigan. "I look forward to applying my new skills."

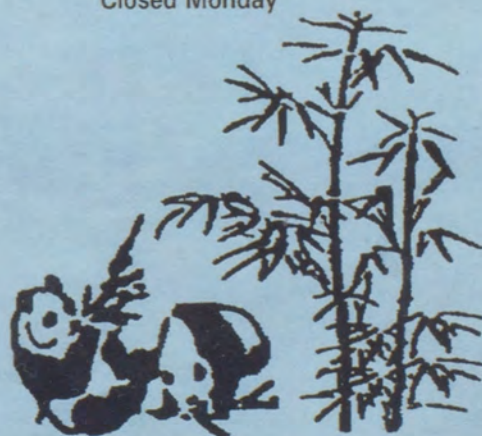

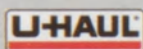

When it came down to the final match, Makenzie emerged victorious and took home the gold. She won a \$15 Sonic gift card.



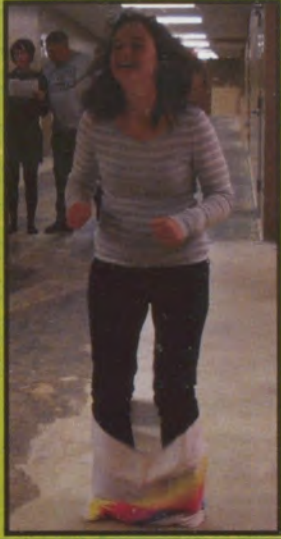

IHS Students Give Back to Independence Through Community Service

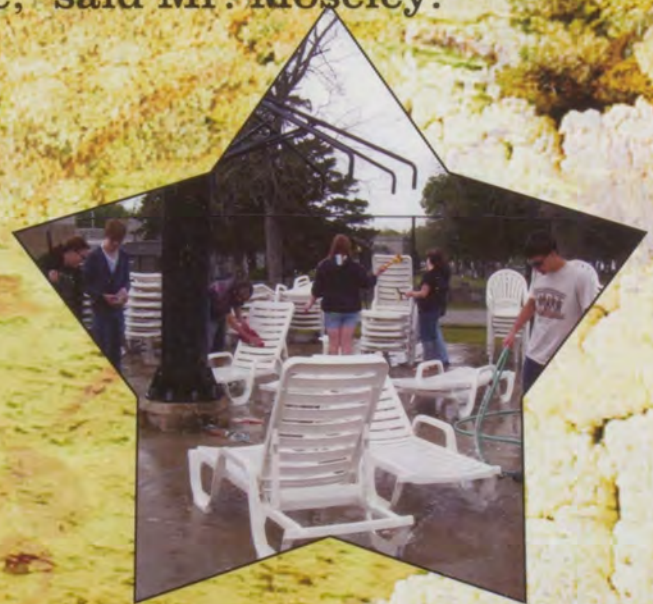
For the eighth year, IHS students took a day out from their regular school day to participate in Community Service Day. IHS students work together to make our community a better place by providing a variety of services.

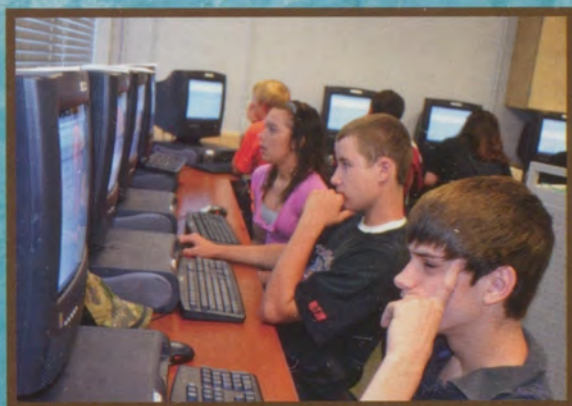

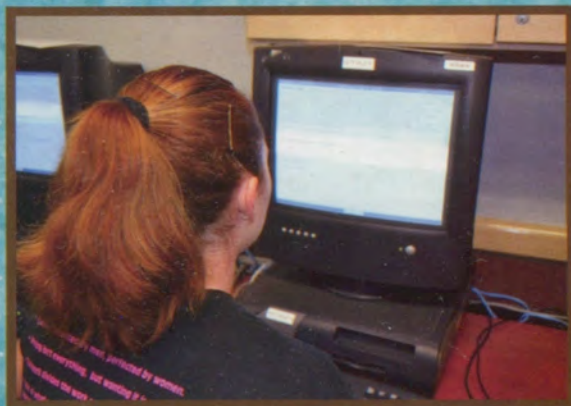

In addition to using the Ash Center for swimming, the practice fields for softball and soccer, and the tennis courts at Riverside Park, Coach Speicher also takes her students on walks around town. "It's great to get out for some fresh air," she said.

Following the passage of a \$43.1 million bond issue in February 2008, the changes started. We returned to find the new classrooms in the 200 and 400 halls ready and open for business. Just before Christmas, the 300 hall re-opened, and 100 hall was closed.

We got used to seeing men wearing hard hats, carrying blueprints and tools walking our halls. The sounds of heavy equipment running, no longer caught our attention. Upheaval was our reality. The library was housed in a mobile unit. Everyone sacrificed, for good reason.

45,000 square feet were added to the building as part of our \$17.5 million portion of the district project. Additionally, we began to see the internal changes within our classroom:

New teacher desks, student desks, white boards and Promethean boards were installed into every classroom. "It's pretty cool to see us moving into the 21st Century," said Mrs. Kelly Cox,

English teacher. "I'm very pleased the citizens of Independence supported the bond. I can't wait to see the school finished!"
